

Schabel lifts Ross to invitational title

Dearsman six shots better than OH field

Youth served the Fremont Ross golf team well on its way to a second straight Golden Bear Invitational title Tuesday at Sycamore Hills Golf Course.

Freshman Spencer Schabel fired a team-leading 74, and sophomore Austin Young added a 78 as the Little Giants won the 12-team event hosted by Gibsonburg.

Schabel and Young were the No. 5 and 6 players in the Ross lineup Tuesday.

"We knew the potential was there," Ross coach Desie Morehart said of Schabel and Young. "But it didn't always show in tryouts."

Ross won with an total of 315, eight strokes better than its winning score of last season. Wes Eckhardt recorded an 81, and Kevin Vassar and Dave Fausnaugh had 82s.

"I knew our team was stronger this year, so I thought we'd do well," Morehart said. "To me, every win is boost for the kids."

Tiffin Calvert, led by match medalist Matt Reino's 71, finished second at 319. St. Joseph Central Catholic was third at 323 and Woodmore carded a 327

for fourth place. Among other area teams, Old Fort was sixth at 343, Lakota eighth at 349 and Gibsonburg ninth at 359.

St. Joe also got a strong performance from its No. 6 player. Junior Eric Velez led the Crimson Streaks with a 75.

"He's actually been playing pretty close to that in practice the past couple of weeks," St. Joe head coach Greg Kohler said. "He obviously did some work this summer."
