Relay Events Avert Upset

Ross high school's swimming team had a narrow escape at Sandusky yesterday, barely getting past the underdog Blue Streaks 43-42. Ross, which has high hopes of getting a state championship, was expected to take Sandusky without a struggle.

The Giants of Coach George Gruse, who were making their debut against high school competition, trailed going into the last two events, the 180-yard medley relay and the 160-yard free style relay.

Then a trio composed of Phil Slaymaker, Ralph Engle and Don Naftulin sped to a close victory over Sandusky's Dave Parry, Dan Thomas and George Fisher in the medley event in the excellent time of one minute, 49 and one-tenth seconds. The pool record is 1:46.8.

Free Style Comes Easy

The free style relay, which gives seven points to the winners, was taken easily by the Rossens, who won behind Bud Nord, Bill Kirsch, Ronnie Whisler and Jim Sherer.

Nord, Sherer and Miller were Ross high's big guns, getting all the Ross firsts in the other events. Nord won the 200-yard free style, Miller the 100-yard back stroke, and Sherer the 40-yard free style.

Golfer Bauer Leading Female Athlete Of '49

NEW YORK Jan. 13 — **AP** — Marlene Bauer, the 15-year-old Los Angeles girl who amazed the golfing world with a string of brilliant victories during the past summer, has been voted female athlete-of-the-year in the annual Associated Press poll.

Sportswriters and sportscasters gave the sensational young coast star 17 first place votes and a total of 73 points, compared to 13 first and 58 points for her closest rival, Louise Suggs of Atlanta, the nation's woman professional golf champion.

Babe Didrikson Zaharias, still another golfer, placed third with 49 points, and Mrs. Margaret Osborne Dupont, the national tennis champion, was fourth with 41. Points were figured on the basis of three for first place, two for second and one for third.

Miss Bauer rocketed into the spotlight when she won the first national junior golf championship at Philadelphia. From there on she was a terror, her steady and

Giants Suffer First Defeat

Ross high school was handed a surprise swimming setback last night by the Toledo Y.M.C.A. natators, 39 to 36.

It was the first setback for the Giants in dual competition. Last week Ross opened its season by defeating Sandusky after a pair of exhibitions with the Bowling Green freshmen.

The Y.M.C.A. team is composed of swimmers from all Toledo high schools except Scott, the only school in that city having a team this year. In the district event, however, the Y.M.C.A. swimmers will represent their schools.

Ross was able to nail down only two individual first last night, Chuck Miller taking the 100-yard back stroke and Larry Schwartz the diving.

Ross Grabs Lead

Ross trailed going into the fourth event, the back stroke, but took over the lead 19-17 as Miller and Phil Slaymaker captured the first two places. The Giants clung to a 23-22 edge after getting second and third in the 100-yard free style before the Y grabbed the first two places in the 150-yard individual medley to take over the lead again, 30-24.

Ross, needing to sweep both relays to avert defeat, lost a close race in the 150-yard medley relay, Slaymaker, Ralph Engle and Don Naftulin barely being nosed out. Ross took the 200-yard free-style relay, a seven-point event, as Bud Nord, Bud Kirsch, Ronnie Whisler and Jim Sherer splashed in ahead of the Y.M.C.A. foursome.

Ross finished second to Cincinnati Walnut Hills in the state meet, with Canton McKinley third, as Coach George Gruse's lads compiled another enviable record.

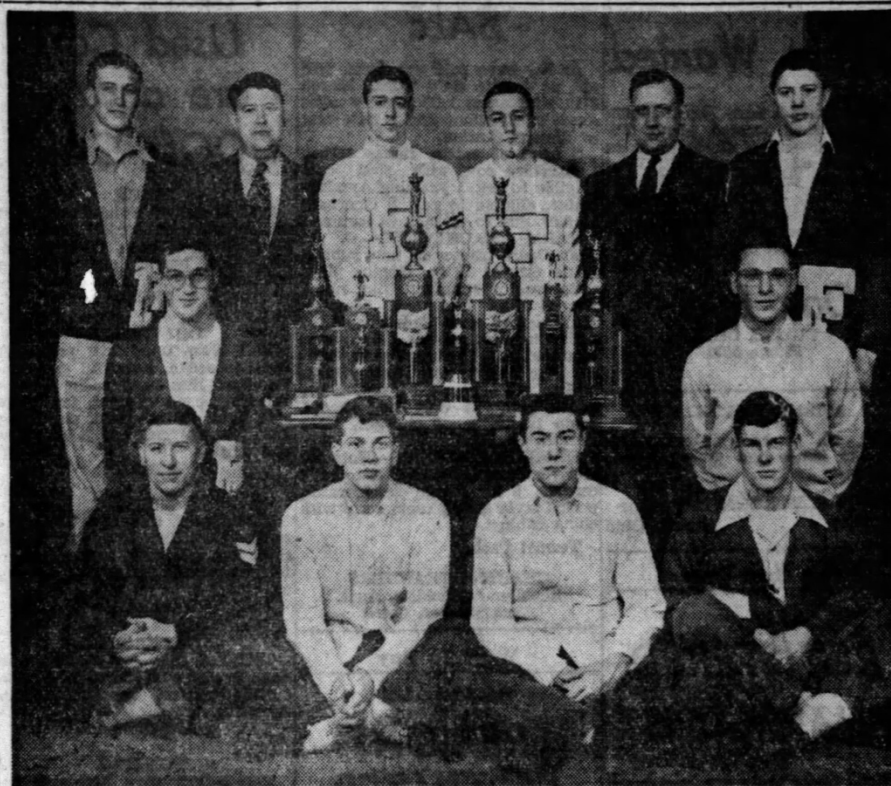
