# Kilpatrick's play, outside shooting propels BG to win

Bowling Green had the inside-outside scoring working Friday night pulling away from Fremont Ross in the fourth quarter to post a 65-50 victory. It was the Bobcats' season opener.

BG got 20 points from 6-foot-5 senior Conner Kilpatrick inside and also had four different players combine for nine 3-pointers. Kilpatrick was 8-of-11 from the field and 4-of-6 from the free-throw line. Tony Dible, four 3-pointers, and Patrick Graham, three 3-pointers, each added 16 points.

"When you look at Bowling Green it's going to be fundamental. It's going to have good height. It's going to be physical and they are going to shot the basketball," Fremont Ross head coach Mark Gedeon, a BGHS graduate, said. "If you leave those shooters open they are going to make you hurt ... They were hitting on some good cylinders tonight."

The Bobcats went to Kilpatrick to start the game and he responded with BG's first eight points. He added eight points in the fourth quarter, converting two three-point plays.

"We tried to deny the ball to him early and if not we tried to work out way behind him and try to push him out a little bit farther than he wanted to be," Gedeon said.

For Kilpatrick with the quick start, his teammates continued to get him the ball.

"If I start good, I guess it keeps going," Kilpatrick said.

Dible's off-balance 3-pointer at the first-

quarter buzzer put BG up 17-15. The Bobcats were up 31-28 at halftime and 43-38 after three quarters.

Ross was still within 42-37 with 3:18 to play before BG on a 13-1 run. Kilpatrick converted his two three-point plays during the run, the second one off a set in-bounds play from under the basket with Dible driving the lane and then finding Kilpatrick.

"They were playing with us and then we finally pulled away," Kilpatrick said. "It was a good win."

Graham had two free throws and a basket in the late run, Dible made two free throws and Matt Vannett, who finished with 14 points, added a free throw. BG was 7-of-8 from the free-throw line in the fourth quarter and 10-of-14 for the game.

"Matt showed some leadership tonight that was incredible," BG head coach Von Graffin said. "He knows what he wants. He's vocal. He's a coach on the floor."

The Bobcats used only seven players in the game because of an injury and a disciplinary issue.

"Matt and Conner didn't get in foul trouble. That's huge those guys can play those kind of minutes without getting in foul trouble," Graffin said.

"I'm dead tired. I was hurting in the second half," Kilpatrick said.

Ryan Croudup-Levario led Ross with 17 points.

# Spartans thump Fremont

LIMA — For a quarter, it looked like Fremont Ross might hang with Lima Senior in boys basketball on Thursday night.

But then it quickly became clear the Little Giants' personnel couldn't match the Spartans man for man. And they couldn't match up against their man-to-man press, either, when Lima Senior rolled to a 75-56 win.

Dravon Tyson scored 17 points, Anton Hutchins added 16 and Tyrone Perry had 12 points for Lima Senior (7-6, 4-2 Greater Buckeye Conference). Ryan Croudup-Levario scored 19 points for Ross (3-9, 2-4 GBC).

Lima Senior, which has struggled to shoot 40 percent in some games this season, hit 64 percent on field goals (32 of 50) and was a 71-percent shooting team the last three quarters.

The fuel for that fire was 26 Fremont Ross turnovers. Twenty-six turnovers that Lima Senior often turned into easy shots.

"We took away the trap (after the first quarter) and went to a straight man-to-man and tried to make them handle the basketball," Lima Senior coach Shawn Allen said. "Those two kids out front, Robert Thompson and Cortez Edwards, can sit down on people. We kept telling the kids we were going to wear them down and that's what happened."

"They had trouble getting into anything they wanted to get into," he said about Fremont Ross' offensive problems.

The Little Giants jumped out to a 20-12 lead in the first quarter, the only quarter in which they weren't tormented by turnovers.

By halftime, Lima Senior was in front 31-28. After Fremont Ross tied the game at 33-33, the Spartans went on a 12-0 run to go in front 45-33. They never led by fewer than 10 points the rest of the way, even though their season scoring leader Hutchins picked up his fourth foul late in the third quarter.

"When we can create pressure, we can get shots in transition," Allen said about the Spartans' good shooting. "The game plan the first part of the game was to throw the ball inside and get something started there."

Lima Senior ended a three-game losing streak with the win. It also left them one game back in the loss column behind Napoleon (5-1 in the GBC) and Findlay (4-1 in the GBC).

"It's been a tough week of practice and about the only thing that fixes

our problem is a win. That at least gets us going and we can enjoy this one. We're still not out of the conference yet. Everybody has to play everybody else and we still have Findlay twice," Allen said.

Lima Senior's next game will be at Lima Central Catholic on Saturday night.

"Obviously, Saturday night is a huge game for the city of Lima," he said.
