Ross boys defeat Sandusky

Fremont Ross coach Cathy Esposito was ecstatic Wednesday during the season's opening track meet against league rival Sandusky.

And she had every right to be as the Little Giant boy's team defeated the Blue Streaks 74.5 to 58.5 while the girl's fell 80-46.

Following an inspiring race in the 300-meter hurdles in which Little Giant sophomore Emma Ellenberger earned the top spot, Esposito vocalized her excitement to her team.

"You guys got me really fired up today," Esposito said. "How can you not be fired up about that (300) hurdle race."

Trailing by just the smallest of margins, Ellenberger said she saw her chance to win the race with approximately 100 yards left.

"She was slowing down," Ellenberger said of Sandusky's second place finisher. "It was in the last 100 yards or so and I needed to pick it up because she was within reach."

Esposito credited Ellenberger's courage in the heat.

"For someone like her to be able to pick up a girl and two hurdles at the finish line is impressive," said Esposito. "She blew past that girl. That's guts."

Ross outruns Sandusky

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Also finishing with high performances on the girl's side was junior Ashley Fischer, who captured first place in the 800 (2:32), 1600 (5:32) and 3200 (12:22) meter runs.

"She did really awesome today," said Esposito. "As a junior she's having a lot of good success and has a lot to look forward to."

Fischer was pleased with her performance as well.

"It feels good," Fischer said of her top finishes in the opening meet. "It's nice to do good and it helps mentally."

In the boy's meet, the youth and athletic ability of the Little Giants shone through as freshman Terence Davis and sophomore Xavier Forney excelled throughout the meet.

In the 400-meter dash, Forney fought

off early jitters to capture the race in 55.18.

"At the beginning of the race I was extremely nervous and had butterflies in my stomach," Forney said. "I was just in awe that I was in first place and I just tried to keep it up."

For Davis, he was inspired by the encouragement of his team.

"My cousin Tyrone (Lemley) is a fast guy," Davis said in his first varsity track meet. "He made me push myself in the 100 and 200. It's good running with these guys."

Davis finished first in the 100 meter dash (11.61) and second in the 200 meter dash (24.07).

"He's a tremendous athlete," said Esposito. "He's so young, and with the talent you see in him, you can really see his potential."

The track team will be back in action Tuesday, traveling to Findlay.

Ross beats Findlay

The Ross boys and girls beat Findlay in a Greater Buckeye Conference meet.

The boys won 76.5-60.5, while the girls topped the Trojans 69.5-66.5 for their first win of the season.

"It was just a really awesome meet," said coach Cathy Esposito.

Ross girls getting better

Success isn't always measured in wins or finishing in first place.

The Fremont Ross girls' track team exemplified that Tuesday as they took second place in a three-team meet with Napoleon and Port Clinton.

Napoleon captured the top spot with 96 points, the Little Giants 62 and Port Clinton finished with 16.

Several Little Giant athletes continued to improve their times as the team continues to come together.

Freshman Taylor Brown fueled Ross in several races including a first place finish in the 200 meter run with a time of 27.7.

Little Giant coach Cathy Esposito said she is impressed with Brown's performances.

"Brown has been dropping about two-tenths of a second every time she runs in the (200)," said Esposito.

Brown also had a first place finish in the 100-meter dash finishing in 12.9 and took third in the 400 meter run with a time of 1:05.09.

Port Clinton's Tonya Tigner won the Redskins' only event, capturing the 300 meter hurdles with a time of 51.07.

Another consistent runner for the Little Giants has been junior Ashley Fischer.

Fischer, a distance runner, won the 1600 meter run (5:33.4) and came in second in the 800 meter run (2:33.28).

good," Brown said. "Our times keep getting better each time we run a meet.

"We have a strong team. We're doing good overall and we'll keep progressing."

Freshman Victoria Logan took second place in the shot put with a throw of 32'2" and Nicole Guzman (4'6) and Eve McElfresh (96'3) each took third place in the high jump and discus respectively.

In the boys' meet, Fremont took advantage of a short-handed Port Clinton roster defeating the Redskins 137-0.

"When you have what you have going on right now you have different people running different events," Port Clinton coach Seth Benner said of having just seven boy runners available. "We had to figure out if we wanted to run this relay or not, or split them up and run them in open events."

With no competition in the

field events, the Little Giants worked on getting experience and improving their distances.

Winning for Fremont were Travis Miller in the high jump (5'10), Jorge Perez throwing the discus (144'9"), Zach Emly in the long jump (18'5), Robert Zucker in the shot put (45'8") and Josh Bowen in the pole vault (10.6).

Bowen also won the 1600 meter run finishing with a time of 4:57.

Julius Salgado may have had one of the more interesting races Tuesday as he fought the first several hurdles in the 110 meter hurdles to win in 15.5 seconds.

"I could have had a way better start," said Salgado, who hit the first four hurdles. "It kind of made my legs tender and I was hurting as I was coming down, but I learned and I made up for it."

Salgado also won the 200 meter run with a time of 23 seconds.

Xavier Forney won the 400 meter run in 54.8 seconds and took second in the 100 meter dash (11.83).

Redmen triumph; Berberick named Clyde meet MVP

Woodmore's Pendleton unofficially breaks own state record

CLYDE — The A.W. Hendricks Invitational Track and Field meet might have been at Clyde High School on Saturday, but Bellevue turned it into a Redmen day as both the boy's and girls teams ran there way to titles.

In addition to taking both titles, Bellevue's Derrick Berberick was named the MVP of the boys' meet.

On the boy's side Bellevue edged out Northern Ohio League rival Tiffin Columbian 129.4 to 102.5 to win the title with Toledo St. Francis third at 85. Fremont Ross was fourth with 75.40 and the host Fliers were fifth with 54. Woodmore was seventh with 23.40.

On the girls side it was Bellevue just edging out Woodmore 99 to 92.50 with Clyde third at 82. Ross was fifth with 62 points.

Berberick earned his MVP trophy by winning the 100 meter dash with an 11.2 and the 200 with a 23.0. Berberick also ran on the winning 400 meter relay team with Will Sumser, Mitch Frost and Mike Flores that ran 45.10 and was on the 1600 meter relay team that finished fourth.

"I felt like I got a really good 100 start, I got my jump going and just made sure that nobody passed me," Berberick said. "There was a little pressure on me coming in here with the best time but I knew what I had to do. Everybody pushes me hard to get me where I'm at. It feels good to win the MVP. That's a first for me. I felt good all day and ran pretty decent today and the 200 was my best time."

The Redmen also got a first in the 400 from Jordon Manlet (52.8) and a second from Jon Weasner. The Redmen also went one-two in the pole vault with Sumser (13'6") winning and Lee Miller second. Geoff Dendinger was second in both the discus (155'2") and the shot put (50'6"). Judd Lutz of Tiffin set a new meet record in the discus with a 164'8".

"I'm excited about our finish here today," said Bellevue coach Nick Lill. "We had a busy week, we had a Tuesday and a Thursday meet and I wasn't sure how much the kids had left in their legs. We came over to have a good time and I think we did that. We had a lot of PR's and Mother Nature helped us out quite a bit."

Julius Salgado of Ross had a nice day winning the 110 meter hurdles at 15.0 and finishing in second place in the 300 hurdles. Salgado was also on the 800 me-

ter relay team of Jeff Beier, Terence Davis, and Andre Velez that finished second and the 1600 meter relay team that finished third.

"Last year in the 110's I finished third," Salgado said. "This year I felt like I could win it and I went all out. They had me at like the third fastest time and I wanted to prove that I could win it. I felt like I won this race at the start. I came out strong and powerful."

Ross coach Cathy Esposito added, "Julius had a good day over here today. As a team though, we have a lot of improving to do. We're getting better; we just have to get more consistent."

Nick Tea won the high jump for the Fliers with a jump of 6'2" and teammate Justin Cook was second with a jump of 5'10". The Flier 800 meter relay team of Kyle Birkholz, Andy Sherman, Nate Caudill and Erik Birkholz also took first place with a time of 1:34.8.

"The weather was perfect and we had very good competition here today," Clyde coach Mike Martin said. "We do have a young team and we've definitely got some things that we've got to work on and we just have to keep improving every week."

Many athletes on the girls' side were making their mark on the leader board. Bellevue's Jen-

na Iannello won both the 100 and 300 hurdle races and ran on the winning 1600 meter relay team with Sami Corbett, Emily Mays and Rachel Smith. Iannello also ran on the sixth place 400 meter relay team. Kelly Beamer set the meet record in the pole vault with a vault of 11'6" and finished third in the 100.

"It's been an enjoyable year and today was certainly an enjoyable day," said Bellevue girls coach Earl Miller. "We've been moving kids around into different events this year so this year has been somewhat of a surprise to us."

Emily Pendleton of Woodmore won the shot put at 39'8" and the discus with a 158'5". Pendleton's discus throw broke her own state record pending verification. Erin Pendleton was second in the discus and fourth in the shot put.

Tatijana Jacobson of Woodmore won the high jump with a 5'4" jump and was second in the 400. Danielle Thomas won the 800 meter run. Jennifer Wright was second in the 100 meter hurdles and third in the 300 meter hurdles.

Ashley Fisher was the big gun for Ross as she won the 1600 meter run with a 5:25.6, finished second in both the 800 and 3200 meter runs and was on the 3200 meter relay team that finished sixth.

"The 1600 was a good race for me," Fisher said. "I felt good out there and my time went down and I'm happy about that. I'm pretty good at pushing myself even with a big lead. The best part of my race comes at the beginning and the end and I kind of pace myself in the middle although that pace was kind of slow today. Right now I'm about five seconds off of my PR. Our team is getting better each time out and I'm happy about that."

Taylor Brown of Ross finished second in both the 100 and 200 meter dashes and was on the 400 and 800 relay teams that finished third.

"Ashley Fisher had a real good day for us here," Esposito said. "It was a tremendous day for her. Our times today were pretty consistent to what they've been but they are getting more

efficient in their handoffs. We're still got a lot of things that we're working on. It's a short trip here and that's nice and the competition is always good and we have a good camaraderie over here."

The Flier team of Ashley Alejandro, Chelsea Ebert, Allison Bessken and Alex Lizarrihar won the 3200 meter relay with a time of 10:27.6. The 400 meter relay team of Arica Vogel, Lindsay Smetzler, Tayla Meade and Bethany Aldrich was second and the 800 team of Meghan Gill, Vogel, Smetzler and Aldrich was second as was the 1600 team of Aldrich, Smetzler, Lizarrihar and Vogel. Gill was also second in the high jump.

"I thought that we had a phenomenal day," Clyde girls coach Joel Clay said. "Last year we finished eighth and had 34 points. Today we more than 32 points before the afternoon session even started. The girls did great and I'm very proud of them. It was a home meet with great weather and the girls stepped up."
