No bull, Giants ride high

Hill, boys are third; girls happy with fifth

As long as Derek Hill steers clear of any unforeseen hazards in the next couple months, the Fremont Ross boys cross country team should be sitting pretty.

He survived a close call on Friday.

While riding a mechanical bull at the Sandusky County Fair, Hill thought he pulled his groin muscle. He woke up the next morning in pain.

"My groin was hurting, but once I started running it was fine," Hill said after finishing fourth in the Division I boys race at the Norm Bray Invitational on Saturday.

"That thing is brutal," Hill said of the bull. "I'm not doing that again."

Good thing, because he's already in Ross coach Cathy Esposito's dog house.

"I didn't want to hear that," Esposito joked after Hill informed her of the injury.

But she most certainly enjoyed hearing the ring of a third-place finish by her young and inexperienced Little Giant squad.

Toledo St. John's and Toledo Central Catholic finished first and second in the boys' large-school division.

Powerhouse Bowling Green easily won the girls large-school division. Ross was fifth.

Perkins swept the Division II-III boys and girls team titles.

Old Fort's second-place finish led the area boys contingent in the small-school division. Lakota (fifth), Woodmore (seventh), Oak Harbor (eighth) and St. Joseph Central Catholic (10th) finished in the top 10. Clyde was 11th.

On the girls side, Old Fort was the area's top team with a fifth-place finish. Oak Harbor, SJCC, Lakota and Woodmore finished seventh through 10th, respectively. Clyde was 15th.

In addition to the top-five finish by Hill (in 17:05), the Little Giants received help from Nathan Bowen (13th place), Derek Flores (30th place), Andre Velez (31st place) and Josh Bowen (33rd place).

"Hill had a nice time, but I think he could have run a little quicker," Esposito said. "But, under the conditions, he did good."

Those conditions were a runner's nightmare. A humid forecast resulted in many athletes nearly passing out after running the course at Walsh Park. Throw in the mud that was produced by heavy rain throughout the past week, and it was clear that the runners weren't treated nicely in the opening event of the season.

"All of the runners aren't used to (the heat)," said Oak Harbor junior Kelly Gephart. "It was wet and it got humid, that's got to be the cause for the injuries and exhaustion."

Gephart, who finished fourth in the girls' Division II and III race, was not only happy with her individual finish, but also the Rockets' place in the team standings.

"I'm happy with my time and the team's times," she said. "It's a good start to the season. I wasn't expecting anything too great."

And neither was Jamie Gilbert.

The SJCC coach watched her team run lackluster times at a time-trial one week ago at the same Walsh Park course. Her girls turned it up a notch for Saturday's meet.

"Everyone's time improved from the time-trials," Gilbert said. "I'm pretty happy with those times. It's a pretty good starting point."

Leading the pack of Streak runners was sophomore Sarah Stierwalt with a 17th-place finish.

Despite his squad's runner-up finish, Old Fort coach Tony Miller wasn't all smiles.

"We could have done better," he said. "A couple guys could have done better, but I'm happy finishing second."

Dustin Miller finished second in 17:27 for the Stockaders.

"Miller is a tough little runner," Tony Miller said about his No. 1 runner, who is unrelated. "He's a good leader for the team. As the season goes on, he'll get stronger."

Esposito was elated at the improvement of her girl runners from last year to this year.

A year ago, they finished last at the Norm Bray Invitational.

This year, they were boosted by strong performances from Ashley Fischer (12th place) and Alyssa Bowerman (14th place).

"They are real determined and real young," Esposito said about her entire squad. "They're going to have a good team this year."

Unless, of course, they decide to tag along with Hill to the fair.
