LITTLE GIANTS TO TAKE PART IN RELAY MEET

Coach Althoff Selects Squad for Events at Mansfield

Although weather and closing of schools brought an abrupt end to track practice at Ross high school, Coach Harold (Whitey) Althoff will enter a team in the Mansfield Relays next week, he announced Friday.

"I haven't been able to get much of a line on the boys, but we're going to take a team to Mansfield, if for nothing more than experience," Althoff said.

Leading track and field stars from the entire state will gather at the relays and competition will be keen. It will be the first time this year that the Little Giant tracksters have had competition.

ROSS TRACK TEAM TO DRILL FRIDAY

The boys will leave here at 6:45 a. m. Saturday for Mansfield, traveling in a school bus. Entries will be placed in every event. Coach Althoff announced also that Fox, Spangler, Lewis and Woodruff will form the shuttle relay team, each runner taking a 120-yard hurdle event.

Del Hetrick, one of the promising track candidates, is ineligible for participation because he took part in the Lindsey independent basketball tournament, Coach Althoff said.

LITTLE GIANTS MAKE SHOWING AT MANSFIELD

Have Practice Meet in Elmore Tuesday for More Material

A first place in the medley relay event and a tie for fourth in the pole vault gave Fremont Ross high's tracksters seven points and a tie for 13th place in the annual Mansfield relays Saturday at Mansfield.

The medley relay team, composed of Spangler, Wanstall, Hofelich and Campbell, finished ahead of Toledo Scott, Cleveland Lincoln, Cleveland East Tech and Greenville in that order, and covered the distance in 8 minutes 18.8 seconds. This is one of the new track events this year.

Bud Kaufman ended the pole vault in a tie with Linta, of Mansfield, and Slowinski, of Cleveland East Tech, third place having been won by Becker, of Elyria, with Jim and Don Whittaker, of Sandusky, tying for first place with a leap of 12 feet six inches.

The Sandusky Blue Streaks took the team honors in the relay meet, scoring a total of 42 points, to displace the Toledo Scott team as champions. Scott and Toledo DeVilbiss were in second place with 35 points each.

Other schools in the meet finished as follows: Cleveland Collinwood, 21½; Cleveland East Tech, 21; Erie, Pa., 19; Elyria, 18; Mansfield, 17; Cleveland Central 13; Cleveland West Tech, 12; Toledo Libbey, 10; Canton McKinley, 8; Cannonsburg, Pa., and Fremont Ross, 7 each; Cleveland Fairview 4. Twelve other teams out of the 35 entered finished in the scoring column but all were less than four points.

Coach Harold Althoff said his squad will go to Elmore Tuesday evening for a practice meet with the harriers there. "We want to get a line on more material," Coach Althoff said.

The Fremont team appears weak in the dashes this year, and there will be lots of difficulty in developing any outstanding men as there is no track available on which the Ross candidates can practice.

TRACKSTERS IN HEAVY WORKOUT

Taking full advantage of the first real spring day this season, more than fifty Ross high school trackmen enjoyed a two hour workout at Harmon Field and the Sandusky county fairgrounds Monday afternoon.

The squad is getting into shape for its first dual meet this year, scheduled for Saturday at Toledo, when the Little Giant cinder path artists meet the Toledo Libbey team.

Coach Harold (Whitey) Althoff will take his squad to Elmore Tuesday evening, weather permitting, for the practice meet with the Harris-Elmore high school team. In this practice, he hopes to get a definite line on his material, especially in the sprint events, where the Little Giants are very weak this year.

The only action the Ross boys have had thus far came last Saturday at the Mansfield relays, where they scored seven points on a win by the medley relay team and a tie for fourth in the pole vault.

Ross Track Team Will Meet Libbey Saturday

With their first week of actual practice behind them, the Ross high school track team will invade Toledo Saturday afternoon for a meet with the formidable Libbey squad at 2 p. m.

Coach Harold (Whitey) Althoff will take a squad of about 30 to Toledo for the first dual match of the year. The squad will be somewhat crippled, however, by the loss of Eugene Hofelich for this

LITTLE GIANTS DEFEAT LIBBEY FOR FIRST WIN

Campbell Sets Record in
Mile Event; Fremont
Shows Balance

Scoring heavily in second and third places, the Ross high school track team, engaging in its first dual meet of the season, upset formidable Toledo Libbey at Toledo Saturday, 76½ to 55½.

Led by Wade (Soupy) Campbell, who set a new track record in the mile by covering the jaunt in 4 minutes 39.6 seconds, the Ross tracksters took seven firsts, nine seconds and ten thirds. Libbey won eight firsts, but dropped to three seconds and two thirds.

Campbell's mile time was better than the old record of 4 minutes 42 seconds held by Karlovetz, of last year's Little Giant team. Although Campbell's running dominated, the mile run was featured by the fact that it was a grand slam for Fremont, second place going to Reinbolt and third to Rosen.

Joe Lewis scored most points, getting 13½, while Fox was next with ten, Campbell 6½, and Freeh and Brudzinski 6 each.

The Libbey track is 12 yards short of the regulation 440-yard oval, and as a result the relay times were faster than usual.
