



Fresh from its first victory of the 1959-60 season, the Fremont Ross high swimming team tries to keep its streak alive against Lima, 2 p.m. Thursday in the Lima YWCA (women's) pool and against rugged Columbus Academy at 2:30 p.m. Saturday in the Fremont Junior high natatorium.

Ross lost meets late in 1959 to the Oberlin college Jayvees and to Sandusky high. Initial meet in 1960 against Findlay last Saturday resulted in an easy Little Giant triumph. Record of the Giants is 1-2 currently.



One Better's National Record; Huffman Breaks Own Standard

Assault on Fremont pool records by Canton McKinley's powerful Bulldogs continued Friday as the defending state champions cracked four records in the Junior high pool and tied another.

One of the new records will be submitted as a new national record. The 200-yard freestyle relay team of McKinley, composed of Bill Schubach, Dick Frederick, Larry Caghan and Marty Mull, splashed the distance in 1:31.2 which is .5 seconds faster than the official national time of 1:31.7 set by Rockford, Ill., in 1959.

All But One

McKinley now holds every existing pool record at Fremont except the 200-yard individual medley which is held by Bob Schenck of Lima. His time of 2:27.6 was set January 30, 1960 when Lima met Ross in the local pool. It was erroneously reported in Friday's paper that Fremont's Jack Talbot holds the school and pool record. Talbot still holds the school record of 2:34.9 set in December, 1959.

Talbot holds the school and pool record in the 150-yard individual medley with a time of 1:39.0 set in 1959. That event has been erased in favor of the 200-individual.

Mull, who set a national record last month in the 100-freestyle event, went the 50-free here last night in 22.8 seconds which broke the Ross pool record of 23.4.

Tim Loehr of McKinley went 59.3 seconds in the 100-butterfly to break Mull's mark of one minute flat set in Fremont in 1959.

Schubach went 1:59.4 in the 200-freestyle to break another Ross pool record.

Time of 53.4 seconds was turned in by Frederick of one minute in the 100-freestyle to tie a Fremont pool record set by a former McKinley tanker.

The 200-freestyle relay team of McKinley cracked the Fremont pool record of 1:34.9 set by Cleveland University school in 1957.

Record For Huffman

One Ross record went on the books when Lynn Huffman negotiated the 100-orthodox for 1:13.8 which broke the Ross school record of 1:14.7 set by Huffman in January this year.

Veteran Ted Brannin, coach of McKinley's swimming team for 32 years, calls his 1959-60 team the "best one I've ever coached." He likes this season's overall team balance.

Brannin's current edition has now won nine straight meets this season and has chalked up 49 new

records including three national marks.

McKinley has won the state championship the past four years and is an odds-on favorite to cop honors again this year. The Bulldogs have won 11 state championships in swimming. Ross high is second best with seven the last in 1953.

Brannin held out defending state diving champion Bob Rice who is bothered with sinus trouble. He will be in action this afternoon at Bowling Green in the BG relays. Ross high is also will compete in the relays as well as many other regional swimming powerhouses.

Ross did well in team score against McKinley, piling up 35 points to 51 for the defending state champs.

Fremont winners were Talbot in the 100-backstroke, Huffman in the 100-orthodox, Dave Serwin first and Jim Kaufman second in the diving event and the Ross 200-medley relay team of Talbot, Mike Reed, Huffman and Bob Vogel.

Dave Parker picked up a second and third for Ross, Vogel a second, Bill Wensinger a third, Reed a third and John Myers a third.

A capacity crowd jammed the area circling the pool to watch the spectacular McKinleyites' record-smashing effort and Ross high's game stand to stay close to the highly favored invaders.

Meer was run off in less than one hour.

Best race from a spectator standpoint was the 100-backstroke in which Talbot had to hold off the close pursuit of McKinley's John Leisure and Dan Yost.


