

## OGDEN ANNOUNCES HARRIER SCHEDULE

Schedule for the Ross High school cross country team was announced today by Coach William Ogden. The first meet will be next Saturday with Mansfield there.

On October 21, Scott of Toledo will be met there, and on October 28, the harriers will take part in the Northwest District meet at Toledo. The first home meet will be with Sandusky here on November 3, and on the following day, they will go to the state meet at Columbus.

Devilbiss will be here on November 11 and the next Saturday, Bellevue will be met there. Two lettermen, Frank Talyfhka and G. Schneider are working out with 11 others, among whom are McComb, Karlovetz, Witter, Clookie and Mathern.

A third squad of Ross athletes also took to the highways today as Coach Bill Ogden loaded his cross country team into automobiles and headed for Mansfield where his cohorts will have their first meet of the fall season.

Banked with but two veterans from last year's fine team, Ogden was none too hopeful. Mansfield is reported to have a veteran squad available.

## F. H. S. THIN-CLADS FINISHED SECOND

Racing against an aggregation of veterans, some of whom have seen several years of experience, Fremont High school's cross country team, in charge of Coach Bill Ogden, went down to defeat before a strong Mansfield team by a score of 39 to 16, in a meet held in Mansfield last Saturday morning.

The Mansfield runners, having the advantage of experience and a longer training period, copped the first four places. Cotsenmoyer finished at the head of the field, winning the two-and-a-quarter-mile event in the good time of 11 minutes and 46 seconds. Paul, Wallis and Mayer of Mansfield, copped the next three places for that outfit.

Polyshka, the only veteran member of the Fremont team, was the first of the local aggregation to cross the finish line, this being placed in fifth position. Kimes of Mansfield, finished in sixth position, with Karlovetz, McCombs, Clookie, and Fitzgerald of Fremont winning the seventh, eighth, ninth, and tenth positions.

Coach Ogden stated today that if the meet had been run later in the season, the local outfit could easily have made a better showing, since the Mansfield team held a decided advantage over the locals due to the fact that the schools in that city started considerably earlier than Fremont schools, and thus the winners have had a longer training period.

# OGDEN'S TRACK MEN RUN AGAINST SCOTT

After a week of intensive workouts, Coach Bill Ogden declared today that his squad of purple and white cross country runners were in fine condition and set to tackle Scott High's track team at Ottawa park in Toledo tomorrow morning.

Having suffered defeat at the hands of Mansfield High last week, mainly because of the fact that the outfit lacked seasoning, the team seemed prepared today to afford the Toledo runners some of the stiffest opposition of the year.

The team last week was also handicapped by the appearance of only one veteran in the lineup, he being Polyshka, who finished in fifth place. However, Galen Schneider, another veteran of the 1932 northwestern Ohio championship outfit, is expected to see action this week. Schneider was unable to appear last week due to the fact that he had not had sufficient training for the long grind.

Several members of the Toledo Scott team are veterans of several campaigns, and they are expected to prove plenty tough for Fremont High's Little Giants of the track. Among those expected to see action for the Toledo school are Ken Sampson, Jack Sailing, Don Kern, Ed Jenson, Frank Suder, Roy Treuhaft, John Thorpe, Walton Osborne, Harry Leopold, Ro' d Diemer and Fred Tripp.

Among Coach Ogden's choices for Saturday's meet are: Polyshka, Karlovetz, McCombs, Clookie, Fitzgerald and Schneider.

# SCHOLASTIC CROSS COUNTRY CLASSIC

COLUMBUS, O., Nov. 2.—(INS)—More than 60 high school athletes, winners and runner-up in district cross country running meets, will compete for the state cross country championship here Saturday over the Ohio State University cross country course.

Participants in the state contest were selected last Saturday at regional meets held in Cleveland, Toledo, Cincinnati, and Columbus. School teams and individual performers who placed among the winning 10 runners at each contest will be eligible to race here.

Runners from Salem high, Cleveland West Tech, Akron East and Cleveland Lincoln will represent the northeastern part of the state as a result of the Cleveland semi-finals. Toledo Scott and Toledo De Vilbiss won at Toledo, with Norwood and Dayton Roosevelt walking off with the Cincinnati meet. Columbus Central and Newark high will contest Columbus district supremacy.

The races here will be over a distance of two miles. The finish line will be in the Ohio State stadium.
