

# Ross on top in BC tourney

Sandusky will win the bigger share of the individual titles but Ross will win the biggest gem this Saturday at Ross High School: the Buckeye Conference Wrestling Tournament championship.

The above reasoning is based on individual wrestlers' records and on finishes of the individuals in last year's tournament. Points were awarded on projected finishes of the wrestlers in the eight-team tourney on an eight points for first, seven for second, six for third, etc., down to one point for an eighth place finish.

In The News-Messenger projections, Ross tallied 83 points, one better than Sandusky, the defending BC champs. Elyria was third with 71, Mansfield fourth with 61, followed by Findlay, Marion Harding, Lorain, and Admiral King.

The Little Giants have the top spots at 101, 105, and heavyweight with seconds at 129, 141, and 148. Sandusky counters with possible titlists at 115, 129, 141, 148, 158, 178, and 188.

Tony Munoz at 101, the returning BC champ at that weight, Jesse Heidelberg, 108, and Jim Smith, heavyweight, have the best shots of five possible titlists for Ross. Ranking second in the ratings for Ross are Terry Holmes, 141, and Pete Werling, 148.

Holmes should reach the finals against Sandusky's Terry Randleman. The two have met twice before this season with Randleman holding a 1-0-1 edge. Werling should be going against two-time conference titlist Tony Jones of Sandusky in the 148-pound final. Werling and Jones have split the two times they have wrestled this season.

In all, there are five returning champions and ironically, one of the five, a state champion, will not be seeded in the top four of his weight division. The champions are Munoz, Kenny Miller (108) of Sandusky, Ed Favors (129), Jones, and Luther Henson (188) of Sandusky. All returning champs except Munoz and Henson will be wrestling one weight class higher this year than when they won their titles.

Miller will be the returning champ not seeded. One of the requirements to be seeded is to have at least five matches this season and Miller sports only a 3-0 record. Drawing the top seed in that division (115) will probably be Gary Hightower of Mansfield, who finished third a season ago in the same weight classification and is 8-0 this season.

In a poll of the eight coaches, in deference to the N-M ratings, Sandusky was picked to vie with Elyria for the top spot while Ross and Mansfield are slated to fight it out for the third and fourth spots.

Wrestling Saturday will begin at noon with the first

round. Finals are slated for 7 p.m. Saturday night with championship bouts and consolation finals being run at the same time.

Following is The News-Messenger ratings on how the 13 classifications could end up. In the weight divisions, the wrestler, school, and current record at press time are given.

# Sandusky shades Ross in BC wrestling

Ross failed in its attempt to knock Sandusky off the top of the heap of Buckeye Conference wrestling.

With eight finalists, the Little Giants could manage only three individual championships as the Blue Streaks came from behind to win the Buckeye Conference Wrestling Tournament at Ross High School Saturday. The Blue Streaks tallied 123 points, six and one-half more than the Little Giants.

Tony Munoz, Jesse Heidelberg, and Jim Smith won weight division titles for Ross with second spots going to Aaron Sewell, Terry Holmes, Pete Werling, Clarence Parks, and Bruce Levenson.

Munoz won his second consecutive BC title at 191 pounds by defeating Mansfield's

Jon Seimon in the title bout. The win, however, was by a narrow 5-4 margin as Munoz wrestled sluggishly against the Tyer junior.

"For some reason I just didn't want to hit my moves," Munoz, a second place finisher at his weight division in the state last year, said. "I just couldn't move."

When questioned about his wrestling this year, Munoz said, "I think I am better than last year—it's just that I haven't wrestled well."

Munoz scored on a takedown in the first period but had to escape and get another takedown to lead 5-2 midway through the last period. Seimon closed the gap to 5-3 on an escape and a penalty for "stalling" on Munoz closed the gap to the final margin with two seconds to go in the match. Heidelberg's win at 108 brought the full

house down. A junior, the top seeded Ross junior may have been a slight underdog in his match with Sandusky's Julio Bauthier despite a spotless 12-0 mark.

Trailing 2-0 midway through the second period, Heidelberg caught the Sandusky senior in a cradle, put the pressure on and pinned Bauthier in 3:21.

For a few seconds after the match, it was difficult to tell whether the roof on the Ross gym was going to be high enough to contain the high flying Heidelberg. After he came down out of the rafters, he talked about his title win, his first in the conference.

"I guess I just got mad at him for taking me down in the first period," Heidelberg said. "He never took me down in the match we had before. (He had beaten Bauthier 4-2 in a dual meet.)

"When I got the cradle on him, I was thinking that I had him."

Heidelberg, although expressing surprise about his unblemished record, gave credit to Munoz for his progress this year. "I've become a better wrestler by wrestling Tony in practice," he said.

After those first two opening title wins, there was little to cheer about for the Ross fans until Smith won his title in the last bout of the evening.

After Heidelberg's win over Bauthier, Ross wrestlers faced Sandusky grapplers three time and lost all three in the championship finals.

Sewell was dropped by Brian King 8-4 in the 129-pound bout and Terry Randieman pinned Holmes in 3:48 of the 141-pound skirmish.

In probably the classic match of the night, Tony Jones, who was named the tourney's "outstanding wrestler" nipped Ross's Werling 10-8 in the 148-pound battle.

Kelvin Irby, Sandusky's 122-pounder, took third from Ross's Ted Stroud with a 6-4 win in the consolation finals. Irby had trailed 4-0 after the first period.

Smith, Ross's 250-pound junior heavyweight, cruised into the finals by pinning Oscar Addley of Mansfield in 1:15 in his first round match and reached the finals by stopping Findlay's Tom Kennedy in 32 seconds.

Smith faced George Cook of Elyria in the finals and had his hands full before pulling out a 7-3 win. Smith scored on two takedowns in the first period and an escape and a takedown in the finals two minutes. All Cook's points came on escapes.


Finishing third in the tourney was Elyria with 108 points while fourth went to Mansfield at 77½. Findlay, Lorain, Admiral King, and Marion Harding rounded out the field.


