## Tennis, Golf, Track Are On Sports Slate; Baseball Postponed

Spring sports athletes of Ross high school are in Sandusky today competing in the second annual Buckeye Conference Sports day with the Blue Streaks of Sandusky high as hosts.

Events began this morning in tennis as Coach Jack Decker started his Little Giants down the elimination trail at Battery Park. At 1:30 p. m. at Mills Creek course, John Titsworth got his golfers started.

Due to the inclement weather this week, prohibiting a playoff of Ross with Lorain to determine the representative in today's slate of sports, there will be no baseball championship decided, with coaches of the respective schools scheduling later dates for the playoffs.

Marion Harding defeated Findlay, 3-0 to earn the right as one of today's competitors. However, the winner of the Ross-Lorain game will necessarily decide the other opponent, thus Coach Lawrence Doren's squad will be idle in today's program. At this point Coach Doren's squad has won six games, lost four.

Marion is defending champion in track, Findlay in golf, Elyria in tennis and Lorain in baseball.

Coach Mal Mackey's track crew will be in action this afternoon and tonight, finals in the running events getting under way at 7:45 p. m. immediately following a short program of activities to open the night events.

Winners of the tennis and golf playoffs will be presented honors during the short program.

## Tops B.C. Field During Sports Day

Gail Brauchla set a new high jump record and Jim Tiller tied his old mark in the 100 yard dash and won three firsts Friday at Sandusky, as Ross high school placed fourth in track for the Second Annual Sports Day of the six schools in the Buckeye Conference.

In other activities, Ross golfers were sixth in competition and tennis entrants from the Little Giants school dropped out in quarter-finals and semi-finals.

### **Baseball Postponed**

Baseball, the fourth sport originally carded for the daylong program, was sidelined inasmuch as raining weather during the week prevented a playoff game between Lorain and Ross which would have sent the winner against Marion for the finals. Coach Lawrence Doren will meet with Lorain to determine the playoff date, then the championship encounter will be carded.

**Brauchla cleared the bar at an even six feet, erasing by four inches the mark of last year's opener when Ed Wengard of Elyria, turned in a 5'8" effort.**

In other events, Brauchla placed fourth in the broad jump, fifth in high hurdles. Winner was Ross' Jim Tiller, who leaped to a distance of 21' 8 5/8". Tiller, in winning the 100 yard dash also, tied last year's mark of 10.1 seconds. In the 220 yard dash, Tiller copped a first with a time of 23.7.

Two fifth places were also earned by Little Giants when Brauchla took the high hurdles and Dave Wolshuck picked off a fifth in the discus event.

**Marion high's Prexies, who copped the first track meet last year, repeated again, piling up a total of 81½ markers to second place Sandusky's Blue Streaks which had 58.**

In third was Lorain with 36½ while Ross took fourth with an even 31 markers. Findlay's Trojans were fifth with 12 points and Elyria's Pioneers had five points in last place.
