

Peddicord Fells Fliers For Ross In Sectional, 4-0

"That was the best pitching job he has ever done for me," voiced Fremont Ross baseball coach Don Purvis after Ned Peddicord, a solidly - built senior right hander, fired a two-hitter at Clyde here Saturday to give the Little Giants a 4-0 sectional tournament victory and set up the finals today at 4 between Ross and Gibsonburg.

Gibsonburg won a forfeit from Tiffin Calvert which failed to make an appearance. The Golden Bears won over St. Joe Friday and will play the undefeated (7-0) Little Giants at Anderson field.

Peddicord showed fine control, walking just one batter. He struck out 12 and did not permit a hit after the third inning. His opponent was tall and hard - throwing Dan Daugherty, also unbeaten going into the fray. The Clyde ace gave up three hits, two to Bob Sanford, and fanned five.

Ross picked up two runs in the second inning when Sanford singled, stole second and scored on an error after Don Weisz hit a ground ball. Weisz reached second on the play and moved to third on a passed ball. Dave George's infield out scored Weisz. Ken Pasch reached first on an error in the third, stole second, went to third on an infield out and came

home on an attempted pick-off play.

Fremont's final run came in the seventh. Sanford and Jerry Slatter singled and both runners advanced on a passed ball. Weisz's infield out brought in Sandord.

Clyde advanced a runner to

third in the sixth but failed to score.

The Fremont pitching staff now has toiled seven complete games.

The winner of the Ross-Gibsonburg game plays in the North Robinson district Friday. Regionals are set for May 15 at Lima.

Junior High Third In Relays

Fremont Junior high track team placed a strong third Saturday with 20 points in the Mansfield Freshman Invitational Relays. Mansfield John Sherman won with 22 points and Cleveland Kirk was second with 21.

Craig Swartz continued undefeated in the 440-yard dash with a clocking of 53.2, breaking the old record of 54.6. The local freshman has turned the oval in faster time than some of the varsity athletes in the area this spring.

Fremont took one other second, that being the 880-yard relay as Larry Tucker, Steve Parker, Ray Caraway and Tim Arndt ran the distance in 1:39.1. This time also is a new Mansfield relays record. The old mark was 1:40.

Fremont Wins Sectional

Lefty Bob Shetenhelm mixed a sharp-breaking curve ball with a good fast one Monday and pitched the Fremont Ross Little Giants to a 2-0 sectional championship victory over Gibsonburg at the Ross high diamond.

The junior southpaw was touched for four hits, three by Jim Balsizer. Gibsonburg put two runners aboard in the first inning and two on in the seventh but Shetenhelm shut the door.

Russ Hagerty punched out two of the five Fremont hits, with Dave George, Jerry Binder and Don Weisz each getting one off the slants of lefty Jon Heffner, who was able to work out of several jams.

Two spots which Heffner failed, however, came in the third and fourth innings when Fremont scored its runs. Hagerty singled to lead off the third and

moved to second on a sacrifice. He stole third and came home on a wild throw. Second run for Fremont came in the fourth on a double by Binder and two infield outs.

Ross has now won eight in a row and dating back to last season has taken 23 of the last 25. Shetenhelm fanned 12 batters.

The Little Giants advance to

the district tournament at North Robinson against a foe yet to be determined. Ross will play Friday.
