Ross varsity whips Marion Harding but loses to Little Giants JV squad

The Ross varsity golf team is doing well enough against its opponents so far this young season, but it is having trouble beating its own junior varsity team.

The varsity Little Giants improved their record to 2-0-1 with a 171-194 victory over Marion Harding at the Marion Country Club Tuesday, but they lost their second straight decision to their JVs, who totaled 161 strokes.

"Our top 10 guys average between 40 and 44, so we go with the lowest averages for the varsity," said Ross Coach Dave Fleming.

Last week against Bowling Green, it was Doug Peterson who led the Ross JVs to the low team score of the day with a 37. This week it was his brother Andy Peterson, who fired a 38. His JV teammate, Rob Beck, was second low medalist with a 39. The Ross JVs buried Marion 161-213.

Meanwhile, for the varsity, Mark Miesle led the

way with a 40 while Brian Miller and Todd Crawshaw added 42s.

In two other area matches yesterday, Clyde nipped Port Clinton 169-170 while St. Joe fell to Perkins 170-176.

At the Sun Valley Golf Club in Port Clinton, Clyde barely stayed unbeaten with a one-shot victory over Port Clinton.

Mike Whitaker led the way with a 40, followed by Ron Ritzman with a 41 and John Stahl with a 43. Steve Coffin led PC with a 41.

Little Giants bid to end Findlay's BC golfing reign

Ross will host the Buckeye Conference Golf Tournament Monday at the Fremont Country Club and unlike previous 10 years, there is no clear cut choice.

Findlay, winner of 10 straight conference titles, is the team to beat but the Trojans cannot command the favorites' role. Fremont Ross is given the top shot at ended Findlay's domination.

Earlier this season, the Little Giants lost by three shots to the Trojans in an 18-hole match at the Fremont Country Club, Ross's home course. Had Ross won, it would have ended the Trojan 94-match winning streak.

"Our kids want to go at them (Findlay) again," said Ross Coach Dave Fleming, "especially after the last match with them. We were ahead of them after nine holes (158-159)."

Fleming also said his team is anxious to get at the Trojans partly because of a Thursday night 158 at FCC. Only two players out of Fleming's possible lineup for the 9:45 a.m. tee time tourney played in the Thursday match, Fleming pointed out.

Mark Miesle, Todd Crawshaw and Brian Miller are definite starters in the Buckeye tourney for Ross with the remaining two slots still being mulled over by the Ross coach.

"Those three have been in the top five in averages all season," he said.

The format for the 18-hole tournament will have the low four scores out of five golfers being counted toward the team total.

Fleming pointed out he knows little about the other six teams in the Buckeye field.

"Elyria is a little better this year, I hear," he said, "but I don't know much at all about the Lorain schools."

"I do know that it will be a closer race this year."
