PORT CLINTON - Fremont Ross boys fought off the heat to shutdown Port Clinton with a 6-0 victory. Ayden Carter (pictured) collected three goals for his first hat-trick in the lopsided win. Carter collected his first goal at the 33:30 of the first half with a nice move to the net. Then at the 20:50 Carter found the net again to give the Little Giants a 2-0 lead. Cole Kinsey of Ross got into the act as he gave Ross a 3-0 advantage with 19:33 remaining in the half with a nice kick into the left corner of the goal. After a 'self-goal' by Port Clinton, Carter scored his third goal on what possibly will be his easiest goal of the season as he touch kicked the ball through the goal at the 28.34 mark left in the game. The final Ross goal came at the 20:30 of the game when Connor Growel connected for his first goal.

"It was a total team effort," coach Alex Coressel said after the win. "We actually played the ball around and offensively we had good looks the entire game."

FREMONT – The Little Giants' boys soccer team took on the fifth-ranked St Francis Knights (5-0) in a boys TRAC match at the Fremont Ross field Tuesday afternoon.

St. Francis scored their first goal with 2:28 left in the first half when senior defender Garret Lopez found the Ross goal. The Little Giants played like a band of Little Giants and held the fifth-ranked team in the state to one goal in the first 40 minutes of play. It was the defensive work of Bryce Estep, a freshman, Haydn Marcee, Evan Garcia, along with the play of goalie Logan Baacke, that kept the Giants in the contest.

Ross scored the first goal of the second half at the 33:30 mark when junior Victor Martinez found the St. Francis net. St Francis answered at 29:48 of the second half when senior Travis Kenner kicked the ball home, giving the Knights a 2-1 advantage. The Knights weren't done there. With the Giants' defense still holding their own, the Knights used their speed and experience to net two more scores. Senior midfielder Jayden Monroe, made the score 3-1 at the 12:15 mark of the second half as the Knights began to pull away. St Francis' Caleb Trent scored the final goal of the night with 5:26 remaining to ice the win for the Knights. Ross coach Alex Coressel was pleased with his team's performance. "Our entire team stuck to our game plan," Coressel began. "Don't overextend and give the gaps and spaces to score. We stayed in; we took opportunities when they came.

They are the fifth-ranked team in the state, and we held them to four goals. I am not going to complain," the coach concluded.

FREMONT – The Little Giant boys soccer team scored six first-half goals to lead them to a 5-3-1 record and an 8-0 Non-league win over Toledo Start.

That goal happened with 16:20 left in the first half. The next goal was scored four minutes later, it was a nice assist from Baacke to Connor Growel that put the Giants up 4-0. Growel added his second goal at the 10:26 to build the lead to 5-0 in favor of the Giants as the first half ended.

Ayden Carter added his second goal of the match at 32:30 of the second half as Ross was rolling 5-0. One of the most popular goals came next when Haydn Marsee found the net at the jubilation of his teammates. This happened at 20:35 of the second half. The final goal came from the foot of Julyan Arreola on a penalty kick at 6:16.

The Giants showed some crisp passing and great defense. Start was obviously not a tough opponent, but it gave some of Ross' younger players a chance to get some playing time.

The Giants return to action on their home field against Old Fort this Saturday.

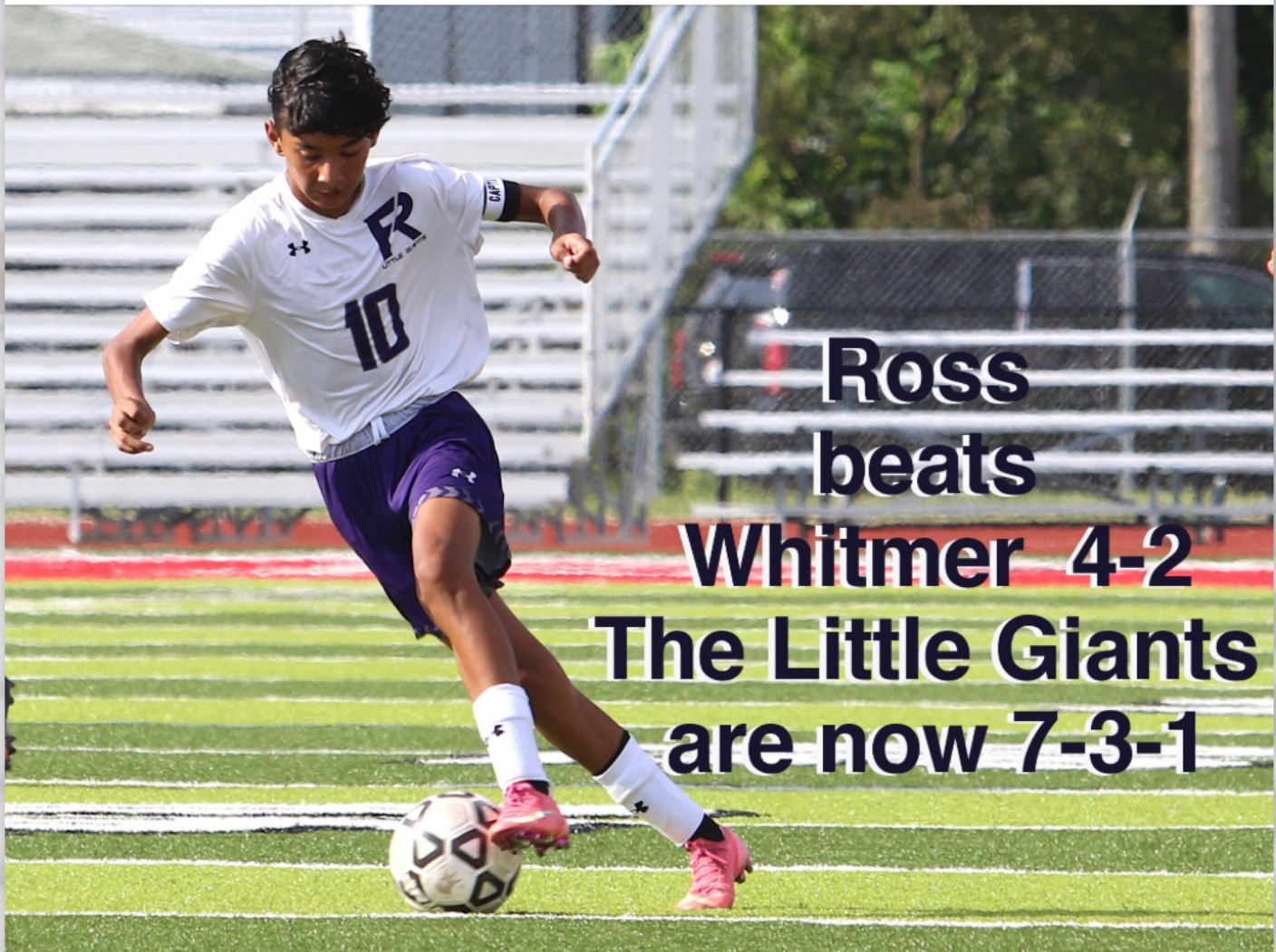

OREGON – The boys soccer team travelled to Oregon Clay Tuesday evening for a TRAC battle and lost after a hard-fought game.

The scoring started at 32:54 when Oregon's Carson Langford scored on a penalty kick. Proof that there was pushing and shoving happening. The Eagles were aggressive and physical, holding possession for the first six minutes of the half. At 27:01, the Giants got on the board as Ayden Carter boomed a kick from nearly 40 yards away that found the net after the Oregon goalie misplayed the ball as everyone watched the kick end up in the Fremont goal to tie the game at 1-1. On the second penalty kick of the night from Jared Johanni, the Eagles took the lead back at the 15:25. But again the Giants (8-6-1) came back to tie the score before the end of the physical first half when Carter again found the net, displaying speed and quickness with 10:56 remaining in the half. That was the end of the scoring for the half as the teams continued to battle.

It was thought that Oregon Clay was playing tired after a similar battle the night before, when they travelled to Ashland and were defeated 5-1. But the Eagles took flight during the 40-minute second period and overtook the Giants, who were still fighting and clawing. The game remained at 2-2 during the first 20 plus minutes of the half. Logan Baacke made some great saves in goal, and Haydn Marsee, Bryce Estep, and Evan Garcia defended the Eagles and continued to battle.

Clay (7-8-1) took control during the final five minutes of the game. The Eagles' Adam Hanson finally broke the tie at 4:08 with an Eagles goal. They weren't done there. With the Giants on their heels, the Eagles iced the win at 2:10 when senior Zack Wells found the Giants' net to make the final 4-2, Eagles.

"We battled hard, but when you have chances to score, you have to finish the chances, and we didn't," coach Alex Coressel said after the TRAC battle. "It was our first game after a week off, and we needed to respond to their physicality, and we just didn't."

The Giants are right back at it on Wednesday as they travel to Tiffin to take on the 2-10-3 Tornadoes.
