Ihnat expects a squad of some 35 boys before the end of the week.

Seniors Win Inter-Class In Ross Track

Senior class, led by Richard (Skip) Baker who took three first places, won the Ross high Inter-Class track meet at Harmon Field Monday.

Inter-class helps decide the main strength of Coach John Ihnat's thinlies who engage in their first competition Friday, 4 p.m., against Port Clinton high there.

Baker won the high jump (five feet, four inches), pole vault (10 feet, six inches) and broad jump (18 feet, 1½ inches).

Seniors scored 57 points, Juniors 41 and Sophomores 37. Bob Atkins led the Juniors with a first place in the 100-yard dash (10.4 seconds), a first in the 220-yard dash (25 seconds) and placed second in the broad jump.

Atkins Wins Three Firsts But Ross Whipped By PC In Track; Redskins High Jumper Goes 6-3

Ross high had only one consolation in its defeat, 94-24, to Port Clinton at Port Clinton Friday in the opening track meet for the Little Giants.

That was three first place wins for 15 points by Bob Atkins, junior speedster of the Giants. Atkins won the 100-yard dash in 10.45 seconds; the 220-yard dash in 23.35 seconds; and the 440-yard dash in 54.2 seconds, quite an accomplishment in one meet.

Port Clinton won first place in all the other 11 events including a brilliant high jump effort by Harold Beck, a junior.

Beck set a new True-Lay Stadium and Port Clinton school mark with a leap of 6 feet, 3 $\frac{1}{8}$ inches in the high jump. His best previous high, unofficial, was 6 feet, one half inch performed Tuesday in practice. His best previous official jump was 5 feet, 10 inches.

Bob Derivan of the PC Redskins won the pole vault and both the low and high hurdles.

Richard (Skip) Baker of Ross tied for second in the pole vault with a vault of 10 feet, 2 inches.

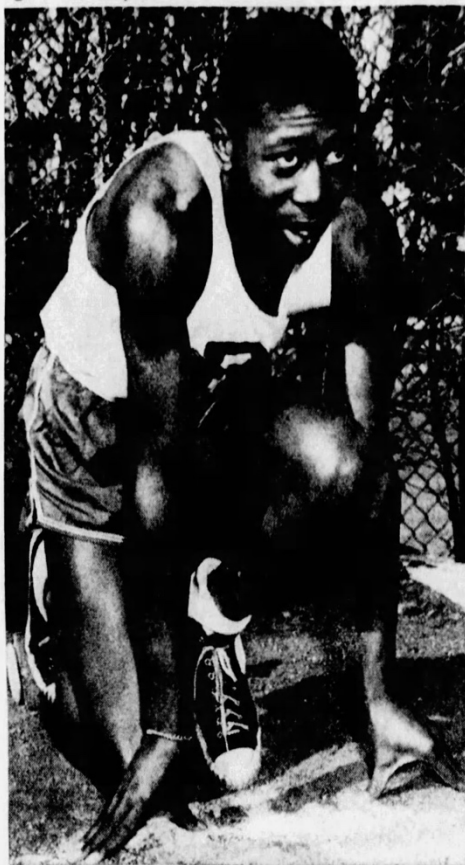

Only 12 events were held, the pole vault and broad jump called off due to black topping of the runway.

Ross won seven first places, three by Junior Bob Atkins. Atkins won the 100, 220 and 440. Hetrick, making his first start, was bothered only by wildness. It was walks and errors that accounted for Calvert's runs.

Winner was Ken Rombach, tall, lanky freshman of Calvert. He struck out five.

Hetrick, the loser, gave up eight walks and fanned three.

Calvert came up with two runs in the fourth on two walks and two Ross errors. Ross held a 3-2 lead entering the first of the seventh and final inning after picking up two runs in the second on a single by Dan Moran combined with errors and walks. In the fourth, Ross tallied one marker on a single and Roger Mann, a sacrifice and single by Bill Johnson.

In Calvert's seventh, Hetrick gave up walks to the first two batters. Dundore came in in relief for Ross. An error brought the tying run across and a long fly to center field produced what proved to be the winning run. Dundore struck out the next two batters.
