

Ross girls drop opener

The Ross girls softball team gave up seven runs in the first inning and it proved to be too much as the Little Giants dropped a 12-11 decision to Margaretta Wednesday in Castalia.

"I think we had a case of the jitters early," said Coach Christy Holland. "After the first inning, though, we were all right."

The Giants came back to pound out 16 hits, led by Sandy Long, Celenea Simmons and Carol Falquette with three each.

Ross scored five runs in the top of the seventh inning to tie the game, but the Polar Bears scored in their half to win it.

It was the opening game for the Giants, who travel to Marion Harding today.

In one other softball game Wednesday, Old Fort beat Hopewell-Loudon 11-5.

Beth Omlor led the winners with a home run and the pitching victory.

Betty Terry had three hits for the Stockaders. Barb Gabel and Lori Meisner had two apiece.

MARION — The Ross girls softball team broke open a one-run game with eight runs in the final inning to beat Marion Harding 20-15 Thursday afternoon.

It was the first victory of the season out of three games for the Lady Little Giants. They led 12-11 going into the seventh before their big eruption.

Angie Gierhart was the big run producer for Ross, knocking in four runs on two hits. Lori Shoemaker had three RBI and Karen Root had two. Brenda Sleek and Kathy Brandt had two hits apiece.

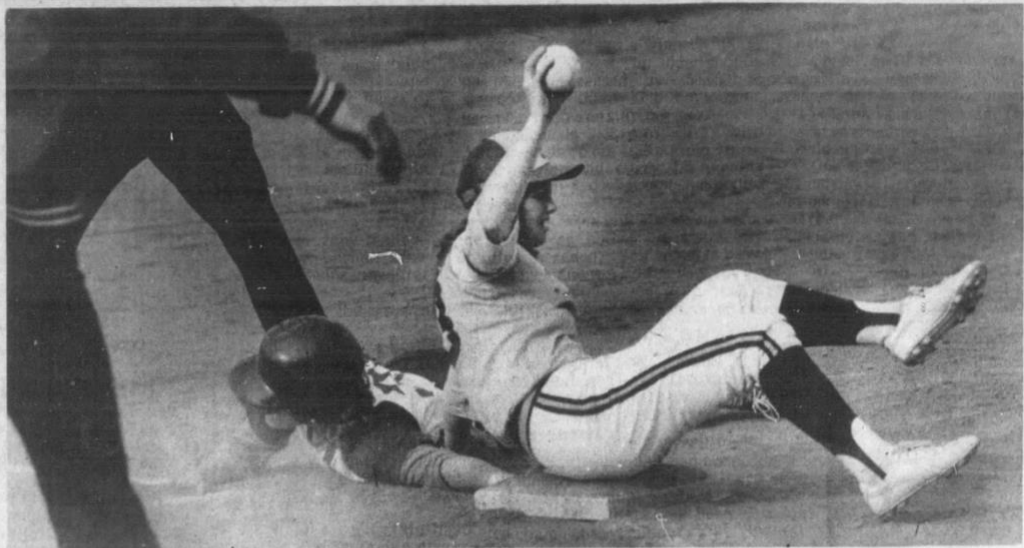

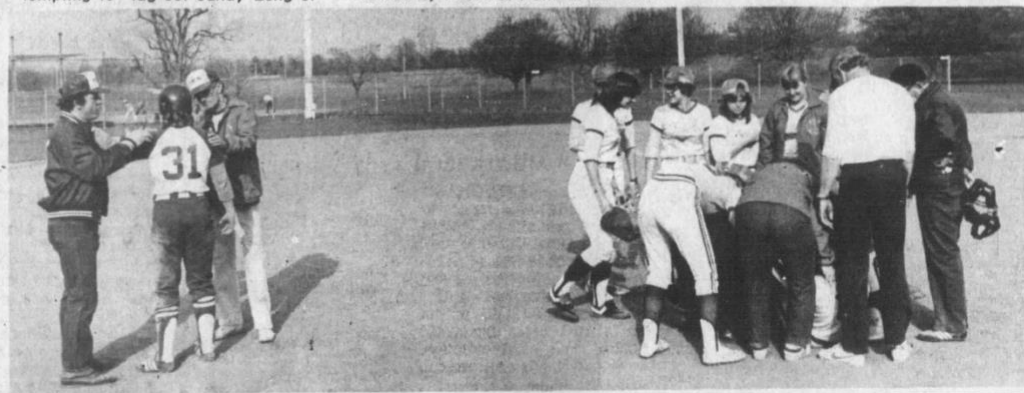
