The Fremont Ross girls (604) won the D-I Northwest Sectional Tournament at Fremont High School on Saturday. The Little Giants were led by the school record setting 200 yard medley relay team of MaKennah Fitzgerald, Alexis Prenzlin, AnneMarie Moses and Olivia DeRodes (1st, 1:48.08), the same team won the 200 yard freestyle relay (1:40.18) and the 400 yard freestyle relay team of Rilee Overmyer, Shelby Level, Ellie Stover and Kaity Kelly (2nd, 3:50.46).

Individual leaders for the Little Giants were DeRodes in the 200 yard freestyle (1st, 2:00.07) and in the 500 yard freestyle (1st, 5:26.14), Prenzlin in the 200 yard IM (1st, 2:10.62) and set a new school record in the 100 yard breaststroke (1st, 1:05.19), Fitzgerald in the 100 yard freestyle (1st, 53.57) and in the 100 yard backstroke (1st, 59.96), Moses in the 100 yard fly (1st, 59.35) and in the 200 yard IM (3rd, 2:13.36), Stover in the 500 yard freestyle (2nd, 5:35.27) and in the 100 yard backstroke (3rd, 1:04.78), Kelly in the 50 yard freestyle (3rd, 25.55) and in the 100 yard freestyle (4th, 56.13), Level in the 100 yard fly (3rd, 1:01.08) and in the 100 yard breaststroke (3rd, 1:10.90), Overmyer in the 50 yard freestyle (4th, 25.83) and in the 100 yard fly (5th, 1:04.90), Victoria Miller in the 100 yard fly (6th, 1:06.68) and in the 200 yard IM (6th, 2:35.23), Hannah Kelly in the 200 yard freestyle (4th, 2:10.22), Sarah Watson in one

meter diving (4th, 221.05), Taylor Weickert in the 100 yard breaststroke (4th, 1:21.32), Natalie Brown in the 200 yard freestyle (5th, 2:21.77), Sophia Biggins in the 500 yard freestyle (5th, 6:04.78) and Berlin Swaisgood (6th, 1:27.64).

Port Clinton (298) won the D-II Northwest Sectional Tournament, led by the 200 yard freestyle relay team of Bryanna Barr, Brittany Diaz, Gabby Sharkey and Lauren Shaw (2nd, 1:46.73) and the 400 yard freestyle relay team of Barr, Diaz, Elena Kessler and Shaw (4th, 3:59.84).

Individual leaders for Port Clinton were Shaw in the 100 yard freestyle (1st, 56.79) and in the 50 yard freestyle (4th, 25.98), Kenzie Pluto in one meter diving (2nd, 390.80), Kessler in the 100 yard freestyle (5th, 59.88) and in the 50 yard freestyle (6th, 27.35), Diaz in the 100 yard freestyle (4th, 59.12), Barr in the 500 yard freestyle (4th, 5:53.79) and Rachel Simpson in the 500 yard freestyle (6th, 5:56.57).

Oak Harbor (291) finished second, led by 200 yard freestyle relay team of Abbie Mizelle, Mikenzie Blunt, Paige Priesman and Taylor Byington (1st, 1:46.12), the 400 yard freestyle relay team of Mizelle, Erin Druyor, Priesman and Byington (2nd, 3:54.72) and the 200 yard medley relay team of Druyor, Priesman, Bailey Blunt and M. Blunt (3rd, 2:00.34).

Individual leaders were Byington in the 200 yard freestyle (2nd, 2:05.12) and in the 500 yard freestyle (2nd, 5:30.27), Mizelle in the 50 yard freestyle (3rd, 25.95) and in the 100 yard freestyle (3rd, 57.32), Priesman in the 200 yard IM (3rd, 2:23.48), Druyor in the 100 yard backstroke (3rd, 1:06.51), M. Blunt in the 50 yard freestyle (5th, 26.92) and B. Blunt in the 100 yard backstroke (5th, 1:09.28).

Other leaders were Beechier in the 500 yard freestyle (7th, 5:58.07) and in the 200 yard freestyle (10th, 2:14.00) and Bias in the 100 yard backstroke (8th, 1:09.65).

St. Joseph Central Catholic (26) finished 13th, led by the 200 yard freestyle relay team of Sophie Militello, Natalie Cook, Kiran Dahnke and Sarah Molyet (11th, 2:08.84) and Militello in the 100 yard backstroke (18th, 1:16.97).

Individual leaders for the Little Giants were Evans in the 100 yard breaststroke (1st, 58.95) and in the 200 yard IM (2nd, 1:59.55), William Taylor in the 200 yard freestyle (3rd, 1:52.69) and in the 100 yard fly (3rd, 55.18), Ethan Taylor in the 500 yard freestyle (2nd, 5:05.18) and in the 200 yard IM (5th, 2:09.31), Mitchell Mullholland (3rd, 5:05.94) and in the 200 yard freestyle (4th, 1:54.74), Fox in the 50 yard freestyle (2nd, 22.56), Weisenauer in the 100 yard fly (2nd, 53.33), Williams in the 100 yard breaststroke (3rd, 1:03.88), Austin Kramer in the 100 yard breaststroke (4th, 1:06.86), Drew Edmonds in the 100 yard breaststroke (5th, 1:08.01), Noah Detrich in the 100 yard backstroke (5th, 1:05.21), Cody Farrier in the 100 yard backstroke (6th, 1:06.62), James Elder in the 500 yard freestyle (5th, 5:26.90), Andy Burroughs in the 500 yard freestyle (6th, 5:52.25), Noah Holtz in the 100 yard freestyle (4th, 54.92), Logan Kropp in the 100 yard freestyle (6th, 56.63) and Dane Michael (274.05), Manuel Gutierrez (264.50) and Brady Oddo (187.90) finished 1st, 2nd and 4th respectively in one meter diving.

Oak Harbor (202) finished fifth, led by the 200 yard medley relay team of Zach Hess, Elijah Dombrowsky, Zach Price and Caleb Heintz (1st, 1:47.30) and Price in the 50 yard freestyle (2nd, 23.12) and in the 100 yard freestyle (3rd, 52.36), Lucas Greggila in the 100 yard backstroke (5th, 1:04.50) and Thomas Chovanec in the 100 yard backstroke (6th, 1:05.12).

Margaretta (198) took sixth, led by the 200 yard medley relay team of Alex Richter, Josh Stanley, Jake Kromer and Donovan Draper (6th, 1:51.42), the 200 yard freestyle relay team of Bobby Hush, Spencer Flick, Noah Esposito and Draper (6th, 1:41.49) and the 400 yard freestyle relay team of Hush, Kromer, Stanley and Draper (6th, 3:46.20).

Individual leaders were Hush in the 200 yard IM (3rd, 2:14.59) and in the 500 yard freestyle (6th, 5:28.74), Kromer in the 200 yard IM (4th, 2:15.50) and in the 100 yard fly (6th, 1:00.48), Stanley in the 100 yard breaststroke (4th, 1:08.19) and Draper in the 50 yard freestyle (5th, 24.62).

Individual leaders were Barr in the 100 yard fly (1st, 55.46) and in the 200 yard IM (1st, 2:06.00), Kessler in the 100 yard freestyle (1st, 49.44) and in the 50 yard freestyle (1st, 21.85) and Thomas Keville in one meter diving (2nd, 289.70).
