



Fremont Ross Tennis Sends Three District Qualifiers Forward After Strong Sectional Performance

The Fremont Ross tennis team continued its postseason run earlier this week with a strong showing at sectional competition, highlighted by three Little Giants earning spots in the district tournament.

Leading the way in singles play was Charlie Kramer, who punched his ticket to districts with an impressive straight-set victory over Brady Mullins of Sandusky High School, winning 6-2, 6-1 in his qualifying match.

After securing his district berth, Kramer competed for sectional seeding and ultimately finished fourth. He battled against tough competition, falling to players from Norwalk High School and Sandusky High School in the placement rounds. Despite the losses, Kramer's strong play throughout the tournament earned him an important district qualification and extended his postseason.

In doubles competition, the Fremont Ross duo of Jackson Swinehart and Brandon Fry also secured their spot in districts with a dominant performance. The pair defeated Song/Cyders of Ashland High School in convincing fashion, winning 6-1, 6-2 to advance.

Following their qualifying victory, Swinehart and Fry moved into the sectional seeding rounds, where they fell to Ashland's Koleno/White pairing. The Little Giants duo will now have one more match before districts, as they are scheduled to face Norwalk High School on Saturday at 9 a.m. at the

Fremont courts with third place on the line heading into district competition.

Extending the season is never easy, especially during tournament play where every match carries added pressure. Charlie, Jackson, and Brandon rose to the challenge and earned the opportunity to continue representing Fremont Ross deeper into the postseason.

The Little Giants coaching staff expressed pride in all three athletes for their performances and the way they competed throughout sectionals.
