# Ross girls douse Columbian, 71-23; boys team topped

The Fremont Ross girls swim team posted a lopsided 71-23 victory while the boys lost by a single point, 46-45, during a dual meet against Tiffin Columbian on Wednesday night in the first meet of the season.

The Lady Giants took first and second places in seven of their 11 events.

The 200-yard medley relay of seniors Brittany O'Connor, Wendy Farrell, Jenny Fate and freshman Megan Wasserman took first with second going to teammates Emily Zamora, Emily Grayson, Stephanie Mullins and Heather Williams.

Mullins, Zamora, Grayson and Amy Jo Sweeney took first in the 200 freestyle relay, winning by eight seconds over second-place teammates Laura McAllister, Courtney Paxson, Melissa McDonald and Chelsea Earhart. Wasserman, Williams, O'Connor and Farrell also won the 400 free relay.

Senior Lady Giants led the way in individual events with victories by O'Connor, the team captain, in the 500 freestyle and 100 backstroke, a pair of firsts by Fate in the 200 freestyle and 100 butterfly and a first in the 100 breaststroke and second in the 200 individual medley by Farrell.

Big contributions from the freshman class added to the point spread. Wasserman took the 200 individual medley and the 100 freestyle, the latter with a personal best time of 58.91 seconds. Williams and Paxson fin-

ished first and third, respectively, in the 50 freestyle.

Second-place finishes were posted by Williams in the 100 freestyle, Mullins in the 100 butterfly and Grayson in the 100 breaststroke.

"Fortunately, the girls team has the depth to enter double relays and two girls in every event," said head coach Phil Moran, who enters his ninth season. "We have a lot of experience on the girls side in three seniors who are all lifetime swimmers, all with big competition experience. Coupled with some returning underclassmen and a few strong freshman swimmers, it looks to be a good year for the girls."

Unfortunately, the same can't be said on the boys side. With only 12 swimmers, and one of those injured, Ross posted a single four-man team in only the 200 medley and 200 freestyle relays. Fremont could only field a single swimmer in the 200 individual medley and 100 backstroke.

"This is the smallest Ross team in nine years," Moran said. "Last year, just about

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every meet was a blowout because of our size. This year, every meet will be a dogfight."

Senior co-captains Noah Grayson and Elliot Hogan took three firsts between them, Grayson in the 200 medley and Hogan in both the 50 freestyle and 100 breaststroke. Senior Brandon Spicer posted a pair of seconds in the 100 butterfly and 100 backstroke, with Grayson taking third in the backstroke. Sophomore Jake Ickes finished first in the 500 freestyle and second in the 200 freestyle.

Junior Greg VanDyne finished second in the 100 freestyle and third in the 100 breaststroke.

Ickes, Grayson, VanDyne and Hogan took a first in the 400 free relay, with third going to new teammates Matt Bachelder, Spencer Schabel, Derek Hill and Kevin Held. Spicer, Hogan, Grayson and Ickes were second in the medley relay. Spicer, VanDyne, Held and Hill were second in the 200 freestyle relay.

The team swims again on Saturday at the NWOAC Relay Invitational in Port Clinton. Diving starts at 9 a.m., with swimming kicking off at noon.

# Numbers low, expectations still high for Ross

## O'Connor shooting for third straight berth in state meet

There are two ways to look at the Fremont Ross 2002-03 girls swim season.

Is the glass half full or half empty?

"The girls team graduated 13 seniors last year, counting the four exchange students," head coach Phil Moran said, "and it was by far the most successful girls team we've had at Ross in at least 10 years."

"The 2002-2003 team will probably be the smallest girls squad in school history. The girls face a huge depth problem, meaning we just won't have the numbers to field double relays, and that's what it takes to win."

That's not to say the team lacks experience. All three senior swimmers — captain Brittany O'Connor, Wendy Farrell and Jenny Fate — are all what's known as "lifers," meaning they have been swimming as far back as they can remember. "You can bet they haven't put that many years into this sport to not want to go out on top," Moran said. "Farrell's healthy and practicing hard. Jenny Fate battled through a lot of shoulder problems last season and really hopes to put all that behind her. They both want big seasons more than anything and deserve it."

"So I'd say this year, our focus is on rebuilding and the end of the season. In swimming, your win-loss record doesn't mean much. Pushing a lot of swimmers through sectionals to districts is what it's all about. Getting a few to states is always our end goal."

O'Connor knows what the top feels like, having qualified to state last season in two individual and two relay events. She won All-Ohio and All-Northwest District honors and set one school record and three pool records last season. Despite knee surgery in the offseason, O'Connor expects to be in the hunt again this year.

She'll have help from another returning state relay swimmer, Jaymee Glaspy, who according to Moran looks stronger in the water than he has ever seen her. The team also picked up junior Stephanie Mullins, who swam for years at the YMCA and on the junior high team.

"This is Steph's first year on the high school team, but she brings experience we can use," Moran said. The returning underclassmen, according to Moran, show a lot of promise and commitment.

"We have some young, dedicated underclassmen who have worked extremely hard and come a long way," he said. "Emily Grayson, Chelsea Earhart, Laura McAlister, Amy Jo Sweeney, Emily Zamora, Melissa McDonald ... they get faster every week."

Moran said he moved a few freshmen up, including Megan Wasserman and Heather Williams, who also show a lot of potential.

"The only time a swimmer goes slower is if they have a serious injury. We've had girls fight through all kinds of adversity over the past few years. They're stronger, physically and mentally, for it. It's one of those irreplaceable life lessons that comes with making a commitment to any sport."

## Ross Diving

For the Ross dive program, the glass is neither half full or half empty. It's completely empty.

"As of today, the girls will be competing without any divers and the boys only have one because we have no place to practice," Moran said. "Our boards were shut down back in the 80s, because the pool's not deep enough and the ceiling's too low."

"We've always been able to arrange to get dive time at either Margaretta, Port Clinton or Oak Harbor. Matter of fact, we've provided boards for the first two over the years and shared our coach with Oak Harbor last year. This year, we started at Oak Harbor with five divers, but Oak Harbor decided they didn't have time for us. We double-backed everywhere, but no luck. So as of now our divers have nowhere to practice. Without divers, we give up valuable points, and in tight meets, like Napoleon and Sylvania, that will cost us."

The loss of diving is especially disheartening for Fremont Ross, which is celebrating 70 years of swimming this season and has a long history of state championships in diving.

Sophomore boys diver Zach

Ramey is practicing with the Bowling Green Dive Club and may be the only diver Ross has.

## Ross Boys

With just 14 swimmers, the Ross boys swim team will still be one of the six biggest and best teams in northwest Ohio. It's also close to the smallest Ross boys team ever.

That doesn't mean, however, that coach Moran doesn't look forward to a lot of success with this team. Of the 14 swimmers, seven are returning lettermen, most of them "lifers."

"We're fortunate to have a group of very experienced, very committed upperclassmen this year who are very focused on the end of the season," Moran said.

Those upperclassmen include senior co-captains Noah Grayson and Elliot Hogan and three-year letterman Brandon Spicer. Hogan, who made all-district last season in the 100-yard breaststroke, and Spicer are both "lifers," and Grayson is "one of those junior high kids who really caught on fast," Moran said.

Juniors Alan Gamble, Nate Schrickel and Greg VanDyne and sophomore Jake Ickes are also "lif-ers."

# Ross boys go 4-for-4 at NWOAC

PORT CLINTON — Sometimes things aren't always as they appear.

Such is the case with the Fremont Ross boys' swim results from the Northwest Ohio Aquatic Conference Relays on Saturday at Port Clinton High School.

The results indicate the Little Giants finished fourth out of eight teams with 56 points. In fact, the boys team won every event it swam.

Fremont fielded five swimmers who competed in four of the 10 events. Meet rules only allow each swimmer to enter three events.

"The boys had an outstanding day," Ross head coach Phil Moran said. "They turned in some really decent times for this early in the season. Oak Harbor beat us by just two points, and they were entered in all 10 events."

Toledo St. John's won the boys meet with 82 points from 10 events, Sandusky Perkins took second with 76 points and Port Clinton finished fifth with 50 points.

Ross's Brandon Spicer, Elliot Hogan, Jake Ickes and Greg VanDyne led off with a half-second win over St. John's in the 400-yard medley relay.

Noah Grayson, Hogan and Spicer teamed up in the 3-by-100 individual medley to beat Sandusky Perkins with a time of 3 minutes, 13:56 seconds to the Pirates' 3:14:39.

Ickes, Grayson, Spicer and VanDyne pulled off another win in the next event, the 200 freestyle relay, beating second-place Port Clinton by two seconds and third-place Oak Harbor by six.

At the break, Fremont had the lead over Sandusky Perkins by 12 points. Fremont added another win and 14 points late in the meet, with a 22-second cushion in the 300 breaststroke relay, finishing at 3:27:49 to the St. John's time of 3:49:11.

"We've been putting in a lot of yards at practice, but got two days rest with the Thanksgiving break," team co-captain Elliot Hogan said. "We swam four and won four, so there's not much to complain about."

Oak Harbor divers Jim Kuli and Andrew Vranish finished first, with Port Clinton second, gaining the teams 14 and 10 points, respectively. Oak Harbor took a pair of thirds in the 800 free and 200 free.

### Ross girls take fifth

Notre Dame Academy edged out Sandusky Perkins, 106-100, to win the girls side of the NWOAC Relays. Port Clinton came in third, Sylvania Northview fourth and the Ross Lady Giants fifth.

Brittany O'Connor, Wendy Farrell, Jenny Fate and Megan Wasserman kicked off the meet with a third in the 400 medley relay and followed it up with a fourth in the next event, the 800 freestyle relay. Brittany O'Connor swam solo in the 500 freestyle, finishing third at 5:38:17. The girls had entries in seven of the 10 events.

Notre Dame finished the day with four first-place and three second-place finishes on 10 entries. Perkins finished up with three first and five second places.

Ross swims again Dec. 10 at Port Clinton with Oak Harbor in a double-dual meet.

# Giants sweep PC, OH

## Ross boys win; Lady Giants split

PORT CLINTON — It all came down to the last event for the Fremont Ross boys swim team in a double-dual victory Tuesday over Oak Harbor and Port Clinton.

Jake Ickes, Alan Gamble, Greg VanDyne and Elliot Hogan took first in the 400-yard freestyle relay, finishing almost 40 seconds ahead of Oak Harbor.

Team-mates Nathan Bowen, Derek Hill, Kevin Held and Matt Bachelder finished third, sealing the 139-130 victory over Port Clinton. Ross downed Oak Harbor 151-126. Port Clinton beat Oak Harbor by just two, 138-136.

# O'Connor, Hogan advance to finals at Ned Reeb Invite

COLUMBUS — Every year, the times get faster, and the competition gets tougher at the Ned Reeb Invitational, according to Fremont Ross swim coach Phil Moran.

This year was no different.

"Last year, Brittany O'Connor took fourth in the 100-yard backstroke with a time of one minute, 4.49 seconds. This year she swam faster, a 1:03:16, and finished ninth," Moran said.

Eleven Ross swimmers qualified to swim at the Ned Reeb this year. All swimmers must meet qualifying times. This year's field included 619 of the state's top swimmers from 52 schools. The top 12 swimmers in each event advanced from the morning preliminaries to the evening finals.

"Some of our kids swam season-best times on Saturday, and I'm real happy with the time drops" Moran said. "We're into long, hard yardage in practice right now, so they go into the Ned Reeb pretty tired. Some of them died a little at the end, but overall they turned in some pretty decent times, especially on the relays."

Senior co-captain Noah Grayson shaved two seconds off his season-best 200 individual medley time, dropping from 2:23.50 to 2:21.43.

The girls 200 medley relay team that included O'Connor, Wendy Farrell, Jenny Fate and Emily Grayson, dropped from 2:07.61 to 2:04.68 and finished 12th against 36 teams. Jaymelee Glaspy, Fate, Grayson and Farrell dropped four seconds off their season-best 200 freestyle relay time, from 1:56.00 to 1:52.01.

The men's 500 freestyle record of 4:45.92 was also broken by a Cleveland swimmer, Omar El Gammal from Orange High School, who swam it in 4:43.77. Records also were set in the men's 50 freestyle and women's 200 freestyle.

The teams from Upper Arlington and Akron Firestone went 1-2 in both the girls and boys divisions. The Findlay girls finished 14th overall. The Ross girls were 16th, the boys 21st.

TOLEDO — The Fremont Ross boys and girls swim teams impressed one of their coaches on the way to a pair of third-place finishes Saturday at the Knight Invitational.

"Finals tonight was as hard as I've ever seen a Fremont Ross swim team work and as fast as I've seen them go in my nine years of watching Fremont Ross High School swimming," training coach John O'Connor said.

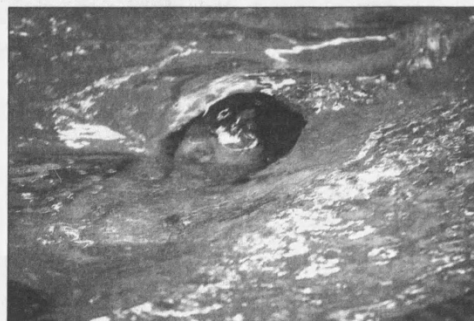
"After losing to Northview on Friday, it felt really good to come back and beat them at the Knight," Ross co-captain Noah Grayson said.

Each swimmer is allowed to compete in four events.

Fate was second in the 200 individual medley and the 100 butterfly, with a season best time of 1:09.59 in the latter. Individual wins kept the Little Giants' boys team in the hunt. Elliot Hogan swam a career-best 5:27.73 for first in the 500 freestyle and won the 100 breaststroke by nine seconds with a 1:07.51. Jake Ickes added another pair of firsts with wins in both the 100 and 200 freestyles.

Greg VanDyne finished second in the 50 and 100 freestyles with a season-best 55.65 in the latter. Grayson was touched out in the 100 butterfly by Colonel Crawford's Jacob Biederman, 1:05.57-1:05.71.

# Lexington, bigger pool sink Ross

**MANSFIELD**—Competing against a bigger team in a six-lane pool has been a problem for the Fremont Ross swim team all year long. In a six lane pool, the first five places score, and with the smallest team in several years, the Little Giants didn't have the depth, experience or divers they needed to beat Lexington High School in Mansfield on Saturday. The girls team fell 103-73, and the boys lost 97-77.

That said, the Little Giant girls 200-yard medley relay team, including Brittany O'Connor, Wendy Farrell, Megan Wasserman and Jaymelee Glaspy, continued to douse the competition with another first-place finish, at one minute 59.56 seconds, two-tenths of a second faster than the pool record time they set last Saturday against Colonel Crawford.

O'Connor, Glaspy, Wasserman and Jenny Fate also won the 400 free relay, at 3:59.93, just a half-second slower than their season-best time.

"To say they put in a hard week of training going into this meet is something of an understatement," head coach Phil Moran said. "We put just about 10 miles on them on Tuesday alone, so for them to have a time drop after a week like this is something of a surprise."

The team puts in two back-to-back practices each day throughout the holiday break, from 6-7:30 a.m. and 9:30 a.m. to noon, getting ready for sectionals and districts in early February.

The girls scored three individual first-place finishes; O'Connor in the 200 free, Wasserman in the 100 butterfly, and Farrell in the 100 breaststroke. O'Connor was second in the 50 free, Wasserman second in the 200 individual medley, dropping over a second for a season best time of 2:24.90, and Emily Grayson was second in the 100 free. Glaspy had a pair of thirds in the 50 and 200 frees, Fate the same in the 200 individual medley and 100 butterfly, and Stephanie Mullins was third in the 100 back.

The boys team took five first place finishes, including one in the 200 free relay, with Elliot Hogan, Jake Ickes, Greg VanDyne and Alan Gamble clocking a 1:41.95. Adding those eight points to the two won by the third-place "B" relay of Matt Bachelder, Spencer Schabel, Derek Hill and Kevin Held, gave the Ross boys their best relay finish of the day.

Ickes and Hogan found themselves in a horse race with the Lexington swimmer for a photo finish in the 200 free. Without electronic touch pads, there would have been no way of knowing that Ickes finished first with a 2:00.68, the Lexington swimmer second at 2:00.81, and Hogan third at 2:00.95. Ickes also finished second in the 100 free, and Hogan first in the 100 breaststroke.

Noah Grayson added another first in the 200 individual medley and second in the 500 free, with Brandon Spicer first in the 100 butterfly and second in the 100 back. VanDyne was second in the 50 free.

"We're continuing to see real improvement in the underclassmen," said Moran. "Derek Hill dropped time in both his events, almost six seconds in his 100 back. Courtney Paxson knocked just over 15 seconds off her 500 free, and Emily Zamora dropped nearly four in the 100 IM."

The Little Giants swim again at 5 p.m. Tuesday at Sandusky.

Along the way, Brittany O'Connor broke two of her own pool records, winning both the 500-yard freestyle in five minutes 29.32 seconds, and the 100 backstroke at 1:02.41. She set the old 500 record of 5:30.61 in January of last year, and the 100 backstroke record of 1:03.15 just this past December.

Wendy Farrell and Emily Grayson both swam their best 100 breaststrokes of the year to take first and third in that event, respectively. Jenny Fate dropped more than two seconds for a season-best time of 2:29.72 to win the 200 individual medley. Megan Wasserman took a pair of firsts, one in the 200 freestyle and the other with a season-best time of 1:06.73 in the 100 butterfly. Jaymelee Glaspy grabbed a pair of seconds in the 50 and 100 freestyle.

Courtney Paxson and Melissa McDonald also swam season-best times in their events.

Emily Zamora, Grayson, Fate and Farrell were second in the 200 freestyle relay, with Zamora, Grayson, Stephanie Mullins and Chelsea Earhart taking third in the 200 medley.

The Ross boys matched the girls with eight season-best times of their own. Elliot Hogan

dropped more than three seconds to win the 200 individual medley in 2:15.66, with third going to teammate Alan Gamble, who dropped a second for a season-best 2:34.78. Hogan also won the 100 breaststroke, and Gamble was third in the 100 butterfly.

Jake Ickes took both the 50 and 500 freestyles. Noah Grayson dropped more than a second for a season-best of 2:04.47 to win the 200 free, and was second behind Ickes in the 500. Brandon Spicer's 1:04.19 in the 100 butterfly was a season best and good for the win.

"Winning all three relays sure helped our cause," Spicer said. ## O'Connor, Hogan qualify at Silverlake

FLORENCE, Ky. — Fremont Ross swimmers Brit O'Connor and Elliot Hogan qualified to swim in the USA Swimming Sectional Championships with their performances this past weekend at the Ohio Short Course Senior Championship Meet.

As for Wasserman and Ickes, this was a look at really big times and really big numbers. There were 147 entries in the girls 100 free. Plus Silverlake is an open event, meaning

anyone over the age of 15 can compete. There aren't a whole lot of college-age women at the event, but there are a lot of college and post-college guys, which takes the competition to a whole other level."

Unlike high school swimming, which only allows a swimmer to enter two individual events, USA Swimming allows swimmers to compete in as many events as they want.

O'Connor, who finished fourth at the state meet in the 100 backstroke, was fourth again at Senior Meet for Fremont's top finish. She was 11th by place in the 500 freestyle, finishing in five minutes, 21.33 seconds.

"At Senior meet, you're not so much interested in your place as you are your times," O'Connor said. "My season best was a 5:28.50, and I swam a 5:25.18 in the morning prelims, which put me in the consolation heat. Just like state meet, you can't move up out of your heat in finals. But based on final times, I was eighth overall."

O'Connor was 17th in the 50 freestyle, 18th in both the 100 freestyle and 200 freestyle and 24th in the 100 butterfly.

Hogan, who finished 16th at state in the 100 breaststroke, finished 11th at Silverlake for the boys top finish.

"I was totally out of sync during the prelims and swam a 1:03 high," Hogan said. "It felt like I should have been going up when I was going down. I worked it out in the lap pool between prelims and finals and managed a 1:02 low at finals. Like Brit, I couldn't move up, but by time, I was 10th overall. Now we both have to hope we can hold our tapers for another two weeks until sectionals."

Hogan was also 18th in the 50 freestyle in a field of 85 and 44th in the backstroke.

"I never swim the back, but what the heck. I was there, I could enter, so I did," Hogan said. "Doubt if I'll ever do it again."

Ickes was 27th in both the 200 individual medley and the 100 freestyle against 123 other entries and 39th in the 200 freestyle out of 99 entries.

"My personal best in the IM was a 2:18.79. I swam a 2:11.42 in prelims and a 2:12.77 at finals. I don't swim the IM very often, so it's nice to know I've done some improving there."

Said Moran, "For a freshman like Wasserman, Silverlake was a baptism by fire. She's never competed in a prelim-finals event before, and then of all things she decided to swim the 200 butterfly and 200 IM back to back. She made finals in the fly with a 2:29.15, so had to swim it twice in the same day."

Wasserman finished 30th in the event with a 35th in the IM.

She was 77th out of 147 in the 100 freestyle at 59.61 seconds and 70th out of 133 in the 200 freestyle.

"I've never swam against that many people in my life," Wasserman said. "There were 16 heats in the 100 free. Eleven girls had sectional times, and I just know some of them will make Nationals. Silverlake was awesome."

O'Connor has left her name all over the record board. She owns the 50, 100 and 500 freestyle and the 100 backstroke pool records, the school record in the 100 backstroke and was also part of last year's record 400 freestyle relay team.

Elliot Hogan set a breaststroke record of 1:00.62 at the district meet.

"All day Saturday at districts, the kids were pretty quiet. I think they were afraid they'd jinx him, and his is one of the last events to swim," Moran said. "So Elliot's in the last, fastest heat, but some kid in the second heat goes a 1:01. Hogan's seed time was a 1:05. I saw him look up at the board and look away real fast. I thought 'Oh, no. Don't panic.'"

"He was seeded third, and for the first 50, he and two other guys were head to head. Then he just exploded off the wall on his second

turn, pulled ahead and did a 15 (seconds) on that third lap. I actually started whooping, because I knew he'd bring the last 50 in under 34 seconds, and that would get him there. Everyone from Fremont was so focused on that race, they went nuts when he won it. I don't think it's a moment any of us will ever forget."

Hogan and O'Connor each received all-district and all-state honors, O'Connor in the 100 freestyle and the 100 backstroke and Hogan in the 100 breaststroke. They also received the team high-point trophies, O'Connor with 456 points earned throughout the season and Hogan with 386.

The award for most improved boy swimmer went to freshman Matt Bachelder. The Coach's Award for Outstanding Effort went to freshman Megan Wasserman and sophomore Jake Ickes. Both finished second in the team-point standings, Wasserman with 348.75 for the girls

and Ickes with 353.75 for the boys.

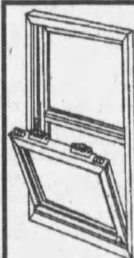
