# Kirwen, Eli win at invite

Genoa's Simone Eli is starting off this year's cross country season strong.

The sophomore finished in first place on Saturday for girls divisions 2-3 at the Norm Bray Cross Country Invitational at Walsh Park in Fremont. She also set a new personal record, finishing the 5k run with a time of 20:14.80.

"It feels awesome. It was one of my goals, but I just did it," said Eli of bettering her record, "so I'm just going to keep trying to break it and break it."

By shaving five seconds off of her previous personal best time, Eli also nabbed the record for Genoa High School. She missed a trip to state last year by nineteen seconds, but thinks this will be her year to make it.

"I just went out there fast and kept up with that," said Eli of what led to her win. "There's no pain. You can't have any pain."

Gibsonburg's Jordan Kirwen finished first out of a whopping 95 runners for boys divisions 2-3. The junior, who finished third in the SLL last year, boasted a time of 17:05.30 and led his team to a third place finish.

Old Fort was fifth, Clyde was sixth, Saint Joseph Central Catholic was seventh, Genoa was eighth, Oak Harbor was ninth, and Lakota was tenth.

Fremont Ross competed in the division 1 races, with the girls team finishing sixth and the boys finishing seventh.

"I was more confident that our team would do well," said senior Josh Bowen. "I think we'll probably be pretty good and have a good shot at winning the league this year."

Ashley Fischer led the girls team with a time of 20:08.13, good for third place, and teammate Jessica Soule was 17th. Senior Andre Velez came in eighth for the boys, and Bowen was 15th.

## Lakota, Gibsonburg girls in top 10 at Carnival

Ross's Ashley Fischer finishes eighth overall in Division I

TIFFIN — Saturday's Tiffin Carnival meet at Hedges Boyer Park gave cross country fans across the state plenty to get excited about.

Featuring more than 150 teams and 6,500 racers, the Tiffin Carnival is known as one of the country's largest high school races with some of the best talent in the state being exhibited.

Much of that talent came

from the area Saturday as several teams finished with high rankings while several individuals brought home some hardware.

In the Division III girls' race, Lakota and Gibsonburg both finished in the top 10, each with several runners finishing in the top 100 of their race.

The Raiders, who took 5th, were led by Carly Reese's 19th place finish in 20:03. Also leading the pack for Lakota were Julia Windom (20:12, 23rd place), Ashley Brockschmidt (20:40, 43rd place) and Sarah Girard (21:03, 56th).

"The Tiffin Carnival is always a huge event," said Lakota coach Don Windom. "We just had really solid

racers.

"One of our biggest surprises was Ashley Brockschmidt. When she was a sophomore she was all-Ohio and finished 23rd in the state. Then, she lost her entire season last year. It has been kind of a slow go for her but she stuck her nose in the race and made a huge, huge breakthrough for us."

Leading the way for Gibsonburg, ranked ninth in Division III by The Associated Press, was Ashley Fisher, who took 15th place in 19:49. The Golden Bears finished 10th overall.

"She ran a great race," said Gibsonburg coach Beth Kohler. "She been struggling with running a

In the Division I race, Fremont Ross senior Ashley Fischer brought home an 8th place finish with a time of 19:21.

Little Giant coach Cathy Esposito complimented Fischer's run.

"She had an awesome finish," said Esposito. "It was pretty phenomenal. Before the race I told her to go for the win."

The Little Giants finished 33rd of 35 teams in the race.

Other area girls team finishers were Clyde's 31st place finish in the division II A-race and Bellevue's

Fremont Ross finished 31st in division I with Andre Velez taking home the top Little Giant finish with a time of 17:12.

# Fischer finishes third for Ross

St. John's Jesuit, led by individual champion Matt Lemon (15:47.40), won the meet with just 46 points.

Michael Flores led Ross with a 28th-place finish in 17:28. It marked Flores' best time of the season. Little Giants Andre Velez (17:38) and Josh Bowen (17:45.9) finished 35th and 40th respectively.

In the Division II-III race, Clyde finished seventh with 187 points. Margaretta finished 11th at 376, Woodmore 12th at 383 and Oak Harbor 21st with 500.

Toledo Christian had 91 points and won the meet, just ahead of Eastwood (92) and Delta (93).

Craig Gerber's 11th-place finish in 17:32 paced Clyde while teammate Jeff Whitt finished 19th in 17:48.10.

Siesel Deven of Margaretta finished fifth in 16:50.40 while Oak Harbor's top runner was Ray Hurlburt (18:56.40) who finished 59th overall in 18:56.40.

In the Division I girls race, Ross finished in 16th place with 381 points.

Bowling Green had just 34 points and breezed to the team title.

# Gibsonburg's Kirwen, Ross' Fischer have history-making years

Senior Ashley Fischer became the first cross country regional champion in Fremont Ross's history.

Gibsonburg's Jordan Kirwen toppled a 23-year-old school record.

And that's why Fischer, a senior, and Kirwen, a junior, are The News-Messenger's cross country athletes of the year.

Fischer, a senior, because the Little Giant's first female runner to win a regional meet as she outlasted Bowling Green's Christy Titus in the Division I regional in Tiffin with a time of 20:11.20 in a rather soggy race.

"Winning the regional meet had to be one of the greatest moments in her life," said Fremont coach

Cathy Esposito. "It was for me to witness."

But Fischer's exciting journey didn't end at regionals as she faced the daunting task of competing in the state finals a week later.

Fischer had three goals for her final meet, all which were rather lofty, Esposito said.

"She wanted to go under 19 minutes," Esposito said. "She wanted to get on the podium (top 15) and be named all-Ohio."

"She accomplished two. What a great season as a senior."

Fischer just finished under the 19-minute mark as she earned 17th place in a time of 18:57. The finish also named her to the all-Ohio team as the top 25 are considered.

And Fischer concluded her high school career last Saturday as she was chosen to compete in the Mid East Cross Country Meet, a meet that only an elite group of runners are chosen for each year held in Dayton.

Fischer finished 24th out of 60 runners with a time of 19:52.

Setting a new school record for Gibsonburg was junior runner Jordan Kirwen.

Kirwen, who was also named to this year's all-Ohio team, earned a third-place finish at districts,

seventh place at regionals and 21st at state.

But the one finish Kirwen will leave on the Golden Bear record books is his first place run at the Maumee Valley Invitational in which he finished in 16:17, 10 seconds faster than the previous school record held by Dale Rosenberger set in 1983.

"I'm happy with getting down to the 16 and 17 minute marks and getting the school record," said Kirwen.

"That was my goal at the beginning of the season."

Kirwen's coach, Beth Kohler said setting the mark on the Maumee Valley course was even more impressive.

"It was quite an accomplishment," Kohler said. "That's kind of a hilly course. You either set your-

self up to do really well, or you succumb to settle at a slower pace."

Kirwen said hard work con-

tributed to his success this season and said he was thankful for staying healthy during the season.

"I tried to get a lot of miles in and keep working and getting faster stuff in," said Kirwen of his summer training. "I was also pretty lucky that I haven't had any real injuries or anything."

Kirwen's training may be part of the reason he was so prepared as Kohler said Kirwen prepares hard in

the off season.

"He was putting in the right kind of base and mileage all summer long," said Kohler.

Kirwen, who participates in basketball and track as well, has also proved himself in the classroom, an accomplishment praised by Kohler.

"He is a great athlete," Kohler said. "He is also a great student."

"He had a 3.9 GPA and was named academic all-Ohio. He's probably one of the most focused runners I've ever coached. He's always willing to take chances and make it pay off."

And those chances did pay off as Kirwen now holds an outstanding Golden Bear record.
