160 Basketball Teams In Delaware Tournament

Delaware, O., Feb. 23.—Friday, Feb. 25, the 13th annual Ohio high basketball tournament takes place at Delaware, in the Wesleyan gymnasium. This is the largest tournament of its kind in the country and this year finds 160 teams enrolled.

Seventy-two schools are enrolled in the northern division and 88 teams in the southern division. The northern division begins play here Feb. 25 and 26, while those in the southern division play March 4 and 5.

Drawings for the northern division games takes place Feb. 24. Arrangements have already been made by the university to take care of the usual large crowds at these affairs.
