Four Lettermen to Lead Ross Tennis Team Challenge

FOUR LETTERMEN RETURN

Ross Netters Open Today

A nucleus of four lettermen gives promise of an improved tennis season this Spring at Ross high school. Missing is District single champion and half the number one doubles team—Gary Driftmyer. Also gone is the veteran Ross tennis coach Pete Michaels.

Charged with building the Ross net fortunes is George Morris. Morris will build around the four senior lettermen. The Coach in addition has three others who figure to form the varsity. Six of these top seven tennis players are seniors.

Driftmyer last year was number one singles player and

paired with Jon Zink as the top Ross doubles team. Driftmyer was the bright spot in a 2-12 season when he won the district singles title.

Zink and Fred Flowers are both two-year lettermen and with the Brindley brothers, Bob and Ray, put lettermen in the first four singles positions. Morris has designated Flowers as number one singles player in today's opening match at Sandusky. Zink will play number two in singles and pair with Flowers as the top doubles team. Bob and Ray Brindley, who will team as the second doubles team, will play number

three and four singles respectively. The Brindleys each won their first letter a year ago.

Playing the fifth singles spot in the Sandusky match will be Tom Kokai, the lone junior in the top seven players. Throughout the season Kokai will be pushed hard for a singles spot by seniors Kurt Goszyk and Don Parman.

The four lettermen comprise four of the top six players a year ago. Missing in addition to Gary Driftmyer is exchange student from Germany, Roland Kink. Kink filled in both as a singles and doubles player during the last season.
