Ross high school opens its dual track meet season tomorrow at Port Clinton with the first event to start at 4 p. m.

The Little Giants' baseball squad also gets started Tuesday as does St. Joseph's, the two local diamond squads meeting at 4 p. m. at Anderson Field. St. Joe's will be the home team.

First Ross tennis match is scheduled this afternoon at Roger Young park where the Little Giants battle Bellevue. Ottawa Parochial netters are here Wednesday.

In Sandusky county baseball, Jackson is at Woodville and York at Green Springs Tuesday.

Ross high held an inter-class track meet Saturday on a cold and wet track with the Juniors scoring 55 points, the combined Senior-Freshman unit totaling 41 and the Sophomores 21.

First place winners were Bob Jahns (J) in the 120-yd. high hurdles; Walter Hurse (S-F) in the 100-yd. dash; B. B. Schneider (S-F), shot put; Skip Baker (So.) pole vault; Duane Hack (J), mile; Bob Messler (S-F), high jump; Schneider, discus; S-F relay team (Messler, Hurse, Schneider and Steve Rupp); Gene Albert (J), 440-yd. run; Jahns, low hurdles; Hack, 880-yd. run; Hurse, 220-yd. dash; and Messler, broad jump.

### Giants, St. Joe Rained Out Of Baseball Game

The Ross high track team was walloped by Port Clinton there 107½ to 10 2-3 yesterday while the Little Giants' scheduled baseball game with St. Joseph and tennis match with Ottawa Hills were cancelled due to the weather.

Ross and St. Joe may play their baseball game today if weather permits.

Only point winners for Ross in the dual meet with Port Clinton were Duane Hack, second in the mile; Bob Mesler, tied for second in the high jump; Russell Ottney, third in the high hurdles; Walter Hurse, third in the 100; B.B. Schneider, third in the shot put; and Ron Shawl, Larry Chapin and Skip Baker, tied for third in the pole vault.

Tony Valinotti and Gary Nossaman scored 13 points each for Port Clinton. Valinotti broke his own record of last year in the shot put with a 51 foot, 6 inch toss.

# Ross Places 2nd In Track Meet Won By Marion

Ross high finished second in a triangular track meet at Findlay yesterday, Marion winning the meet easily and host Findlay coming in third.

Marion scored 106 points, Ross 26 2-3 and Findlay 15 1-3.

The winning Marion thinlies won first places in all events with Pickens running the 100-yard dash in 10.4, Shingler jumping 20 feet, 2 inches in the broad jump and Hochstetter recording 11 feet, 6 inches in the pole vault for some outstanding marks.

Ross finished second in the 880 relay in 1:39. Marion was first in the good time of 1:36.1. Running for Ross were Walter Hurse, B. B. Schneider, Bob Jahns and Bob Mesler.

Third places for Ross were picked up by Schneider in the shot put and discus; Russell Ottney in the high hurdles; Duane Hack in the mile run; Mesler in the high jump; Ottney in the low hurdles; and Hurse in the 220-yard dash.

the mile run; Bob Jahns placed second and Ottney third in the 180-yard low hurdles; Storer was third in the 880-yard run; and Skip Baker tied for second in the pole vault for the only Ross points.

B. B. Schneider, weight man for Ross, didn't make the trip.

Deshuk of Lorain tied the Lorain field record with a 13.5 in the 120-yard high hurdles. He also set a new record in the 180-yard low hurdles with a 20 second effort.

## Tie In Track

FOSTORIA — Ross high and Fostoria battled to a 59-59 tie in a dual track meet here yesterday.

The teams split even in first places, each winning seven.

Burdette Schneider of the Little Giants took firsts in the shot put (39 feet, 7½ inches) and discuss (109½ feet) and was on the winning mile relay team.

Other firsts for Ross: Duane Hack ran the mile in 5:17.9; Larry Chapin soared 9 feet, 3 inches in the pole vault; Bill Cloyd raced the 440-yard dash in 59 seconds; and Russell Ottney took first in the 180-yard low hurdles in 22.4 seconds.

Dwight Kimble of Fostoria was a double winner with a 10.4 in the 100-yard dash and a 23.45 in the 220-yard dash.

The Giants, under coach John Ihnat, now own a 0-3-1 record.

## Defeated 98-20

Sandusky won all but one event yesterday as Ross high lost a dual track meet at Harmon Field 98 to 20.

Bob Mesler was the only effective performer for the Giants, winning a first place in the high jump with a 5 foot, 6 inch leap and placing second in the 440-yard dash with a time of 55.8 to winner Dave Graves' 54.7.

Walt Hurse of Fremont won a second in the 220-yard dash and Skip Baker, soaring 10 feet, 3 inches in the pole vault, finished second to Sandusky's Dave Jones who cleared 10-6.

Russell Ottney picked up thirds in the hurdles events. Hurse was third in the 100-dash, Duane Hack third in the mile run, Hurse third in the broad jump and Bob Jahns third in the 220-dash for the other Ross high points.

Dick Fouts of Sandusky won the low hurdles and 220-dash and Harold Berger the shot put and discus. Tom Reitz of Sandusky whizzed the 100-dash in 10.3 seconds.

Seniors Bob Mesler and Walt Hurne were elected honorary co-captains of the Ross high track team for the past season at the squad's picnic at Rodger Young Park Tuesday.
