Little Giants polish off Maumee 44-26

Green teams grapple in dual match

Green is the color of money, but it's also the color of the Ross and Maumee high school wrestling teams, according to Ross Coach Al Voggenthaler.

"It was a case of two green (young) teams," Voggenthaler said after the Little Giants defeated the Panthers 44-26 at Ross. "It was just a case of us being light green and them dark green."

The match was still in doubt until Charles Chapman and Jamie Ramirez recorded pins at 145 and 152 pounds, respectively, and Troy Williamson beat Chris Ashby 16-5 at 160.

"Up until then, it could have gone either way," Voggenthaler said.

Chapman pinned Brian Siravo in 5:42. Ramirez was much quicker, flattening Steve Bobash in 50 seconds.

Williamson's decision gave Ross a 35-20 lead.


Maumee's Brian Buck pinned Kevin Smith in 1:02 at 171 to make it 35-26, but Brian Moreno earned a 17-11 decision over Dave Calabrese at 189 and Ross heavyweight Corby Chudzinski pinned Pat Farley, sewing up the win.

Moreno avoided a pin with 40 seconds left against Calabrese.

"There were some letdowns," said Voggenthaler. "Fortunately, our letdowns were fewer than their's."

Maumee led 12-0 after Jeff Kern and Greg Czarnecki pinned Ryan Reidmaier and Jaime Her-

Ross makes quick work of Oregon Clay in dual meet

The result was the same — a Ross win — but it was accomplished in a different fashion.

The Little Giants backed Oregon Clay up against the wall and executed the Eagles 57-15 in a high school dual wrestling match in the Purple Pit at Ross High School Wednesday.

"I am more pleased this time than I was last week," said Ross Coach Al Voggenthaler. "We executed better this time."

Ross, 2-0, defeated Maumee 44-26 last week.

"Execution" was the key word in the final three matches as Rob LeMay, Brian Moreno and Corby Chudzinski needed a combined 90 seconds to pick up three pins and 18 match points.

LeMay was the slowest of the trio, taking 56 seconds to pin Jerry Takacs at 171 pounds. Moreno, a sophomore, picked Clay's Bill Hanner up, deposited him on his back and came up with the fall in just 17 seconds of their 189-pound match.

Chudzinski, capped off the night in the heavyweight bout, beating Moreno by a second in

stopping Keith Erdman in 16 seconds.

The Little Giants, who lost just three or 12 matches, also had five other pins.

Ryan Reidmaier, 103, and Jaime Hernandez, 112, put Ross ahead quickly 12-0 with falls in the opening matches. After Clay Miller of Clay pinned Brian Palomo in the 119-pound match, Ross ran off three wins, including a forfeit at 130.

Mike Rocha, 125, won a decision and Phil Missig pinned Matt Payne in 5:03 of the 135-pound match.

After that, Charles Chapman, 145, and Jamie Ramirez, 152, won on falls before Clay got its final points when Dennis Walendzak outpointed Troy Williamson 10-4 in the 162-pound match. Chapman stopped Ed Olejniczak in 3:57 and Ramirez overpowered Mike Drake in 1:30.

Ramirez's fall iced the match, putting Clay down 39-12 with four matches remaining.

"The kids improved," Voggenthaler said, "and we will have to continue to improve because of the tournaments we have coming up."

Ross will compete Friday and Saturday in the 12-team Rogers tournament before going to the 32-team Medina Invitational Dec. 29-30.

Wrestling at Rogers begins at 4 p.m. Friday. The semifinals are scheduled for 11 a.m. Saturday and the finals begin at 7 p.m. Saturday.

Host Rogers will be joined by Ross, Port Clinton, Anthony Wayne, Bowshe, DeVilbiss, Mecomber, Scott, Springfield Local, Columbian, Wauseon and Galloway Westland.

TOLEDO — Seven Ross wrestlers will wrestle in today's semifinals at the Rogers Invitational.

Ramirez leads Ross to Mal Mackey title

It wasn't as easy as the previous four but Ross chalked up its fifth consecutive Mal Mackey Memorial Wrestling Tournament title Saturday.

Jamie Ramirez of Ross, however, made it look easy while becoming the second wrestler to win four individual titles in the 17-year-old tournament named in honor of the man who

started the wrestling program at Ross.

"It started out kind of badly for us," Ross Coach Al Voggenthaler said. "I had to call a freshman and get him out of bed to fill out a weight class when our kid did not make weight."

"This was one of the fewest point totals we have won it with," Voggenthaler said.

Ross had just two champions while scoring 144 points. Runner-up Vermilion had 128 and Clay was third with 126. Toledo Waite finished fourth with 97 and Clyde was fifth with 82 in the 10-team tournament.

Scott, Lorain Senior, Sylvania Northview and Northwood rounded out the tournament.

Ramirez, named the tournament's outstanding wrestler in a vote of the coaches, won the 145-pound title, adding to his championships at 98, 105 and 130 pounds in previous tournaments. Matt Marquis of Ross was the first wrestler to win four Mackey titles, adding his fourth crown last year.

"I just wanted to do it," Ramirez said succinctly. "I have always set my goals to wrestle in the state tournament and I have

not done that yet. Winning this (fourth Mackey title) has not really sunk in yet."

The Ross senior pinned his way through the tourney, stopping Chris Schilling of Southview in two minutes and 31 seconds in the first round and Pat Mackin of Lorain in 3:32 of the semifinals. Ramirez pinned Danny Marquis of Northwood in 3:16 in the title match.

Terry Carter won the other Ross title and with it, took home the trophy for the most pins in the least amount of time. The Little Giants junior pinned all four of his opponents in a combined time of 4:13. In the 180-

pound title match, Carter stopped Dennis Walendzak of Clay in 1:15.

Mike Rocha of Ross was second in the 125-pound division, losing to Shayne Golden of Northview 17-16. Golden trailed 16-12 with 25 seconds left and both wrestlers on their feet but he took Rocha down, rolled him onto his back with 14 seconds left and held him there to complete a five-point move for the title.

"I felt sorry for Mike because he never quits," Voggenthaler said. "If he keeps on wrestling like that, he will win many more than he loses."

Clyde had two champions: Brian Villalon at 112 and 140-pounder Don Young. Villalon defeated Fronshon Hills of Toledo Scott 10-6 in the finals and Young outpointed Nate Bath of Vermilion 3-1 in the title match.

"It was the first title for both of them," Clyde Coach Doug Fields said. "We won five of the final (championship and consolation) matches we were in and I am happy with that."



Sandusky takes down Ross

Takedowns are the first move in wrestling and the Sandusky wrestlers took that initiative in their 41-16 victory over Fremont Ross Thursday night.

Sandusky had 27 takedowns to just eight for Ross.

"I love takedowns," Sandusky Coach Ken Colatruccio said. "We work hard on them and the tiring part off."

"I feel we are as good as any team at takedowns ... with the exception of (Lakewood) St. Ed's."

Sandusky, 8-2 and ranked third in the Division I Ohio High School Wrestling Coaches Association poll, got the first takedown in eight of the 13 matches.

Terry Carter had four of the Little Giants' takedowns in his 12-6 victory over Darrin Dunn at 160 pounds. Ryan Reidmaier, Jaime Hernandez, Charles Chapman and Scott Swanger each had one takedown.

"Their experience was too much for us," Ross Coach Al Voggenthaler said. "If for nothing else, but that we knew we were in trouble."

Ross, 2-4, was in trouble after Reidmaier opened the night with a 12-4 decision over Dan Jeter at 103 pounds.

Jason Darden won a 10-2 decision over Hernandez and Tom Dickson defeated Brian Palomo at 112 and 119, respectively. Pins by Phil Capodice, 125, Scot Lazarra, 130, and Tony Moore, 135, and a 7-0 decision by Jason Brown over Philip Missig left the Blue Streaks in control of the match 28-4.

Chapman edged Steve Schmidt 13-12 in a competitive 145-pound match. Schmidt walked off the mat pleading with the referee for three back points instead of the two he was awarded as the buzzer sounded.

Chris Corso put on a takedown clinic in his 12-7 decision over Jamie Ramirez at 152 pounds.

Corso had five takedowns and Ramirez scored his points on five escapes and a reversal near the end of the match.

Carter's decision made the match score 31-10 Sandusky.

Kevin Randleman pinned Troy Williamson at 171 pounds and Felix Chaney had his way with Brian Moreno, beating him 16-2 at 145 pounds, before Swanger and Ross heavyweight ended the match on an up note for the Little Giants with a 30-second pin over Tony Johnson.

"I knew Coach Voggenthaler would have his kids ready to wrestle," Colatruccio said. "The score looks lopsided but it was a tough, hard match."

Voggenthaler wasn't disenchanted.

"We're just glad we got out of here alive," Voggenthaler said. "All I ask of the kids is that they do their best and they did. I was very pleased with the way the kids responded against a team like Sandusky."

Ross lets mat upset of Perkins slip away

It was a contested call that cost Ross but when summed up, Al Voggenthaler said his Ross wrestling team's 26-25 loss to Perkins Saturday, was its own fault.

"We should have won it," Voggenthaler said. "We lost two matches that we should not have lost but it should not have come down to that."

The Little Giants lost the 125 and 140-pound matches in the last seconds by a point. Mike Puckrin, after trailing 7-3 at one point, reversed Mike Rocha of Ross with four seconds remaining to pull off a 10-9 win.

At 140 pounds, Eric Fresch of

Perkins scored on a takedown at the buzzer to nip Charles Chapman 4-3. Both wrestlers were on their feet with less than 10 seconds remaining when Fresch slipped behind Chapman, forcing Chapman to put both hands on the mat for enough time, according to referee Paul Branco, for the two-point takedown and the win.

"His (Chapman's) hands were down supporting him," Branco said, "and the Perkins wrestler was behind him and on him. That was enough for the takedown."

"I just felt there was not enough reaction time (hands on the mat)," Voggenthaler said

after contesting the call.

"The 125-pound match was a big one for us," Perkins Coach Steve Finn said. "The Ross kid is tough but our kid is 14-4.

"I knew this match would be close," Finn said. "I thought both teams wrestled a little flat at times; not in one particular weight division, just all through them."

"However we look at it," Voggenthaler said, "it should not have come down to those two matches. We should have won it on our own and not have to worry about anyone else."

Perkins wrapped up the win on Matt Cedoz's 13-6 decision over Brian Moreno in the 189-pound bout. That gave Perkins an in-

surmountable 26-19 lead. Ross heavyweight Scott Swanger's 50-second pin on Howard Minnifield only served to tighten the score.

Jamie Ramierz had the match's quickest fall. The Ross senior flattened Tim Hanchin in 39 seconds at 145 pounds.

Other Ross wins went to Brian Palomo, 8-4 over Kenny Wright at 119; Daniel Costilla, 5-1 over Steve Thom at 130; Troy Williamson, 3-0 over Any Tommas at 152 and Terry Carter, a 14-4 verdict over Chad Corso in the 160-pound match.

Ross will travel to Toledo Whitmer Wednesday for 6 p.m. match and return home Saturday to host the second Buckeye Central Conference Tournament.
