## DISTRICT TANK PROGRAM HAS 113 SPLASHERS

### Ross and Sandusky Mer- men Favored to Cap- ture Major Honors

Fremont Ross High swimmers will start their bid for another state crown Saturday afternoon as they are hosts to the North-western Ohio district scholastic swimming meet.

Coach Bim Stults, in charge of the event, stated Friday that 113 entries had been made for the outstanding tank attraction. Strongest opposition for the Little Giants is expected to be furnished by Sandusky.

#### Start at 2 p. m.

Toledo Scott will also bring a number of point-getters to Fremont and Lima Central will enter the event for the first time. Other teams to compete here include Waite and DeVilbiss High schools of Toledo and Mansfield High.

Coaches will hold a preliminary meeting at 1 p. m. and the meet will get under way at 2 p. m. Preliminary events will be held in all but the relays and 220 free style event. First six to finish in each event except diving will be eligible to compete in the state finals at Columbus next week. Four may go to the finals from the diving competition.

#### Interest Keen

Keenest competition and possible new records are seen in the 100 and 200-yard swims. W. Kenneth McCool, of the Toledo club, will act as starter.

With Fremont defeating Sandusky here early in the season by a wide margin, the Little Giants will be favored to capture the bulk of honors. The Blue Streaks of Sandusky were able to win by a narrow margin in their own pool 10 days ago, making interest in the district event keener than in recent seasons.
