Giants slip past Mules

No Bedford, Ross players shoot in 30s

Fremont Ross golfers Troy Ritchie and Mark Walter may not see much of each other on the course after shooting a combined 81 Tuesday at Fremont Country Club.

The senior captains, who were paired with the top two Bedford golfers in the Little Giants' 162-172 win, shot 40 and 41, respectively.

Though Ross remained unbeaten in three Great Lakes League matches, coaches Den-

ny Ritchie and Denny Brudzinski worry the players are better off on their own.

"They are our seniors and they want to play together," Denny Ritchie said, "but every time they play together they don't play well."

Few did so on Tuesday, regardless of the pairing.

Three of Bedford's six players shot 45 or higher, and no one played in the 30s.

"We're getting to the point where we want three guys in the 30s," Denny Ritchie said.

Troy Ritchie and Walter each double-bogeyed the par-4 second hole as Bedford took the early lead. But an eight by the Mules' Jeremy Dirkmaat after hitting his No. 4 drive out of bounds tightened the score.

Walter's toughest hole was the par 3 fifth, where he putted past the hole several times for a triple bogey six.

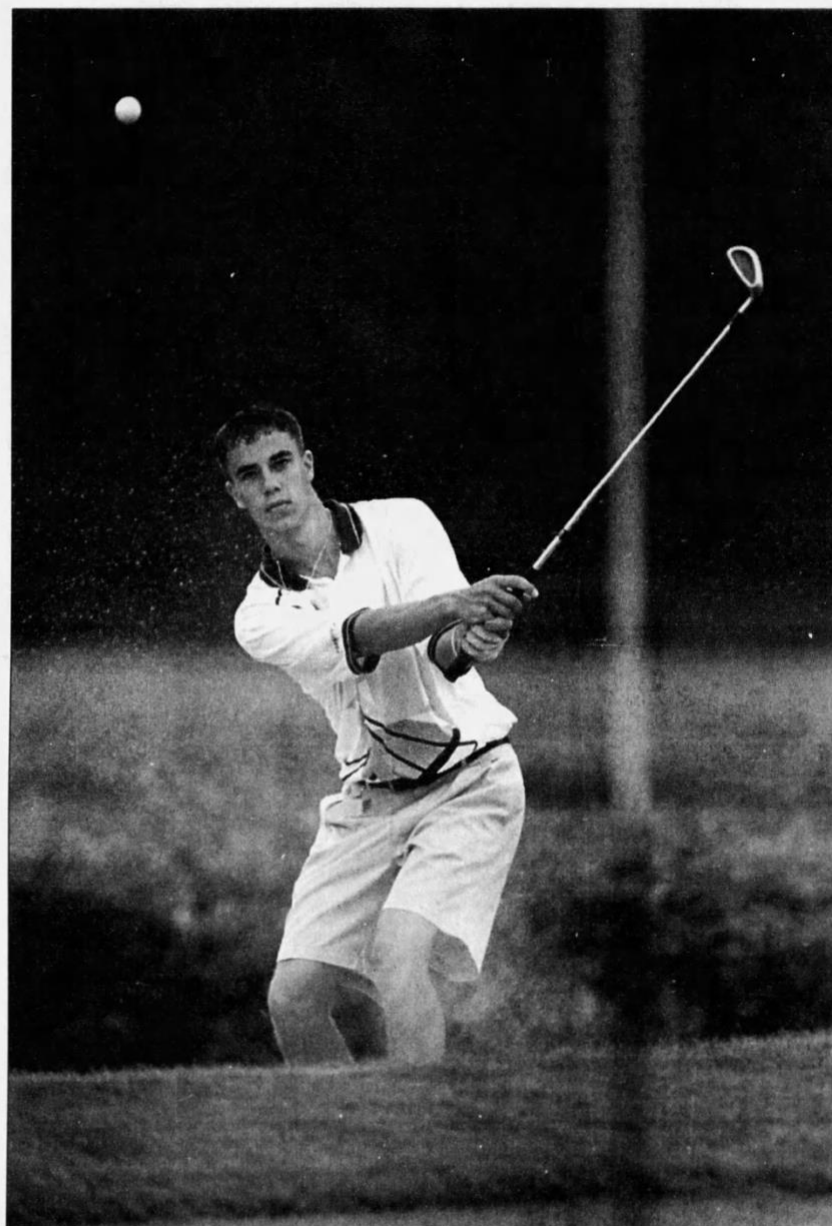
"It was an extremely fast green," he said.

Bedford's Kevin Skomer, who has played at Ross's home course in the past, agreed.

"It was playing fairly tough. Playing pretty long," said Skomer, who tied Ross' Troy Ritchie and Mack Cole for medalist honors. "The greens are tough. ... It was hard to get the speed off the greens."

Yet Walter, rather than fall apart after his triple bogey, turned things around. He shot one-under-par for the last four holes.

"I just calmed down, took a few deep breaths and told

myself to make up for it on the final 4-5 holes," Walter said.

Ritchie also dealt with adversity. On hole No. 7 he hooked his drive well left of the fairway, then recovered for a bogey on the par-4 hole.

"I haven't hit one of those shots in two years," the coach's son said. "I just laughed at myself and forgot

about it."

Cole shot his 40 with help of a fifth-hole birdie. Cole hit an eight-iron left of the pin on the 145-yard par 3, watching the wind drop the ball close to the hole.

"The wind drew it back. I guess I got lucky," Cole said.

Matt Bauer's 41 provided the other score for Ross.

Saturday the team shot 315 for nine holes, led by Walter's 76 and Ritchie's 79.

Brudzinski did not make excuses for his team Tuesday.

"Last week (our team) played well here. They are capable, they probably just missed a couple putts," he said.

Ross, St. Joe take a mulligan

Teams reschedule golf match after playing in tough conditions Monday

The crosstown golf match between Fremont Ross and St. Joseph Central Catholic turned into a scrimmage Monday when both coaches agreed Fremont Country Club's greens were not suitable for a competitive match.

Players brushed dirt and sand off the greens with towels and allowed for two-putt maximums on some holes to offset debris caused by routine maintenance.

Both teams finished the required nine holes, with Ross beating the Crimson Streaks 173-

178. But with several golfers still playing, Ross coach Denny Ritchie offered St. Joe coach Greg Kohler a chance to reschedule — under better conditions.

"If I had known the conditions were going to be like this, I would have rescheduled for another date," Ritchie said prior to making the offer to Kohler.

The teams will play at the Country Club Sept. 23, one day after the Little Giants host the Great Lakes League tournament.

Monday's match was ruled a scrimmage and will not count against the schools' 18-match

limit, Ritchie said.

Ross's Jay Farrell was willing to give up the win to try again.

"Sure," he said after shooting a 41. "I'm not happy with how I played either."

The problem? The greens had been airfied, a process required to let air get to the roots of the greens. Dime-shaped holes are poked out of the greens, often leaving the dirt "plugs" behind. Sand is then scattered on the greens.

"There's sand on the green that thick," Ross golfer Mark Walter said to his teammates, showing

an inch-high space between his thumb and forefinger.

The course is already without half its holes because of renovations which started this month. Holes 1, 2, 3, 4, 12, 17, 11, 10 and 18 create the current nine-hole, par-35 setup.

While St. Joe's Aaron Zimmerman still managed a 38, no other golfer shot below 41.

"You would hit it and it would just keep rolling," St. Joe's Nate Waleryszak said of the greens. His chip on the final hole did just

that, rolling on and then off the green.

"The greens, you couldn't hold any shots on them," Kohler said. "And the guys were thinking if they were too soft with a chip," the plugs would alter the shot.

Kohler welcomed the chance to return to the Country Club later in the month, calling it "a privilege to play here for most of our guys."

But Troy Ritchie, who shot a 43 on his home course, was willing to take his game to the Streaks' home.

"We should have just gone to Sycamore Hills," he said.

Regardless of the site, the match is

a rare chance for Ross and St. Joe athletes to compete. The teams met last year for what was believed to be the first head-to-head battle in 10 years. St. Joe won that match, also played at the Country Club.

"I know a lot of the players (for St. Joe)," Farrell said. "It's fun to play with them."

Aside from the questions about conditions, the match nearly did not take place because of prior scheduling. The Little Giants' calendar said the match was today, while St. Joe believed the match was Monday.

The schools agreed on the Monday matchup less than 24 hours before the match.
