Ross, Clyde Harriers Lose; New Record For Fremont

Fremont Ross, 0-1, meets Clyde, 2-1, Tuesday at 4 p.m. at the Sandusky county Fairgrounds in a cross country meet. Ross is host to Ashland next Thursday.

Yesterday marked the initial outing for Coach John Ihnat's Ross cross country runners. Highly rated Ontario high (near

Mansfield) scored a 26-29 victory (low score wins).

Highlight for Ross in a losing effort was Tom Koebel's record-breaking time over the Fairgrounds course. The junior long distance ace went the two-mile distance in 10 minutes, 15 seconds.

Three Ontario runners were right on Koebel's heels. Dan Huber came in in 10:21, Ken Giffin in 10:35 and Dick Hamrick in 10:39. Then came Ross high's Ken Koebel, 10:40; then C. Niesset of Ross, 10:42, Tom Blaney, Ontario, 10:45, Willie Schwenzfeier, Ross, 10:46; Chuck Hufford, Ross, 10:47.

Actually, Roger Patton of Ross, 10:57, and Carl Hufford, Ross, 11:18, finished in front of Ontario's Les Minnie, tenth place winner with a time of 11:28. But only the five best times on each team count.

Clyde lost yesterday to Sandusky 27 to 28, first reversal of the season for the Fliers who had tripped Attica and then Lima Tuesday 15-40.

Despite Tom Koebel's second straight record-breaking performance, Ross high lost in cross country Tuesday to Clyde.

Final score was Clyde 22, Ross 33 (low score wins).

It gives Clyde a 3-1 record while Ross, who hosts Ashland Thursday, 4 p.m. at the Fairgrounds track, is 0-2. Yesterday's meet was held at the Fairgrounds.

Koebel, Ross junior, negotiated the two-mile distance in 9:59 (nine minutes, 59 seconds) which is a new Fairgrounds and new all-time cross country record at Ross high. Last week Koebel ran a 10:15, a new Fairgrounds record at the time.

Clyde had the second, third, fourth and fifth best boys, in order, Jim Burkett, 10:14, Dennis Wilson, 10:15, Murray Miller, 10:18 and Lanny Vogel, 10:23.

Sixth place and second for Ross was won by Willie Schwenzfeier, 10:27; then Clarence Nieset, Ross, 10:35; and Mike Shanahan, Clyde, 10:36.

Roger Patton of Ross was ninth in the meet and fourth for the Little Giants, 10:42. Chuck Hufford was 11th in the meet and fifth for Ross with 10:46.

team, again was a first place winner in the time of 10 minutes, 8 seconds. He has paced the field in all four Ross meets thus far.

Bowling Green captured the next three places and won the meet with 22 points. Ross was second with 42 and Toledo Waite third with 56.

CLYDE—The host Clyde cross country team repeated an earlier 22 to 33 triumph over Ross high's harriers Thursday on the Green Hills golf course south of here.

As in the first meeting between the schools, Tom Koebel of Ross was tops in the race with a time of 10 minutes, 35 seconds. He has finished first in all Ross races this season.

Clyde is now 6-1 for the season and participates next in the Bowling Green Invitational at Bowling Green State university Saturday. Ross is 1-3 in dual meets and competes again October 20 at Bowling Green in a dual meet with Bowling Green high.

Four Clyde runners placed next to Koebel, Jim Burkett, 10:36; Murray Miller, 10:56; Larry Vogel, 11:00; and Denny Wilson, 11:11.
