

1926 Limited Season Review

For the first time this season the Fremont high school girls' basketball team has felt the sting of defeat. They faced the Norwalk girls at the local gym last night in a game which was expected to be easy for the "Wonder Girls" of the purple and white, who had on an easy victory from the visitors on their home floor several weeks ago, and lost a close decision, 23 and 20.
