## Ross third at BCC

A poor back nine and a scorecard mistake cost Ross in the Buckeye Central Conference golf tournament Saturday at the Fremont Country Club.

Mark Gottron shot an 81, but was disqualified for signing an incorrect scorecard and the Little Giants finished third behind Findlay and Lancaster in the five-team field.

The Trojans won with 327, while Lancaster and Ross tied at 342. Since Gottron's disqualification left Ross with four scores, Lancaster got the nod for second in the fifth-man tiebreaker.

"We were leading at the turn, but Findlay came on and we gave away too many strokes on the back," said Ross Coach Dave Fleming.

Gottron's score would have been good for BCC first-team honors, but Fleming said one of his playing partners, keeping score for the Ross player, put down a four instead of the actual score of five on the 10th hole. He then complicated matters by adding it wrong, giving Gottron the correct score of 81, when it really showed he had 80.

Fleming added that Gottron, seeing the correct total, did not check the hole-by-hole scores and signed the card, thus disqualifying him.

Tony Bryan's 81 led the Little Giants, and gave him All-BCC first-team honors. Joining Bryan were medalist Chad Callender of Newark with a 75, Andy Kuntz of Findlay with 77, Lancaster's Joey Oglivie with 80 and Kevin Snyder of Zanesville with 82.

James Chung shot 85 for the Little Giants to make the All-BCC second team along with three more Findlay golfers.


Ryan Riedmaier had 86 and Joey Chung shot 90 for Ross's other scores.

In one other match, the Ross reserves played in the Bellevue Invitational, and finished ninth out of 12 teams, most of them varsity squads.

Upper Sandusky won with 152, while Norwalk was second two strokes back. Bellevue's "A" squad was third, while Margaretta's varsity was 10th in the nine-hole affair.

Mike Burns had 44 for the Little Giants, while Rob Massey had 43 to pace the Polar Bears.

P.T. Peterson had 38 for Bellevue to earn medalist honors.

## Young second in BCC tennis

Amy Young of Fremont Ross was second in the third court singles Saturday in the Buckeye Central Conference Girls Tennis tournament at Rodger Young Park.

While Young's finish highlighted a winless season to date for the Ross girls, it was Findlay's day as the Trojans won the first and third court singles and the second court doubles titles.

Findlay had 130 points in the tournament with Lancaster runner-up with 79. Newark was a close third with 76 and next was Ross with 55. Zanesville finished on the bottom with 16.

Findlay's Noelle Ryan defeated Young in the finals 6-3, 6-1 after the Ross player had de-

feated second-seeded Ann Davey of Zanesville in the semifinals in straight 6-4 sets. Young was seeded third.

Irene Sheen of Ross was fourth in the first singles, losing to Kelli Price of Lancaster 10-2 in the pro set consolation finals.

Ross was involved in three rain-forced canceled matches. Ross trailed in each but team points were divided equally according to tournament director Pat McGhee. All of the matches were in the consolation finals for third place.

Findlay winners included Shandra Niswander in the first court singles and Ryan in the third court. The Findlay duo of Miondy Healy and Tiffany Trener won the third court doubles crown.
