# HARRIERS RUN IN SECTIONAL

Fremonters Expected to  
Give Scott Battle  
For Honors

Cross country runners of Fremont Ross high school were in Toledo Saturday for the annual northwestern Ohio district meet over the two mile Ottawa Hills course.

The Fremonters, winners of seven straight dual and triangular meets, were expected to press the favored Toledo Scott team for honors.

Scott has finished ahead both in the district and state meets for the past two years and is a favorite to repeat today.

Toledo DeVilbiss, Toledo Libbey, Sandusky, and Mansfield were among other entries in the harrier event.

First 10 finishers and the first, second, and possibly third teams to finish will be allowed to compete in the state competition November 7 at Columbus.

# ROSS HARRIER OUTFIT THIRD

Fremont Runners to Vie  
in State Meet Next  
At Columbus

Although running without the services of Lawrence Tolhurst who finished first in the Sandusky-Mansfield triangular meet, Fremont Ross high school harriers finished third in the northwestern Ohio district meet Saturday at Toledo.

First honors went to Toledo Scott, for the fourth straight year with Toledo Libbey finishing in third place.

Scott, Libbey, and Fremont will be eligible for the state competition in Columbus Saturday.

Scott won the meet by scoring 62 points, Libbey having 71 and Fremont 77. Other teams which failed to qualify finished as follows: Sandusky 106, Mansfield 127, DeVilbiss 155, and Bryan 178.

Surprise of the Fremont squad was Abney, a freshman, who finished fourth for the Rossmen. Order of finish of the Fremont runners in the meet was: Reinbolt sixth, Keller, 15th, Rosen 17th, Abney 19th, Dunlap 20th, Broshious 21st, Weyer 39th.

Fremont was the only school in the meet that gained five medals, one gold and four silver.

Nelson Price of Elmore won individual honors, beating out Bill Furman of Scott in the good time of 10:36.6.
