Fostoria's Tucker Breaks Three Records, But Marion Cops Buckeye Loop Track Meet

I SEE WHERE OZZIE RAUCH SAYS THAT THE CITY'S new baseball park will be ready by June 1, which comes as not good, but GREAT news for local semi-pros, who are so hungry for a decent place to play ball their tongues are hanging out.

Of course, that is just one month later than an earlier prediction that was made last winter, but the local boys will settle for June 1. But if the delay is any longer than that there won't be time for the Senior and Junior leagues to play a full schedule.

This thing has been hanging fire for a long time, when you stop and think about it. It's almost two years since the decision was made to sell Anderson Field to the Herbrand.

MAYOR STIERWALT says that of the \$22,500 received from Herbrand, \$18,000 is still on hand and available for baseball park expenditures. In other words, the city is going to spend \$18,000 or thereabouts in the next 22 days, and it spent only \$4,500 in the last 20 months.

Brother, the hammers and the saws and the other stuff that goes along with building are sure going to be moving at a fast rate out there on the Oak Harbor road. Better stand back 100 feet, boys, for safety's sake, and hope for an all-clear on June 1.

Al Ziemke, the recreation director, says that six teams are ready to go to the post in the Senior League—White's Plumbers, Basic Refractories, Sims Hauling, Herbrand, Fremont Rubber and Reino's Cleaners. Reino's Cleaners is a Gibsonburg firm but the ball club will be the old Junior League champs, Frey's Manufacturing, managed by Tex Frey.

The Junior League will have just four teams—Miller Motors, St. Joe, Woleslagel Moving and Bettsville.

Al reports that the next baseball meeting will be on May 20, when final details will be mapped.

FOSTORIA—Jimmy Tucker of Fostoria won the individual glory and Marion romped off with the championship in the Buckeye League track meet here last night.

Tucker set three Buckeye League marks as he won the high and low hurdles and the broad jump.

Marion scored 72 1/2 points to 45 1/2 for Fostoria, 39 for Fremont Ross, 37 for Bowling Green and 29 for Tiffin Columbian. Findlay did not compete.

Tucker won the 120-yard high hurdles in 15.3 seconds. He set another record for the 180-yard low hurdles in 19.6 seconds, and his record distance in the broad jump was 21 feet, 7 inches.

Findlay did not compete due to the league ban on the Trojans that stems from a basketball eligibility case.

Tucker gave Fostoria three of its four firsts, the other being nabbed by Jim Russell in the shot put, with Merton Hoagland of Fremont second and Fremont's Ron Whitcomb third.

Ross Relay Team Wins

Ross captured one event, the 880-yard relay, with Charles Black, Gerry Gallagher, Dick Harter and Ron Whitcomb supplying all the speed.

Marion copped only one field event, the discus throw, won by Jack Boxwell, but the Prexies asserted their strength in the running events. They took the mile, the 880 and the 440 and had numerous seconds and thirds.

Whitcomb pushed Tucker in both his hurdles victories.
