THIS IS THE REBUILDING YEAR FOR GEORGE Gruse's Ross high school swimming team.

Shorn by graduation of most of the performers who carried the Giants to the runner-up spot last March in the state finals, Coach Gruse does not expect the 1951 team to match past achievements.

"Things look a little better than they did a couple of weeks ago," said the veteran mentor yesterday. "We should be tough about 1952 or 1953, but we lost too many to be as tough as the last two years."

Ross can stand a "down" year as far as the law of averages is concerned, for the Fremont school has long been in the high upper bracket in Ohio swimming circles. Last year's club was runner-up to Cincinnati Walnut Hills and the year previous, Canton McKinley's great team barely edged the Giants by a single point.

Ross has been district champ for the last four years, and since the winter of 1934-35, when swimming was organized here, the school has racked up 11 district titles and six state championships. Four times Ross squads have finished second in the state.

THOSE MEMORIES will be pleasant ones to mull over if George's fears come true. With only two lettermen returning, it looks tough on paper too. But the future, that's a different story. There's not a senior and only six juniors on the squad of 23.

Ross high's swimmers open their season Tuesday night at 7:30 against Sandusky, and the Blue Streaks are rated an even chance of getting revenge for past lickings.

The Giants have only two let-termen returning from last year's classy squad, and their outlook is the dimmest in several seasons. Coach George Gruse's lads have been runners-up in the state meet for the last two years.

Ross high school's swimmers open their season tonight against Sandusky in the Ross pool.

The match starts at 7:30. Admission is 50 cents for adults and 30 cents for students.

Coach Gruse, his squad depleted by graduation, rates the match a tossup. Last season, the Giants were runners-up in the state meet in Columbus.

Green Squad Is Promising

This is Ross high's rebuilding year in swimming, says Coach George Gruse. When he gets through, it should be a whale of a project.

That's the consensus of those who watched the Giants steam-roller the Sandusky natators 46-27 in the Ross pool last night. It was the Ross opener and 200 happy and loudly-cheer-fans saw some brilliant performances.

Sandusky's Ed Russell, breast-stroker deluxe, was the only two-time winner, but the speed of George Hirschberger, Lonny Price, Louie Lorenzen and a few others provided the balance needed.

Hirschberger was particularly outstanding. He covered the 50-yard free-style race in 25.9 seconds and was a good three yards in front of Sandusky's Nobert Gast at the finish line. Then in the last event of the evening, Hirschberger, anchor man on the free-style relay team, came in about four strokes ahead of Sandusky's Tom Behnke to win the event.

Rose Beats Burkett

Jack Rose, a sophomore, won the 100-yard free style race over Dick Burkett to provide a slight surprise. Burkett is one of the two lettermen back from last year's squad that was runner-up to Cincinnati Walnut Hills for the state championship.

Price, brother of the illustrious Larry who is destined for great things at Wooster College after a brilliant career at Ross, won his race easily in the backstroke, the same event in which his brother competes. Lorenzen, due to be a Ross football line-backer one of these days, romped home a winner by five yards in his 200-yard free-style event.

In diving, tiny Larry Hunt, a sophomore, was off to an early lead, but lost when he faltered in his last two dives. First place went to red-haired Jack Erickson of the Blue Streaks. Hunt was second and Dick DeMars of Ross was third.

Free-Style Strength

Ross, continuing to show strength in the free-style department, won the medley relay when Burkett outdistanced Behnke down the stretch. The 200-yard free-style relay found the third men touching at the same time, but Hirschberger splashed in ahead.

In a special event, not counted in the regular scoring, Ross won a medley relay. Competing for the Giants were Gary Schwartz, Bill Faunce and Tom Kirsch.

Giants Get 5 Firsts But Lose, 38 To 37

Sandusky high's swimmers avenged an earlier lop-sided defeat by handing Ross a 38-37 setback in the Blue Streaks' pool Tuesday afternoon.

The Sanduskians, led by Ed Russell who set a pool record in the individual medley swim, took the lead in the sixth event to get their first victory over Ross since 1946.

The Streaks sewed up the match by getting first and second in the diving. Ross came back to sweep the relays but the local lads were still one point short.

George Hirschberger, free-styler; Lonny Price, backstroker, and Jack Rose, free-styler, nailed victories for Ross. All were easy winners. In fact, the Giants grabbed first place in five of the nine events but lacked strength down in the ranks.

Russell swam the 75-yard individual medley in 1:22.7, bettering the previous record of 1:23.7 which he himself set this year.

Prior to the match, the rival coaches, George Gruse of Ross and Walter Caldwell of Sandusky, were notified that the annual Bowling Green relays, called off last Saturday by a blizzard and reset for this Saturday, has been canceled.

Relays Bring 42-33 Victory

Ross high's swimmers pinned the first defeat of the season on the crack Toledo YMCA team here last night, 42-33.

A thrilling victory in the 150-yard medley relay and a lopsided win in the free style relay pulled the Giants from behind in the last two events.

It was a nip-and-tuck match throughout. The YMCA came here with six straight dual victories under its belt but a reshuffling of the lineup by Coach George Gruse upset the visitors' applecart.

Gruse entered Dick Burkett in the 50-yard free style along with George Hirschberger and Ross swept first and second place over Hal Lineback, versatile Toledo swimmer. Hirschberger came in ahead of Burkett in 26.2 seconds.

Lineback Beats Price

When Lineback was also entered in his specialty, the back stroke, it weakened the YMCA chances in the medley relay, for a boy cannot be entered in more than one event. Lineback, an excellent back stroker, defeated highly-regarded Lonny Price of Ross. But he could not compete against Price in the backstroke division of the medley relay.

Ross won only two firsts in the individual events, Hirschberger in the 50-yard free style and red-haired Jack Rose in the 100-yard free style. However, Burkett picked up six valuable points by capturing second in two events.

In the medley relay, Price got Ross off to a good lead and Louis Lorenzen, the anchor man, touched slightly ahead of his opponent for five points. That put Ross ahead by only two points, 35-33, meaning that the YMCA could win by taking the seven-point free style relay. As far as Coach Gruse was concerned, however, the match was over, the mentor being confident his free stylers could win in a breeze.

And that's exactly what they did, Rose, Bob Lucas, Lorenzen and Hirschberger really going to town. Hirschberger was nearly a pool length ahead when he touched home.
