# Ross teams 3rd, 4th at NWOAC Relays

PORT CLINTON — The Fremont Ross boys and girls swim teams both turned in strong performances Saturday at the Northwest Ohio Aquatic Conference Relays here as the boys finished third and the girls were fourth out of 10 teams.

Napoleon won the boys meet, scoring 102 points with Perkins second at 94 and the Aqua Giants third with 60 points.

Sylvania Southview won the girls meet with 92 points while Perkins was again runner-up with 90 points. Napoleon was third at 56, then Ross and Bowling Green tied at 48.

One other area team, host Port Clinton, did not fare as well. The Redskin girls were eighth and the boys were 10th.

The Ross boys were led by the diving tandem of Ryan Nuhfer and B.J. Blair, who picked up the only victory for the Ross boys, scoring 205 points. The Aqua Giants had the only pair over the 200-point total.

## Swimming

The Little Giants also added one second-place finish and two third-place finishes in the meet.

The second place was picked up by the 300-meter breaststroke relay team of Mike Tallman, Steve Schaaf, Todd Vogel and Rob Schaaf. The foursome clocked in with a time of 3:25.40. Napoleon won with a 3:24.70.

Thirds were scored in the 800 free relay and the 300 fly relay. Steve Schaaf, Brian Schaaf, Rob Penrod and Mike Mullholand were on the 800 free relay squad and Penrod, Kevin Mowry, David Voggenthaler and Steve Schaaf teamed up in the 300 fly.

For the Ross girls, the 400 free

relay team brought in the highest finish, placing second. The team of Todi Heslet, Jamie Brudzinski, Ann Wells and Julie Schaaf combined for a time of 4:09.84. Perkins blew away the field with a 3:53.80 clocking.

The Aqua Giant girls also had two thirds in the meet. Jamie Brudzinski provided one, clocking in with a time of 6:18.62 in the 500 freestyle event while the other came from the 300 fly relay squad. Heslet, Schaaf, Wells and Katie Hiser teamed for a time of 3:24.03 to show in that event.

The Ross boys take to the water again Tuesday at Margaretta. The girls' next meet is Saturday at Sandusky.
