Bribe Trial To Jury Today

RALEIGH, N.C. (AP) — The trial of two St. Louis men charged with bribing four North Carolina State College basketball players to shave points was expected to go to the jury today.

Superior Court Judge Heman Clark was to complete his charge to the jury. Clark delivered part of his charge Monday after attorneys completed final arguments.

Dave Goldberg, 46, and Steve Lekometros, 39, are accused of bribery in the basketball game-fixing scandal. The indictment involves eight games in which N.C. State participated from Dec. 5, 1959, through Jan. 7, 1961.

Goldberg and Lekometros are each charged in 14 counts in seven games and Goldberg is charged with four additional counts in an eighth game.
