SWIMMING

Ross high's swimmers go to Bowling Green State University Saturday afternoon to try for district honors and qualify boys for the state finals at Columbus next week.

Ross has won the district 12 times in the last 15 meets and has taken the last five. However, district competition is limited, only Sandusky entering a full squad against Coach George Gruse's tankers. Toledo schools will have scattered representation.

The first six in each event will be eligible for the state finals. Each school is permitted to enter four boys in each event.

If Sandusky is at full strength, the Blue Streaks have an excellent chance to end Fremont's domination. They extended Ross to the limit before losing a dual meet here. A return engagement at Sandusky found the Blue Streaks below par because of a siege of influenza.

Fangboner Seed Wins City Bowling Title By Nine Pins



Fangboner Seed won the team title in the city bowling tournament at Maples Lanes over the week-end by hitting a net score of 3087 to nip Sherriff Goslin by nine pins.

Fangboner Seed replaces Joseph Jewelry as the champion. The Jewelrymen hit a score of 3090 in winning last year.

Doubles and singles will be bowled Saturday and Sunday at the Maples. Although a large number has already signed up, there are still some openings, according to Bud Miesle, secretary of the City Bowling Association.

The new champs, who bowl regularly in the Recreation League at Paramount, did their firing at 9 p. m. Saturday night and their total held up under a barrage of Sunday scores.

Hot First Two Games

The Seedmen blew only three spares over the first two games, an unusually sharp showing, but

in the last game when the pressure was at its peak, the team missed nine spares.

Counting a handicap of 91 pins per game (a three-game aggregate of 273), Fangboner rolled 1063 its first game and 1074 in the second, with Gene Mehling, anchor man, turning in a 226 in the second game.

All except Bob Fangboner, sponsor and No. 2 in the line-up, fell below their previous efforts in the third game. However, Eddie Binsack was high with 194, which came on the heels of 212 and 211 for a series of 617. Fangboner weighed in with a 173 after a 169 and 167 for a total of 509, low for his team.

Mehling wound up with a 593, Elmer Nickel had a 553 and Ed Miesle a 542.

Sherriff-Goslin, a Maple Maulers quintet, had a 495 pin handicap to boost its actual score of 2564. Like Fangboner, the team had its lowest score in the third game. Alphonse Vanden Bosch rolled a 191 and anchor man Dee Pinneo hit a 187, but in between were a 176 by Bill Reineck, a 156 by Bud Kritzell and a 137 for Bob Galster.

Individual honors were taken by Earl Carnicom, of Johnson Insurance. He bowled the highest three-game score, a 634, and his 235 was the best single game.

Ross high school swimmers smashed all scoring records in the district meet at Bowling Green Saturday.

The Giants compiled 93½ points—most in the history of the meet—in romping off with team title. Sandusky finished second with 53½. Also rans included Toledo Scott, 40 points; Toledo Waite, 17; Toledo Library, 10, and Van Wert, 6.

The result boosted Ross' chances of upsetting defending champion Canton McKinley in the state finals at Columbus this week-end. Preliminaries will be held Friday at 4 o'clock in all events except diving, those prelims being slated for 10 a. m. Saturday. Finals will begin Saturday at 2 p. m.

Boys who finished in the first six at B.G. are eligible for the finals.

3 Lads Win Races

George Hirschberger, Lonny Price and Jack Ross raced to individual victories, while Ross also got first place in the medley and free-style relays.

Hirschberger splashed to victory in 25 seconds flat in the 50-yard free-style. Price was home in 105.6 in the 100-yard back stroke, and Ross turned in the time of 58.3 seconds for the 100-yard free-style.

The medley trio of Price, Bill Faunce and Neal Bork was one-tenth of a second faster than Sandusky in the time of 1:27.5. The free-style relayers, Bob Lucas, Ross, Louis Lorenzen and Hirschberger, won in 1:43.2.

Bork got second in the breast stroke, while Schwartz was second to Price in the back stroke.

One of the biggest surprises was Dick DeMars, who placed ahead of Larry Hunt in diving. Jack Erickson of Sandusky won first place by a whisker ahead of DeMars.

Sophomore Ned Frantz pleased Coach George Gruse by doing his fastest time of the year to get fourth place in the 200-yard free-style and fourth in the 100, strenuous assignment for a sophomore.
