## Lytle, Liggins & Opelt

# Little Giants Send Three To District

MANSFIELD — Tom Liggins and Rob Lytle will journey to the District Class AAA track and field meet for the second consecutive year while Jeff Opelt will make his initial appearance at Bowling Green State University Saturday.

Those three were the only Fremont Ross thincldas to make it through sectional competition at Mansfield Malabar High School last Saturday.

Liggins with the best effort of his career, won the shot put while Lytle won the 100 and also qualified in the 220 and Opelt, a sophomore, led all pole vault entries. The top three finishers in each event qualified for the district meet.

Ross, with 49 points, finished third in the 17-team sectional field behind powerful Sandusky (138) and Lima Shawnee (52). "We had some bright spots and some disappointments," Ross head coach Ron Brant said. "I expected Liggins, Lytle and Opelt to get through the sectional after their performances in the Buckeye Conference championships. All three were champions.

"And, I was hoping to get the mile relay team, Kim Michaels and Ken Price into the district." The mile relay just missed a district ticket. Jon Smith, Tim Smith, Jim Heidleberg and Ken Price were only a tenth of a second behind Wapakoneta, which took the last district berth. The same Ross foursome, which had a 3:28.9 in the Buckeye seven days earlier, had a 3:33.3 and Wapakoneta 3:33.2. Sandusky qualified first at 3:29.7 and Findlay was second at 3:32.6.

Number of misses prevented Michaels from going to the district. He and Sandusky's Scott May both went out of the competition at the same height (6-2) but May had the least number of misses.

Michaels broke his own school record with a jump of 6-1½. He set the old mark (6-1) in a dual meet with Elyria earlier this spring.

Price failed to qualify in his specialty—the high hurdles.

"Ken is a small person physically and the weather conditions were against him," Brant said. "The win was really blowing gusts into his face when he was running."

Lytle took the sectional 100 for the second straight spring. Ironically, he also had the same time, 10.0. He is unbeaten in the century this spring. But the junior speedster had a much tougher time qualifying for the 220. He placed third with a 23.3. It was only the second time this spring he has been beaten in the 220.

"Rob seemed to tighten up over the final 35 or 40 yards," Brant said. "We noticed that he started out much faster than usual so maybe that was the reason. But Rob's back has also been bothering him."

"We were thinking of using him in the mile relay but after he tightened up the coaches decided that using him there wasn't necessary. I just hope his back troubles clear up before the district."

Liggins was also a repeat champion in the shot put. He won in 1971 with a put of 52-6½ but went 54-3 in gaining his latest crown.

"That is the best he has ever

done," Brant said. "Coach Armstrong (Tom) has been giving Tom some extra work for endurance and it paid off. The 54-3 came on Tom's final throw in the finals. He went into the finals with the second-best distance."

Opelt tied a Ross school record in going 13-6. Dan Linder (1969) and Mike Tooman (1971) also went that height during their Ross careers.

Opelt, a sophomore, and Mansfield Malabar's Dan Willard both went 13-6, but Opelt was the winner based on number of misses.

"I don't know why, but Jeff seems to do better in poor weather," Brant said. "It was really tough for pole vaulters today because of the strong wind conditions. And, if you remember, Jeff also did very well in our own Night Relays when it rained so hard—he was the last vaulter remaining."

Mansfield Malabar's Andy Johnson shattered the 880 mark of 1:59.1 set by Ross' Earl Smith in 1971. Johnson won in 1:58.5.

Tyrone Coleman of Mansfield Senior tied the long jump record of 21-4½. Also sharing the record are Henry Weaver (Mansfield Senior, 1960) and Pete Kemp (Galion, 1965).

Besides Fair and Pearson, Sandusky also received firsts from Scott May (discus) and Jim Fantozz (high hurdles).
