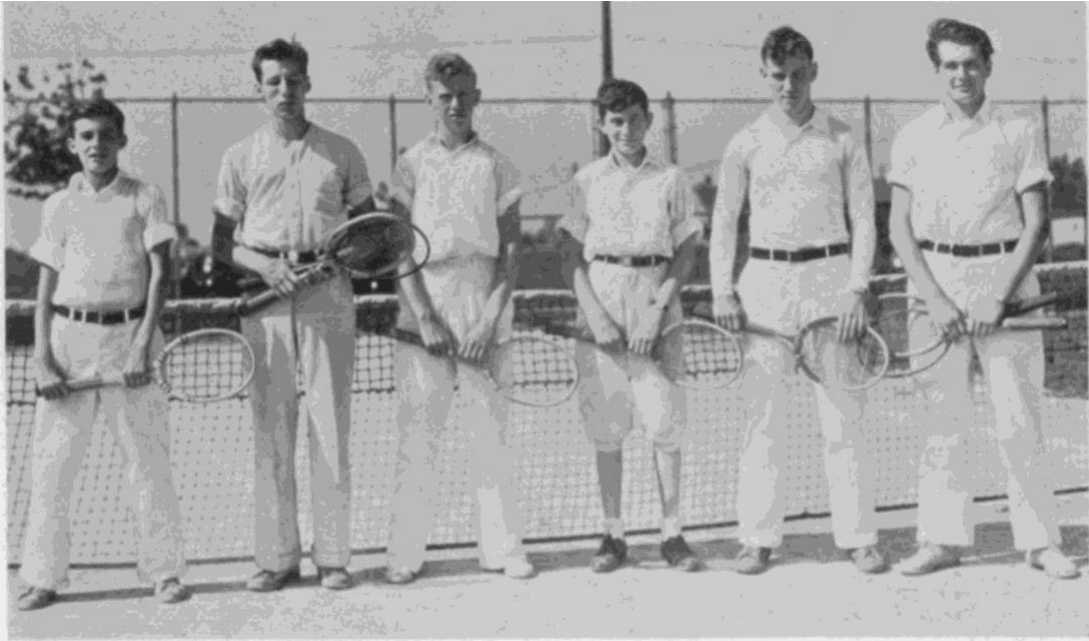


1932 TENNIS TEAM AND SEASON IN REVIEW

Bob Post and Jack Zink took White and Klingbiel down the line 7-5, after a hot duel and then Post, with Don Wilson as his sparring partner, took the same Sandusky pair over the coals 6-2 to complete the conquest.
