

Findlay wins another BC title

Findlay captured the Buckeye Conference golf championship for the fifth consecutive time Monday.

The Trojans fired a 320 over their home course, the Findlay Country Club, to win going away by 13 strokes over Sandusky. Fremont Ross finished fifth in the chase for the top spot.

Findlay was threatened only by Sandusky which held a three-stroke advantage after nine holes.

Mike Martin, the tournament medalist, paced the Trojans to the title with a 77. Teammate Greg Neuman shot a 78 for the balanced Trojans team.

Sandusky was second at 333 with Marion Harding third at 349. Lorain was fourth with 351 followed by Ross, Admiral King, Elyria, and Mansfield.

Gary Eversole was Ross's low man with an 81. Ross was third at the turn, 11 strokes off the pace set by Sandusky.

In other high school matches in the Fremont area, Woodmore raised its record to 6-2 with a triangular win over Patrick Henry and Van Buren at Hillcrest Golf Club in Findlay; Old Fort is now 11-3 after a win over Hopewell-Loudon at Seneca Hills; Genoa defeated Gibsonburg; Lakota nipped Oak Harbor in a playoff; and Norwalk rolled past Bellevue at Sleepy Hollow.

Steve Burner and Rodger Jimison shot 39s to place the Wildcats to a 161 total. Patrick Henry carded a 173 and Van Buren was a distant third with 215. Gary Rutter

had a 40 for Patrick Henry.

Randy Lynch carded a 38 as Old Fort outstroked Hopewell 162-177. Joe Hiestand and Mike Watkins had 42s for the Stockaders. Dave Van Meter and Jeff Miller shot 43s for the Chieftains.

Walt King shot a 38 and Russ Foreman and Craig Mancinotti carded 39s in Genoa's 156-165 win over Gibsonburg. Greg Sworden of the Golden Bears took medalist honors with a 37.

Lakota and Oak Harbor were tied at 170 after the regulation match to force a playoff. The Raiders turned in a 38 to the Rockets' 41 to win the Suburban Lakes League match. The playoff went two extra holes.

Doug Tanner and Dan Scherger shot 41 for the Raiders in regulation. Doug Beck had a 40 for match medalist honors for Oak Harbor.

All four Norwalk Players broke 40 in the Truckers' 149-169 victory over Bellevue. Curt Everman shot a one-under-par 35 to lead the Truckers. Bob Warner shot a 37, George Peckman 38, and Clark Raplee 39 to round out the Norwalk contingent.

Brett Marvin's 38 was low for Bellevue.
