Ross High To Have Night Track Meets

All Ross high's home track meets this season will be at night, Coach Mal Mackey announced today in releasing the schedule.

Mackey said the reason for the change from afternoon meets is to increase public interest in the sport.

"You can't expect to have anybody except students at a day-time track meet," the coach asserted. **"I think the adult public should be taken into consideration."**

Ross has four meets scheduled at home, the annual invitational, two triangular meets and a dual engagement. Road encounters are a dual meet at Sandusky, and the Buckeye League championships at Fostoria.

Mackey said that the field events, the discus throw and shot put, would be staged just prior to nightfall because after-dark throwing is too dangerous, but the track events will be contested under the lights. Mackey said a time schedule will be set up for each race and that it will be strictly followed.

5 Schools Vie At Harmon

Ross high school's track team turned to the annual invitational meet at Harmon Field Friday after dropping its first meet Wednesday at Sandusky.

The Giants and Sandusky will both be in action here in the first home night track meet in Ross high's history. Other competitors will be Marion, Norwalk and Fostoria.

Ross won only two firsts and got a tie for another as the Blue Streaks piled up an 81½ to 36½ triumph. Charlie Glover won the broad jump, John Allen topped the shot put and Dick Willey tied for a first in the 110-yard high hurdles.

Ross got points for six second-place finishes. John Lewis was runner-up in both the 100 and 220-yard dashes. Eric Haskins took a second in the mile run, Willey was No. 2 in the low hurdles, Lionel Frampton was second in the pole vault and Surratt got second in the high jump.

Dale Bertsch of Sandusky won the 100-yard dash and the 220 and was the leadoff runner in the half-mile relay.

Tomorrow's invitational is expected to produce some spirited competition. Fostoria, Marion and Sandusky rule as the favorites.

Coach Mal Mackey of Ross said the field events will start at 6:30 with the running events to follow about 7:45.

Marion Hi Thinclads Defeat Findlay, Ross

Marion stamped itself as the best track team in the Buckeye League with a convincing victory over Findlay and Ross in a triangular meet here last night.

A hand-full of Harmon Field fans watched Marion's balance pay off heavily. Findlay won more firsts, seven, but Marion grabbed the greatest number of points in second, third and fourth place.

The final score was Marion 72½, Findlay 58½, Ross 17. It was the second annual triangular, having been inaugurated at Marion last year. Next spring, Findlay will be the host.

Biggs Wins Discus

Bob Biggs was the lone Ross performer to win an event. He captured the discus throw with a heave of 134 feet and four inches.

There were several two-time winners. Paul Ludwig copped the hurdles as expected, while Bill Peterson, 190-pound Findlay junior who shone against Ross in basketball last fall, captured the 100-yard dash and the shot put.

Dave Caldwell of Findlay won the pole vault and broad jump and Bill Garnes, a four-letter winner in basketball, won the

440-yard dash and the high jump.

Charles Glover, veteran Ross trackman, did not show up for the meet, according to Coach Mal Mackey. Glover's presence would likely have meant a Ross win in the broad jump.

Eight records were broken in the new annual meet. They were in the high hurdles, 440, 880, mile run, mile relay, shot put, discus throw and pole vault.

Ross high's thinclads will be in action Thursday afternoon against Bellevue, the only home afternoon meet on the Giants' schedule.

Redmen Get 8 Firsts But Lose

Ross high school obtained its first victory in track Thursday afternoon at the expense of Bellevue at Harmon Field, 63-55.

The Giants captured only six firsts in the 14 events, but won 10 second spots and were third eight times.

Dick Willey won the high hurdles and finished second in the lows, Eric Haskins captured the mile run, Julius Sims won the 440-yard dash and anchored the winning mile relay team, and John Allen won the shot put. The other Ross first was nabbed by the half-mile relayers, Jerome Surratt, Eric Frampton, Ron Whitcomb and John Lewis.

Sims' teammates on the mile relay group were Willey, Dick Burkett and Charles Black.

Black was competing for the first time. He had been laid up for more than two weeks by a knee injury received in spring football practice.

Fostoria, Tiffin and Ross will compete in a triangular meet here next Tuesday.

After tonight, Ross has only one more meet booked, the Buckeye League championships at Fostoria May 17. The district trials will be held the following week.

Coach Mal Mackey's thinclads have one victory in their two dual meets, beating Bellevue and losing to Sandusky. They finished fourth in the invitation-
al and were last in a triangular against Marion and Findlay.

Marion, the class of the league this year, will be a heavy favorite in next week's Buckeye setto.

Lewis Stars For Giants

Ross high's track squad, showing exceptional strength in the field events and led by the lanky John Lewis, won a triangular meet at Harmon Field last night.

A slim crowd watched the Giants end their home season by scoring 59 5/6 points. Tiffin Columbian finished second with 53 5/6 and Fostoria was last with 34 1/2.

Lewis won the 100-yard and 220-yard dashes and tied for a first in the high jump, the first time he ever participated in that event.

The Giants won the shot put, discuss throw and broad jump in field victories and got a three-cornered share in the high jump.

Lewis provided the local boys with all their victories in running events as the 6 ft., 3 1/2-in. junior, also a star in football and basketball, came up with his best performance of the season.

Tiffin Columbian earned five firsts and tied for another. The Blue and Gold copped both relays.

Perry Wins Pair

Rod Perry won the 440-yard dash and the high hurdles to give Fostoria most of its points. Art Wilson's crew did not come up to expectations.

Next engagement on the Ross schedule is the Buckeye League meet Thursday at Fostoria. Their foes will be Fostoria, Marion, Findlay and Bowling Green. Marion, winner of the invitation and a three-cornered meet here involving Ross and Findlay, is a heavy favorite.
