Ross track coach has plenty to choose from

Numbers are no problem for Ross track coach John Elder.

Finding quality in them is another question.

Elder admits, the boys team is better off than the girls squad.

"We have a lot of sprinters and a lot of kids who want to throw the shot and discus," Elder said about his third boys team.

Nine Little Giants out of 48 lettered last season.

"We have a lot of sprint possibilities," he said.

Among those are juniors John Liggins and Hector Rodriguez, senior Norm Crawford and fresh-

man Ty Williams. Crawford is Ross's top hurdler.

Also in the sprint picture is Jim Parker, who figures to be in the 400 and relays.

In the distance events, junior Tim Nesbit anchors the crew.

"Tim will run in about everything in the early parts of the season," Elder said. "That means from 400 to the 3200 along with the 1600 and 3200 relays."

Seniors Phil Missig and Shane Hill, both lettermen, give the Little Giants a trio of capable distance runners.

Lettermen Bob Frye and Stan Root lead the group of weightmen.

"We have a lot of people who

want to throw the discus and shot but most of them are new at it," Elder said.

One of the "new kids on the block" is Brian Moreno, a pole vaulter last year.

"He has grown," Elder said, "and frankly, we did not have a pole big enough for him so he is in the discus and pole vault."

Thirty-one girls are on the roster but Elder said he had expected 40 to turn out this spring.

"We have a good size team," he said, "but the quality may not be there yet. The girls are kind of young."

There are 11 letterwinners back but some of them did not

have that much experience last year, Elder said.

A quintet of distance girls has Elder smiling. Four of them lettered: Amy Ritzman, Kaylene Bartson, Leah Lomax and Erin Appleby.

"It is a strong corps but we cannot afford to have any injuries," Elder said.

Elder is optimistic about a youthful sprint corps.

"We have some good potential," he said.

Juniors Jackie Weaver and Stephanie McGee, sophomores Connie Morris and Jada Price and senior Missy Smith are the

main sprinters. Weaver and Smith are the hurdlers in the group along with promising freshman Erika Pickard.

In the field events, senior letter-winner Shari Root leads the discus and shot putters while Billie Jo Elder, — no relation to the coach — has shown good jumping ability in the high jump.

"I think that in my three years, this is the best shape the kids have been in going into the first meet," Elder said.

That will be tested today when the Little Giants open at Fostoria in a 4 p.m. meet. Ross hosts Lakota and Clyde Thursday.

Tornadoes dismantle Ross, Galion

TIFFIN — The Columbian Tornadoes dominated a high school track and field meet against Fremont Ross and Galion Tuesday.

Columbian rolled up 102 points to 35 for Galion and 29 for Ross in the boys events and compiled 99 points to 41 for Ross and 24 for Galion in the girls' competition.

"We did not run our strongest lineup, but Tiffin is loaded," Ross coach John Elder said.

The Tornadoes won all but four boys' events and all but three girls' events.

High jumper Mike Pasch took the only first for the Little Gaints in the boys meet, jumping 5-10.

Amy Ritzman won the girls' 1600-meter run in 5:39.9 and was the lead runner on the winning 3200-meter relay team. Ritzman was joined on the relay squad by Erin Appleby, Leah Lomax and Kaylene Bartson.

Ross fifth at Whitmer Relays

TOLEDO — Ross picked up six second-place finishes Saturday en route to a fifth-place finish in the Class AAA events at the Whitmer Golden W Relays.

Tiffin Columbian won the meet with 110 points, followed by Toledo Rogers with 102½, Sandusky with 97½, Whitmer with 84 and the Little Giants with 79.

Ross captured seconds in

the pole vault, high jump and long jump, and got runner-up finishes from Norman Crawford in the 110 and 300 hurdles and Tim Nesbitt in the 1600 run.

"The boys did a nice job, especially in the pole vault, high jump and long jump," coach John Elder said. "Tim Nesbitt ran a 9:52 in the two-mile (third), which is great for this early in the season, and Norman Crawford ran very well.

"We still have a lot of room

for improvement."

The Little Giants' pole vault team consisted of Dave Kadlubowski, Dan Swaisgood and Chad Bruns, and the high jump trio was made up of Mike Pasch, Brad Schabel and Chris Wolfe. Hector Rodriguez, Tyrone Williams and Marc Roberts comprised the long jump team.

Nesbitt also recorded a third-place finish in the 1600 run.

Byrnes, 19-4, played third court singles for the Little Giants, topping off the season with a Buckeye Conference championship. He, and senior Rob Myers, took home co-captain trophies.

Coach Mike Andrews awarded the most improved player to Justin Oxley, another senior. Also, Myers and David Dierksheide received their fourth year letterman awards.

Crawford led coach John Elder's boys track team to a second in the Buckeye Central conference and the school's first district title last week. He qualified for the regional meet in the 110 and 300 hurdles in the district meet. Along with John Liggins, he was awarded a co-captain's award.
