New beginning for Wolf's softball team

It's just like starting over for Sue Wolf and the Fremont Ross softball team.

Wolf, who takes over as head coach after several years as an assistant to Christy Holland, will build her team around four returning letterwinners.

The biggest loss is pitcher Kim White, who logged the majority of the innings pitched last spring. Debbie McClure will be the Little Giants' number one pitcher this season.

Other returning players are infielders Kim Borys and Rachel Ritter and outfielder-first baseman Shanell Moneghan.

"We're starting over," said Wolf, who also has been a head varsity coach at Dayton Northridge and Oxford Talawanda as well as a graduate assistant Miami (Ohio) University

Wolf has formed a 14-player Ross varsity from 30 players.

"We've got a lot of people fighting for positions," Wolf said. "What it will come down to is who hits the ball; someone has to show me something."

Ross will be a defense-minded team this year, which Wolf said won't be much of a change. "I was in charge of defense last year," she said. "We'll work real hard on defense."

Offensively, Ross will take a page from Ross baseball coach Dan Fought's playbook. The Little Giants will be aggressive.

"I'm doing that because I feel that's what we need to win the games," Wolf said. "We have to keep the errors down and hope we can win by scoring a few runs."

Ross opens the season March 28 at Margaretta.

Wolf said the Little Giants are eager.

"I think they are," she said.
"They're ready to go and they're working hard."


