Nine lettermen returning for Ross wrestling team

Ross High School will open the high school wrestling season this evening at 7 p.m. with the intra-squad "Purple-White" Meet.

The squads will be divided up by head Coach Al Voggenthaler and assistants Rick Boggs and Jim Marinis.

Voggenthaler has a nucleus of nine lettermen back for this year's team. Eight of the nine lettered last season while one lettered as a sophomore but not as a junior.

"We finished strong last season," Voggenthaler said about his team, "and the kids have shown a good deal of improvement since then."

"The only problem this year," he added, "is that we are not very deep, especially in the upper weights. If someone gets hurt up there, we'll have problems."

"But we have a lot of the kids who scored points in tournaments last year back," the Ross coach said.

Voggenthaler has a pair of promising sophomores to go with his lettermen. Rick Heidelberg, a Buckeye Conference champ at 145 pounds last year, is back. Heidelberg was a run-

nerup in the section meet and Reggie Parks, 138, finished fourth in the sectional.


Running down his lettermen, Voggenthaler has Jeff Weickert at 98, Mel Clark at 112, Mark Schmidt at 119, Kevin Shaffer at either 126 or 132, Parks, Heidelberg, Craig Trick at 155, Andy Esquivel, the sophomore letter winner who did not earn his second letter in 1981-82, and Mike Wendt, 185.

Mike Mezinger and Dave Middleton, are sophomores that could move into the Ross lineup permanently. Mezinger, will be a starter at 105 pounds while Middleton is battling Clark for the 112-pound slot.

Kit Sultz, a junior, will wrestle at either 167 or 175. Todd Beatty is also a possibility at 175 but has been hampered during pre-season practice by banged up ribs. John Trimble, a senior, will handle the heavyweight matches.

"We have a good blend of veterans and youth," Voggenthaler said. "We had a real good scrimmage against Perrysburg, St. Francis and Lakota. "They all looked pretty good."

Voggenthaler will use the Purple and White Meet to help determine his final varsity lineup.

Purple prevails in Ross debut

The Purple spotted the White an early lead before coming back to take a 33-25 win in Ross High School's annual intra-squad wrestling meet.

The event at Ross High School kicks off the wrestling season for Coach Al Voggenthaler's team.

There were 12 matches during the evening which featured a "mini'clinic" before the match. Voggenthaler explained several moves on how points are awarded to wrestlers in a match during the clinic.

Because of weight conflicts, several matches were made up of wrestlers competing in a weight above or below his normal weight.

"I was pleased with the younger wrestlers," Voggenthaler, who served as the official for the meet, said while talking about his non-lettermen and sophomores. "They showed a lot of scrap."

"Overall, though," he pointed out, "it was hard to judge individuals because they were wrestling out of their weight classes."

The White had a 9-0 lead after two matches as Mike Mezinger pinned Jeff Weickert in 4:24 and Dave Middleton nipped Mel Clark 6-5.

Two-year letterman Mark Schmidt scored

Purple's first points, pinning Craig Stull in 5:29 of the third bout. Kevin Shaffer put the Purple ahead by pinning Jesse Sepeda in 1:51 of the fourth match that pitted wrestlers in the 119-pound range.

In the wildest match of the evening, Mike Esker pinned Jesus Ruiz in 5:16. Wrestling at 126 pounds, the match was deadlocked at 18-18 when the pin came midway through the third period.

Purple's lead stretched to 21-9 when Darrin Draeger outpointed Salvador Salcedo 11-9. Reggie Park's 16-8 win over Brett Johnson at 138 and decision wins by Craig Trick over Rick Heidelberg (6-5) and Andy Esquivel over Kit Sults (5-4) at 155, closed Purple's lead to 21-9.

The teams exchanged pins — Mike Ochs of Purple stopped Tim Batesole in 5:39 of the 167-pound match and Mike Wendt of the White stopped Andy Chambers in 2:49 at 185 — to bring it down to the final match.

In that heavyweight conflict, John Trimble pinned Doug Smith in 1:24 to secure the win for the Purple.

The Purple team was coached by Rick Boggs and the White by Jim Marinis. Both are Ross assistant coaches.

Four Little Giants in semis

TOLEDO — Fremont Ross was tied for fourth in the 16-team Rogers Invitational Wrestling Tournament after the first two rounds of competition Friday.

The Little Giants had 52 points, the same as Tiffin Columbian, the winner of last weekend's Port Clinton Invitational title.

Host Rogers is leading with $78\frac{1}{2}$, followed by Oregon Clay with 59, and Wauseon at 56.

Ross has four wrestlers in the championship semifinals. Top seeded Rick Heidelberg (145) and Mike Wendt (185) plus Mike Mezinger (105) and Mark Schmidt (119) have shots at the title. Eleven of the Ross 13 are still "alive" and could place in the double-

elimination tourney.

Heidelberg will face Troy Weber of Wauseon in today's semis. He pinned his two Friday night opponents. Wendt will go against Ken Walczak of Maumee.

Mezinger and Schmidt knocked off seeded wrestlers in the quarterfinals to keep in the championship round.

Mezinger defeated second-seeded Doug McCrae of Rogers 7-4 while Schmidt decisioned number four seed Derek Hoff of Perrysburg 7-3. Mezinger will face Ron Shull of Clay and Schmidt goes against Dave Day of Wauseon in the semifinals.

Wrestling begins at noon today with the championship finals at 7 p.m.

Little Giants 5th at Rogers

TOLEDO — Led by individual champions Mike Mezinger and Rick Heidelberg, the Ross Little Giants recorded a fifth-place finish in the 16-team Rogers Wrestling Tournament here this past weekend.

The host school, Toledo Rogers, won the tourney with 172 points, followed by Wauseon (131½), Marion Harding (120), Tiffin Columbian (117) and Ross (108½).


Mezinger, a sophomore and unseeded, decisioned his way to the 105-pound title. First, he beat Ottawa-Glandorf's Eric Ruhe 11-0, then he stopped Rogers' Doug McCrae 7-4 and then it was Clay's Ron Shull 5-0. In the finals, Mezinger defeated top-seeded Mike Haube of Anthony Wayne 8-4.

At 145-pounds, Heidelberg, the senior top seed, brought home

another title for Ross. He pinned Maumee's Mitch Cline in 1:04 and Ottawa-Glandorf's Jerry Lugo in 1:59 to get into the semis. There, he knocked off Wauseon's Troy Weber 12-4. In the championship finals, Heidelberg beat Lima Shawnee's Randy Lewis 9-4.

Other top finishes for Ross included Mark Schmidt's runnerup showing in the 119-pound division and Craig Trick and Mike Wendt's fifth-place finishes at 155 and 185, respectively.

Schmidt, who was unseeded, decisioned his way into the finals where he was edged 4-3 by second-seeded Keith Moorehouse of Toledo Whitmer. The Ross senior had defeated top-seeded Dave Day of Wauseon 3-2 in the semis.

Little Giants 'hop' over Clay 35-29

Ross's leap frog game matched that of Clay as the Little Giants jumped to a 35-29 win in high school wrestling Thursday.

Ross moved a pair of wrestlers up a weight class to win its first dual meet of the season.

"We moved the kids up because they wanted to do it," Ross wrestling Coach Al Voggenthaler said after the "Parents Night" victory. "But Clay moved about four of their up."

Rick Heidelberg, the champion at 145 in the Rogers Invitational Tournament last weekend, stepped up to 155 and Craig Trick, the Little Giants' regular 155-pounder, jumped to 167. Both moves paid off.

"They wanted to make the move," Voggenthaler repeated, "but we figured by making the moves, we could beat Clay."

Both leaps paid off

in falls. Heidelberg stopped Albert Hinojosa in 5:25 and Trick knocked off Tom Phillips in 4:52.

After Trick's fall, Ross held a 30-17 lead but Clay cut it to 30-23 after Kit Sultz of the Little Giants, who weighed in at 157, was pinned by Clay 175-pounder Spencer Millimen.

Ross had forfeited the heavyweight division so Clay actually trailed by only one, 30-29. That put the outcome on the 185-pound match.

It was no contest. Ross's Mike Wendt muscled Clay's Ron Wells to the mat in the first 10 seconds and did all he could except pin him in the next four minutes. Finally, at the 4:19 mark and with a 12-10 lead, Wendt flattened Wells to solidify the Ross win.

Ross got started off on the right foot as 98-pounder Jeff Weickert pinned Mike Martin in 4:54. The victory was the third this season for the Ross junior, tripling his entire victory total of his sophomore season.

Mike Mezinger, 105, ran his record to 5-0 this season by pinning Clay's Ron Gill in 2:45. The Ross sophomore also won a Rogers title last weekend.

After the 119-pound match and Mark Schmidt's 5-1 narrow win over Eddie Resendez, Ross held a 15-3 lead but Clay closed the margin to 18-17 with wins at 138 and 145.

The Eagles' regular 126-pounder, Nick Anderson, stepped up to 138 to stop Reggie Parks of the Little Giants 14-7. That was as close as the Eagles were to come as Heidelberg and Trick completed the leap frog act to pull Ross away.

The Little Giants will be idle over the holidays, returning Jan. 8 when Ross will host the Fremont Invitational Tournament.

Mal Mackey Tournament is this week

A strong showing in a previous tournament has Ross wrestling Coach Al Voggenthaler believing his team has a shot at a title this Saturday.

The Little Giants will be the host team for the 10th Mal Mackey Memorial Invitational. The eight-team tournament at Ross High School will begin at 11 a.m., with the first session and end with the championship matches at 7 p.m.

Huron, Rossford, Sylvania Southview, Toledo Bowsher, St. Francis, St. John's and Vermilion make up the field. St. Francis is the defending champ while Ross was a fifth place finisher in the '82 tourney.

"I feel we have a good shot at it," Voggenthaler said before a Tuesday afternoon practice session. "Based on our performance in the Rogers tournament, which was very balanced, I think it is possible."

The Toledo Rogers Invitation was a two-day, 16-team tourney. The Little Giants were fifth.

"With two or three more wins in matches that we were leading, we could have been second or third," the Ross coach contended.

The Ross coach admitted that he knew little about the other teams.

"I know that Vermilion was sixth in its own tournament (12 teams)," he said. "We did wrestle St. Francis in a scrimmage and we did well against them but that was not under match conditions. They will be tough."

"I also know that Rossford is supposed to have a strong team but that is all."

The Mackey tournament is in its fourth year as varsity level competition. In the first six years, the tournament, named in honor of the person who began the wrestling program at Ross, was a junior varsity affair.

In Ross's last outing, a dual meet win over Oregon Clay, Voggenthaler jumped several of his wrestlers up a weight class but they will be back at their regular weights. He had planned several wrestle-offs this week before he was to decide on a lineup for the tournament.

"We definitely will not have a heavyweight," the Ross coach said, "and that might hurt us."

At 98, the Little Giants will have Jeff Weickert while the 105-pounder is Mike Mezinger, a sophomore and the Rogers champ. Melvin Clark and Dave Middleton could be at 112 with Mark Schmidt the 119-pounder.


Kevin Shaffer or Craig Stull are battling for the 126-pound berth. The loser of a wrestle-off was to move to 132.

Reggie Parks, providing he beats a weight problem, will be at 138 while Rick Heidelberg will be at 145. Craig Trick is the Ross 155-pounder with Andy Esquivel possibly at 167.

Todd Beatty, who has been out with an injury, will get his first test at 175. "We are going to unwrap him this week," Voggenthaler chuckled.

Mike Wendt is at 185 to round out the Ross lineup.

Tickets for each session of the tourney are \$2.50 for adults and \$1.50 for students. Tickets must be purchased for each session.

'Dogs win Mackey title

Rossford sneaked off with the championship trophy but Cragin took the show for Ross in the 10th Mal Mackey Memorial Wrestling Tournament Saturday at Ross High School.

Heavyweight Mike Jarrett of Rossford outpointed Dave Andrus of St. John's 6-2 in the consolation finals while Paul Ward of Huron defeated Chris D'Esposito of St. Francis in the championship match to give Rossford the title.

Going into the final matches of the evening, St. Francis, the defending champion, held a two-point lead over Rossford. Jarrett's win coupled with Ward's effort shut out the Knights. Rossford finished with 133 points, two more than St. Francis in the eight-team tourney.

Host Ross took third with 123½ while Sylvania Southview was fourth with 112½. Vermillion, St. John's, Toledo Bowsheer and Huron rounded out the lower division.

The heavyweight title win by Ward gave him the tournament's most valuable wrestler honor. The award was determined by a vote of the coaches.

The Little Giants had three champions: Mark Schmidt at 119, Trick at 135 and Mike Wendt in the 185-pound division.

Trick, seeded fourth, defeated top-seeded Dennis Haymier of Southview for his first tournament title as a Little Giant. The Ross senior fell behind 2-0 in the first period, remained at that deficit through the second and then evened the match with a reversal in the final period.

Haymier took a 9-2 lead with an escape but was stopped by a series of penalty points for backstabs in the final moment of the match. The last point, at the 25-second mark, put Trick up 4-3. That lead stood up despite Trick getting into trouble in the final 20 seconds. Haymier slipped behind Trick but the Little Giant maintained a spread-eagled four-point stance through those final seconds for the win.

"That was a good win," Al Voggenthaler, coach of the Little Giants, said about Trick's win. "Trick coming back against that first seed was super."

Schmidt, next to Trick, turned in a strong showing in the finals. Seeded first, the Ross senior pinned his opponent in the first round, racked up an 18-9 win in the semifinals and dominated Phil Rios of Southview before pinning him at the 1:54 mark of the title match.

Wendt was nearly as dominating, doing everything except pinning Tom Lewandowski of St. Francis. The Ross grappler picked up an 18-3 victory.

Rick Heidelberg, 145, lost his first match of the season in the finals, dropping a 7-5 decision to Fred Babson of Vermillion.

"Rick hurt his knee during warmups before the finals," Voggenthaler disclosed. "That bothered him because he was a little hesitant." Rick, on the other hand, was a force. Ross coach, Mike Mezinger, the Rogers Invitational 105-pound champ, lost in the semifinals to eventual runnerup Jim Klostemeier of St. John's. A win in that match would have put the Ross sophomore into the finals against last season's district champ Brian Shire of St. Francis.

Instead, Mezinger had to settle for third place

with an 8-4 win over Tim Morrissey of Bowsher in the consolation finals.


The Ross coach was pleased with the showing of 17-year-old Todd Beatty, a fourth-place finisher.

"It was his first time out this season," he said, "and even though he was pinned a couple of times, he looked good."

In special award, Demetrios Meimaris of Vermillion won the trophy for the most pins in the least amount of time. He had three in four minutes and 13 seconds while placing third at 138.

The New York Jets fired their cannon, the San Diego Chargers attacked by air, the Dallas Cowboys struck from all fronts and the Minnesota Vikings refused to fold on the first weekend of play of the National Football League season.

The NFL's revised and expanded 16-team playoff format, necessitated by the 57-day players' strike that wiped out seven weeks of the season, also produced a few surprises and guaranteed new finalists for Super Bowl XVII on Jan. 30.

The Jets, behind Freeman McNeil's record-breaking 211 rushing yards, crushed Cincinnati 44-

The Jets' Richard Todd completed 20 of 28 passes for 269 yards, which included eight receptions by Wesley Walker for a career-high 145 yards.

McNeil hit two first-quarter touchdown passes to stake the Bengals to a 14-3 lead, finished with 26 completions in 35 attempts for 354 yards.

Ross wins 1, drops 2 in quad meet

OAK HARBOR — Fremont won one, dropped two, in a quadrangular high school wrestling meet Saturday at Oak Harbor High School.

Sandusky St. Mary's won all three of the dual meets that the teams staged. Oak Harbor was 2-1 and Otsego was blanked.

The Little Giants handed Otsego a 44-24 setback but dropped a 33-25 match to the host Rockets and fell 36-27 to St. Mary's. Oak Harbor lost to St. Mary's 32-27 and beat Otsego 54-12. Sandusky downed Otsego 47-11.

Three Little Giants won all three matches while another was 2-0-1. Mike Mezinger won three decisions, stopping Steve Patterson of St. Mary's 12-4, rolling over Heath Hennen of Oak Harbor 17-2 and burying Otsego's Roger Huffman 18-2 in the 105-pound division.

Schmidt, 119, pinned Fred Artiaga of Oak Harbor in 2:42 and posted a 15-2 walkaway win over Willie Gagnon of St.

Mary's. Against K.C. Ringler of Otsego, the Ross senior fought off his back and had to wrestle an extra minute for an 11-8 decision.

Schmidt, trailing 7-2 after one period, had two points wiped off the boards in the second period when it was discovered midway through the period that he had started from the wrong position at the beginning. On the restart, he was awarded a penalty point, escaped and scored on the takedown to trail 7-6 heading into the last period. He had a takedown and a three-point nearfall after Ringler escaped in the final period.

Craig Trick, 155, had three impressive victories. He pinned Brett Swanson of Otsego in 1:43 but the two decisions were the big matches. 
