Those awards plus several other special awards along with 31 other athletes receiving letters topped off awards program number one. Awards night number two will begin at 7 p.m. today in the Ross High School cafeteria when the football team will take center stage.

Norm Bray, coach of the cross country team, also presented Zimmerman with a captain's trophy. The other special award —

the most improved runner — went to junior Mark Schmidt.

Emily Heid and her sister, Brigid, took home captain's trophies for Coach Pete Michaels' 13-2 Buckeye Conference champion team.

The most improved player for the girls netters went to junior Lisa Gettman.

Michaels, calling his team the "Beautiful 13," lauded his team while taking blame for 10 points that his girls did not record in getting 140 of a possible 150 points in the BC tournament.

"I would not let Emily play in the finals," he said, "because she was suffering from severe leg cramps. She would have played but I could not let her go through that pain."

The Miller brothers, Dave and Matt, took the top two awards for

Coach Dave Fleming's team. Dave, the Ross medalist in all but two matches, was the MVP and Matt, a junior, won the most improved honor by three-tenths of a stroke in average.

Coach Deb Miller, whose volleyball team failed to dent the win column this season, presented Ritchart with her team's top honor. Ritchart, a senior, received a captain's trophy. Gwen Minich also received a captain's award.

The volleyball team's most improved player was Becky Coleman with the outstanding offense award going to Sandy Long and the outstanding defense honor went to Tina Michael. Lisa McKinney and Christie Williamson shared the outstanding sophomore honor.
