Tornadoes whip Ross track teams

The weather cooperated with the Fremont Ross track team Tuesday, but the Tiffin Columbian Tornadoes blew past the Little Giants in a dual meet in Tiffin.

Columbian rolled to a 95-37 victory in the boys meet and a 93-30 triumph in the girls meet.

In other track action, Clyde swept a dual meet from Bellevue and Lakota finished on top among the boys and girls in a tri-meet with Genoa and Woodmore.

Ross did have a few bright spots in its first meet of the season, namely from its male sprinters, the girls 400-meter relay team, long jumper Jenny Mare and distance runners Amy Ritzman and Kaylene Bartson.

Troy Williamson, who paced the victorious boys 400-meter relay squad for Ross, also

Ross boys sweep, girls finish second

A busy day in high school track and field was highlighted by Fremont Ross's victory over boys teams from Bowling Green and Fremont St. Joseph Central Catholic at Ross Thursday.

The Little Giants won 11 of 16 events and compiled 87 points to 39 for BG and 29 for St. Joe.

In the girls portion of the meet, Bowling Green scored 68 points, Ross picked up 63 and St. Joe finished with 30.

In other action, Clyde swept a dual meet at Margaretta, Genoa dropped both boys and girls meets to Lake, Perkins topped Oak Harbor and Huron in a tri-meet at Sandusky and Woodmore's girls and the St. Wendelin boys team took first place in a quad-meet at Fostoria.

At Fremont, the Ross boys won all but the shot put, 3200-meter relay, 1600-meter run and 110-meter high hurdles. The pole vault was not contested.

Sprinters Terry Hall, Terry Carter, Charles Chapman, Troy Williamson, John Liggins and Adam Bulger set the pace for Ross. Also, Tim Nesbit won the 800-meter run, Aaron Potter edged St. Joe's Tim Arndt by .01 in the 3200-meter run, Norman Crawford won the low hurdles, Jeff Draeger took first in the discus, Bulger won the high jump and Williamson took first in the long jump.

St. Joe's highlights were first-place finishes by Mike Borer in the shot put and Craig Nieset in the 1600.

The girls meet at Ross was highlighted by Carrie Guyer's double victory in the hurdles races, the 1-2 finish by Ross's Kaylene Bartson and Kim Mathews in the 400-meter dash and the 1-2 effort by the Little Giants' Emilia Wise and Shari

Root in the discus. St. Joe's Dorothy Colon won the 1600-meter run and Ross's Amy Ritzman took first in front of Colon in the 3200.
