Holland's view

Ross softball taking shape

It was a beautiful spring day with temperatures in the mid 60's and a refreshing breeze blowing out of the west. The bright yellow sun shown and not a cloud was

in the clear blue sky.

Christy Holland was already on the practice field, measuring off the distances between bases and getting the field ready for practice. In a few minutes, the Ross girls softball team would be on the field, polishing their game for a 4:15 p.m. meeting with Findlay today at Rodger Young Park.

Holland loves softball and has been coaching girls teams for about 25 years, he says. When Ross started its program last year, he jumped at the chance to coach the squad.

In their first year, the Lady Little Giants went 7-6

and so far this season, they are even at 2-2. With a little better hitting and defense, Ross might be 4-0. "Our big weakness has been hitting," Holland said one day before practice. "We're not hitting the ball like we should. We've also had a problem with errors but we hope to get that corrected in the next few games."

Holland has eight returning letterwomen from last season's team but still fields a young squad. He has only two seniors on the team. The rest are sophomores

Many of the girls are new to fast pitch softball and are just starting to feel comfortable with the game. Holland says the team is probably a year away from peaking, but is looking forward to a good showing this

"We're still shifting people around and trying to find the right positions for the right persons," Holland explained. "That's part of the error problem. "Next year we should be a very fine team. Everyone will be settled into positions and at least two-thirds of

the team will have two years of playing. But I'm looking forward to a good year this year."

While Ross has been struggling in the field and with the bat so far this season, Holland says his pitching

has looked pretty good.

The slender coach has five girls who can pitch and

all have this season except for one.
"I have two pitchers who are sophomores. We look for some good pitching out of them," Holland said.

The sophomore pitchers Holland has are Janet

Dicker and Amy Woessner. Other pitchers are Diane Borys, Jody Frampton and Kim Kelly.
"Both hitting and pitching are of equal importance," Holland emphasizes. "If you can't hit the ball, you can't get any runs and you can't win ball

"On the other hand, bad pitching will lose you ball games.

games."

The starting lineup for today's game for Ross will look like this: Cindy Gilson will bat first and play second base; batting second and playing right field will be Rhea Paulson; Sue Yingling will bat third and play first base; in the cleanup spot is Diane Borys and she will play left field;

Kim Kelly will bat fifth and play shortstop; Lisa Pfeiffer is the catcher and will bat sixth; Lori

Kashmer will play third and bat seventh; Dawn Kashmer will bat eighth and play center field and Janet Dicker will bat last and pitch.

On Saturday, the Lady Little Giants will travel to Lorain and play a doubleheader with Admiral King

and Lorain Senior.

Both are in the eastern division of the Buckeye Conference as well as Ross. Elyria is the other member of the conference.

This is the first year of conference competition and the Buckeye was divided into two divisions to eliminate scheduling problems.
