Gruse Selects Swim Finalists

Eight Ross high swimmers will compete in the state finals at Ohio State University Friday and Saturday, Coach George Gruse announced today.

The Giants, district champions after a thrilling victory over Sandusky Monday, qualified 16 lads.

Ross does not figure to win the state title, but Gruse's young squad may finish high on the list. For the last two years, Ross has been runner-up. Cincinnati Walnut Hills won last season. The favorite, however, is powerful Canton McKinley, which has an undefeated record.

Youngsters making the trip will be Don Hirschberger, Dick Burkett, Neil Bork, Lonny Price, Gary Schwartz, Jack Rose, Louis Lorenzen and Bob Lucas.

Hirschberger and Burkett will compete in the 50-yard free-style, Bork in the breast-stroke, Price and Schwartz in the 100-yard back stroke, Rose and Lorenzen in the 100-yard free-style, and Lucas in individual medley swim.

The medley relay team will be composed of Price, Bork and Lucas. The free-style relayers are Burkett, Rose, Lorenzen and Hirschberger.

Ellen Karlovetz took the top prize in singles, while the combination of Luella Beier and Bernie Knapp won the doubles in the city women's bowling tournament Sunday at Maple Lanes.

Karlovetz rolled a torrid 579 in three games. A 60-pin handicap made her total 639, 55 pins ahead of Maxine Krellick.

Beier and Knapp teamed for a 1057 total, eight pins ahead of Bobby Mierke and Margaret Jones.

The all-events crown in the scratch division went to Karlovetz by a single pin over Knapp, the totals being 1410 to 1409. Mierke was tops in the handicap all-events, scoring a 1686. Karlovetz was second with 1671.

Lale Rectenwald was third in both the scratch and handicap divisions in the all-event rankings.

Karlovetz won a \$12 prize for her single championship, while the doubles winners received a total of \$20.

A total of \$220 was distributed in the doubles and \$180 in singles.

George Hirschberger, Ross sophomore free-styler, won the 50-yard race to become a state champion Saturday in Columbus, where the Giants finished fifth.

The state title went to Canton McKinley with 52 points. Cincinnati Walnut Hills was second with 30, Cleveland Heights was third with 25, Columbus Grandview was fourth with 21 and Ross had 20. Eighteen schools competed. Sandusky, Ross high's chief rival in the district meet, was far down the list with three points.

Hirschberger defeated Wallace of Columbus Bexley for the state crown. In Friday's preliminaries, Toledo Waite's Bill Dellen was the pace-setter.

Lonny Price, Ross backstroke, who also has another year of competition (there are no seniors on the Ross squad) placed second in his 100-yard race, with Ledger of Canton winning the championship.

Jack Rose, another Ross performer, was sixth in the 100-yard free-style in a race that saw five boys closely bunched behind Bexley's Wallace.

Relay Team 3rd

Ross high's medley relay team composed of Price, Neil Bork and Bob Lucas, was third, with the first two places going to Canton and Walnut Hills.

Had the Ross free-style relay team not been disqualified for a fast start, it is likely the Giants would have finished second. The event was won by Canton, with Grandview second, but Ross's, following through with the race, wound up second. Louie Lorenzen was detected hitting the water too soon.

A record set in 1939 by Ben Hayes, former Ross swim star, was tied by Bill Van Horn of Canton. Van Horn negotiated the 100-yard breast-stroke in 1:05.2, the same time as Hayes.

Another Ross record, in the medley relay, withstood the state finals. The record was set in 1941 by Clarence Kuntz, Ben Hayes and Dick Spaid.

The results pleased Coach George Gruse, who did not figure to be in the championship picture because of his inexperienced squad. In the 1950 and 1949 meets, Ross was second.

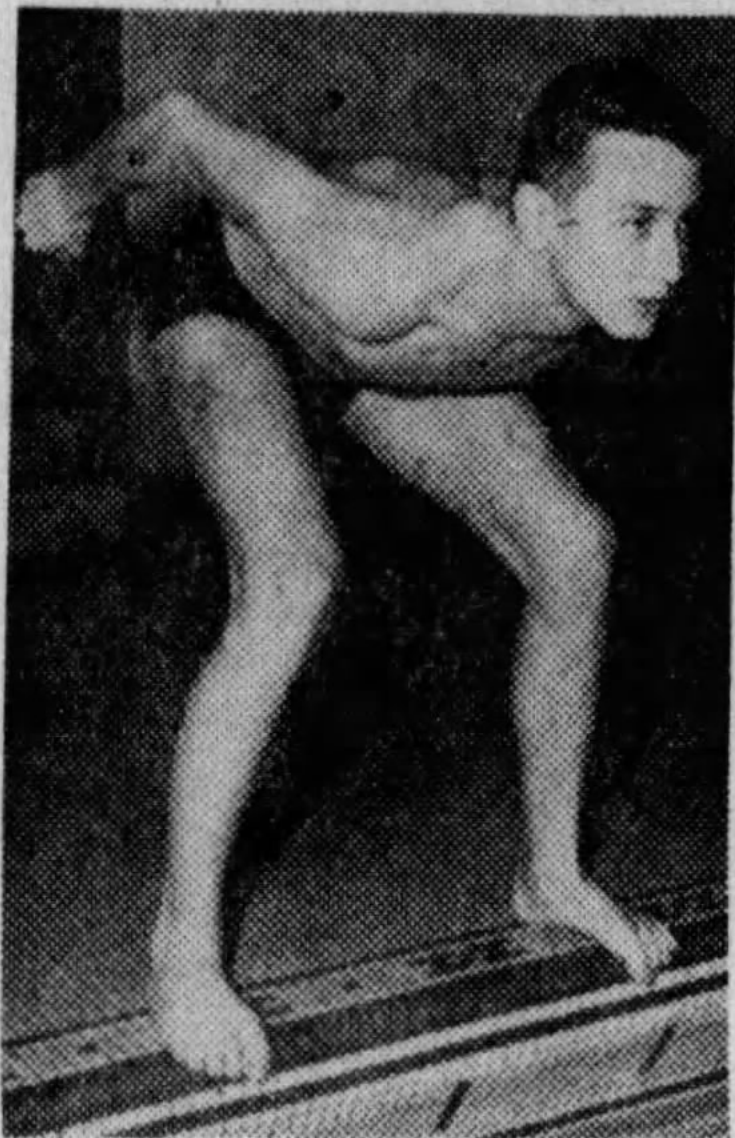
