Little Giants face outdoor test in tennis season debut at Tiffin

Fremont Ross will open the high school tennis season today at Tiffin against Columbian and by the time the last ball sails over the net, the Little Giants will probably have been outside longer then they had during two weeks of practice.

"We have had approximately

"We have had approximately one hour and 33 minutes outside," Michaels said. "That was last Monday at Rodger Young Park. I got as cold as I have ever been. "There were only thus and the

"There were only two nets up and it was rather difficult having practice with 17 kids," he explained. "This has been the most difficult year in my 25 years of coaching that we have had when it comes to getting outside practice time."

The Ross coach tried to console himself by adding, "I am assuming that this cold weather has affected every team around here."

Five lettermen return for Michaels including the top two singles players, seniors Chris Shirvis and Jon Ickes. Both are expected to be at those positions with Shirvis in the first court and Ickes playing in the second singles spot.

The other lettermen, senior Kurt Swartzlander and juniors Brian Dierksheide and Rodney Smith, lettered while playing doubles. Swartzlander and Dierksheide played the first court doubles for Ross in 1983.

Michaels pointed out that the lineup against Columbian will be one that he selects from the few minutes of drills outside and the hours spent inside. There have been no challenge matches. "I will be putting them where I think they can play," the Ross coach pointed out.

Michaels is looking at exchange student Andres Vernengo, a junior, in the number three singles. Vernengo is from Argentina and has shown good playing ability according to Michaels.

Swartlander and Dierksheide are expected to get the early call in the first doubles but the Ross coach expects that twosome to be pressed to keep that spot when warm weather allows for a flexible practice schedule.

The second doubles team will come from a pair of freshmen or a sophomore. John Battles is the sophomore and Tom Myers and Ramon Eichert are the ninth graders.

Also on the squad, and, as

Michaels said, in the running for starting slots once challenge matches can be played are juniors Ryan Brant, Doug Peterson, Curt Inks and Troy Laird, sophomores Brian Casselman, Tom Herlihy and Tom Denman and freshman Tom Bowlus.

"We have some experience — probably the most that we have had in quite awhile," Michaels smiled, "but we are under continual construction at this point.

"I also feel this is the youngest team in some time with possibly a couple of freshmen and a sophomore capable of breaking into the starting lineup."

After the match against Columbian today, Ross will be at Sandusky Perkins Thursday.

Meanwhile, their lone win came in first singles where Chris Shirvis rolled past Brad Trask 6-2,


