

Five Little Giants advance

MANSFIELD — Fremont Ross will send five wrestlers into the Class AAA District Wrestling Tournament next Friday and Saturday at Toledo Rogers High School after sectional tournament action

Saturday.

Andre Parks, Tim Donnersbach, and Troy Amor were individual champions in the sectional at Mansfield Senior High School. Gilbert Palacios with a third place and Paul Adams with a fourth also

gained entry into the district tourney for Ross.

Another pair of Little Giants, Mark Walter and Doug Smith, finished sixth in the sectional but did not qualify for a district berth.

"I'm pretty satisfied with them," Ross Coach Al

Voggenthaler said about the Little Giants' district qualifiers and fourth place finish in the sectional tourney.

Host Mansfield Senior took the top spot in the sectional test with 139½ points. Galion and Mansfield tied for second with 120, just one-half of a point ahead of Ross.

"We went down there wanting to place in the top five," Voggenthaler said about his team's goal in the first step toward the state tournament two weeks from now. "We just missed second by one-half of a point, so I can't be too disappointed."

Parks, a junior, upped his record to 22-3 by winning the 141-pound championship. He stopped Jeff McQuillen 6-1 in the finals.

Donnersbach handed

Dominick Marocco, Marion Harding, his first loss of the season, by pinning the President in 3:46 of the finals. Donnersbach is now 21-4 while Marocco slipped to 24-1.

Three of Donnersbach's victories in the tourney were by falls.

Amor, Ross's heavyweight, "pinned" his way to the sectional crown. His final match, his fourth pin in two days, took 3:37 against Ashland's Dave Crecelius.

Palacios was third at 108 while Adams took fourth in the 188-pound division. Walther was sixth at 135 and Smith finished in that spot in the 158-pound division.

Sandusky finished fifth behind Ross with Vermillion and Port Clinton rounding out the top seven teams.
