Ross Moves In Baseball Tournament

Alex Hyzer went the distance for Ross and his batterymate John Prosser drove in two runs with a home run as the Little Giants defeated Clyde 6-2 at Anderson field Friday afternoon in the first round of the Class "AA" baseball sectional tourney.

Dick Holmes of Willard hurled a no-hit, no - run game against Perkins in another tourney game played at Ross high diamond. Willard won 6-0 and moves into the semi-finals against the Little Giants Wednesday at Anderson field.

Clyde scored a run in the first on two singles and a walk. Ross came back in the second to tally a pair on two singles, a double and triple. After Clyde tied the score in the second, Ross went ahead with a solo tally in the fifth and then iced it in the seventh with three runs, two coming on Prosser's home run over the center-field fence.

There was considerable discussion as to whether the ball had carried over on a fly or bounced over. The umpires ruled a home run.
