165 Wrestlers Vie In District Meet

TOLEDO — One hundred and sixty-five wrestlers, survivors of five sectional tournaments, will open action Friday to qualify 44 for the state wrestling championships in Columbus. Among those bidding for state tournament berths will be 33 from the Fremont sectionals, including nine from Fremont.

The district tournament will be held Friday and Saturday at the Toledo Rogers high school gymnasium. Action will open Friday at 5 p.m. and will resume with afternoon and evening sessions Saturday.

Three mats will be in use as tournament manager Vince Contrada tries to run off 122 matches Friday, 66 Saturday

afternoon and 22 the final night.

At the conclusion two men will emerge from the championship bracket and two from the second-chance consolation bracket in each weight class.

One defending state champion is in the tournament and Clyde freshman wrestler Jim Smith had the misfortune to draw him in the first round. The defending state champ is Toledo St. Francis' Tom Greenwood. Greenwood advanced to the district tournament by winning the upper bracket in the Toledo Bowsher sectional.

Another Clyde wrestler, Glenn Bentrim, drew a defending regional champion, Jim Scheaffer, Perrysburg, in the 154-pound class. Strength of the 154-pound class, in which Tom LeSavage of St. Joseph and George Branco of Ross will compete, is evidenced by Scheaffer's plight. Although a defending regional champion and unbeaten during the regular season the Perrysburg matmen had to fight back in the consolation round at Rogers sectional to qualify for district wrestling.

Eyes will be on the wrestlers of Toledo St. Francis, defending state championship team. In addition to Clyde's Smith, Jim Waggoner of Ross drew a St. Francis wrestler, Tom Sargent, in the first round of 138-pound class.

Other Ross wrestlers in the district action will be Gary LeMaitre, 112; Herm Kanan, 145, and George Branco, 154.

St. Joseph wrestlers in action are Jim Lenhart, 120; Gary Gloer, 133; Tom LeSavage, 154; Dennis Tischler, 165, and Ron Gibson, 175.

Dartmouth 33-Game Losing Skein Halted

The St. Joseph's Hawks won their 15th straight, the Connecticut Huskies won their 14th straight and the Princeton Tigers won their 10th in a row.

Nevertheless, the Hawks, the Huskies and the Tigers yielded the college basketball spotlight today to the down-trodden Dartmouth Indians.

Beaten in 33 straight Ivy League games, the longest losing streak in the history of the league, the Indians smote Brown 84-70 on their home court at Hanover, N.H.

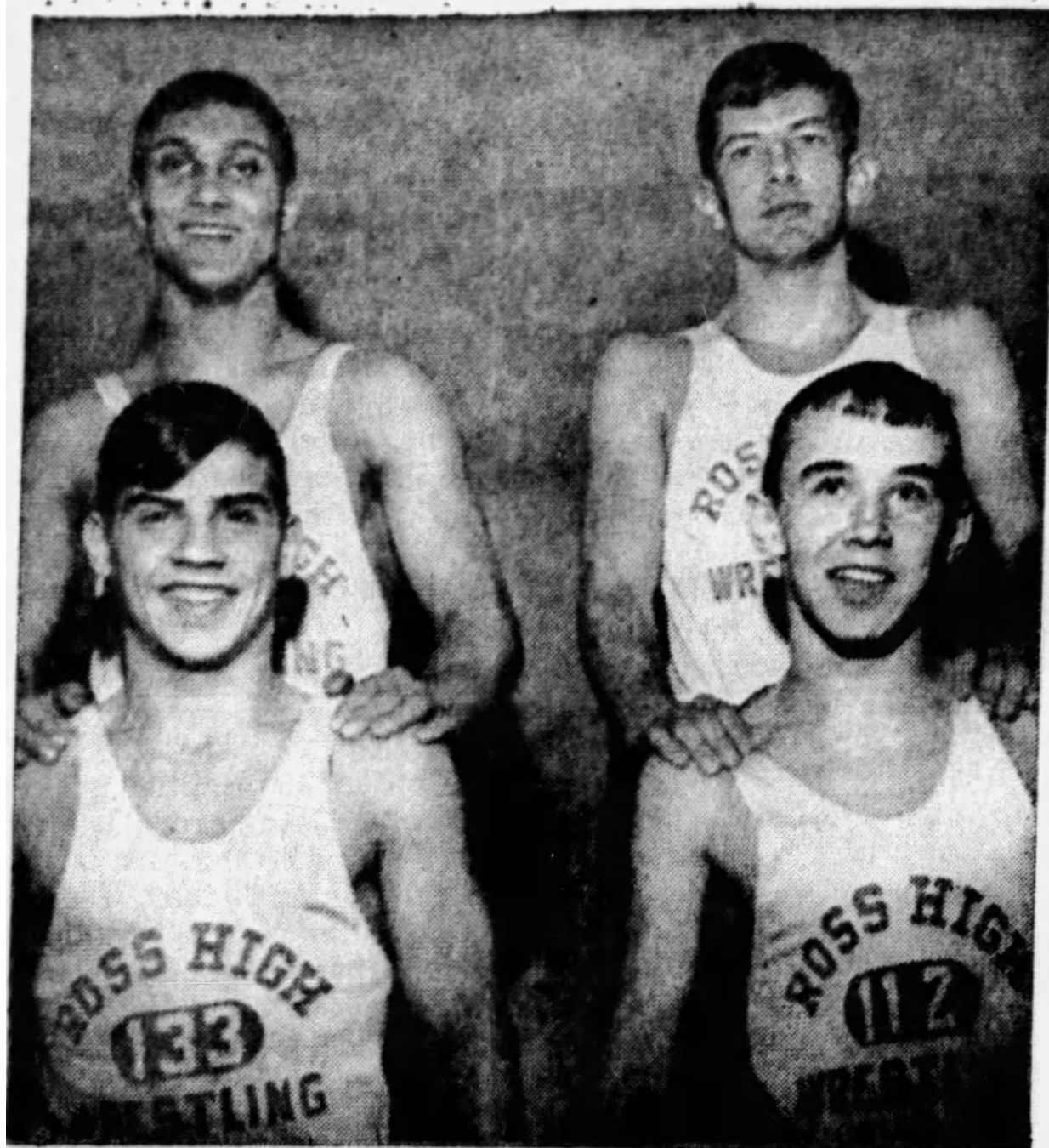

Ninth-ranked Villanova, the only other team in The AP Top Ten to play Wednesday night, trampled Seton Hall 84-63 at South Orange, N.J. Bill Melchionni, with 22, and Jim Washington with 16 combined for 38 points as the Wildcats, NIT-bound, boosted their record to 20-4.
