The Swimming Season . . .

Ross' Little Giant tankers opened the 1955-56 swim season with losses to Toledo Y 50-27, and to Sandusky 42-35.

Victory to Marion on 52-29 came to the tankers in the Marion Y pool, January 14. Al Hetrick, Tom Hite, Jack Balsizer, and Bob Agee set a new Marion pool record for the 200 yd. free style relay race.

Next came Western Reserve Academy. Their swimmers captured a 52-25 meet in the Cleveland pool, January 21.

In a return meet, the Sandusky Blue Streaks took a 49-28 meet in the Blue Streak pool January 25. Bob Agee, Tom Hite, and Tom Dorniger polled firsts for Ross, but it wasn't enough to win the meet.

Upper Arlington captured the first triangular meet ever held in the Ross pool with 48 points January 28. Ross placed second with 39 points while Grandview came in last with 15 total points.

Bill Myers placed first in exhibition diving as Ross finished sixth in the annual Bowling Green relays February 4.


Win number two of the season was rolled up as the Ross tankers defeated the Marion Y swimmers 52-25 February 9 in our pool.



Sandusky Defeats Ross Swim Team

Repeat Earlier Win Over Local Tankers

Going out against Sandusky high's swim team in a return match this season, Ross high's mermen lost a 49-28 decision Wednesday night in the Blue Streaks' pool. It was the second win that Sandusky picked off against Coach George Gruse's team, marking the fourth loss in five starts for the Purple and White.

Once again, as in the first meeting here, Ross' Tom Hite, Bob Agee, and Billy Myers, emerged with first place wins, but a Ross loss in the 240 yard medley race gave Sandusky a sharper edge this trip than in the initial session.

Hite took the first place banner in the 200 yard free style with a time of 2:14 minutes; Agee's :58.5 time copped first in the 100 yard free style; and Myers registered 122.7 points in the diving competition for first.

Competing in the 200 yard relay race, Sandusky took the first place nod, but Ross turned up with a tremendous effort, making it a very close race. Gruse said. Ron Shawl, John Baxter, Jack Balsizer and Agee figured in this one for the Ross swimmers.

On Saturday afternoon Ross goes out in a triangular meeting, the first in the Fremont high pool, when Grandview and Upper Arlington high schools arrive for a meet to begin at 2:30 p. m.
